Upon her release from prison, she will be supervised by U.S. Probation for three years.

In her plea agreement, she admitted that between October 2014 and April 2016 she falsified prior authorizations, medical lab reports, and drug test results for at least 51 Hepatitis C patients





Former Lauderdale County School Employees Indicted for Theft

A special report from the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that two former employees of the Lauderdale County Department of Education continued to receive compensation after their employment with the school system had ended.

Educational assistant Devlyn Green terminated her employment with Lauderdale County in May 2014; however, auditors determined she continued to receive direct deposits to her personal bank account until December 19, 2016. This resulted in Green receiving salary overpayments of \$33,510.95.

The School Department also paid the employer portion of Green's Social Security and Medicare totaling \$2,563.59 and contributed \$1,769.78 to the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System on Green's behalf.

Bus Driver Milton Waller terminated his employment with Lauderdale County in October 2016; however, he continued to receive direct deposits totaling \$4,459.18 through February 16, 2017. The School Department also paid the employer portion of Waller's Social Security and Medicare totaling \$341.14.

The director schools first disclosed this activity to Comptroller's Office in February 2017 and has stated his intention to

In June 2017, Devlyn Green was indicted by the Lauderdale County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$10,000. Milton Waller was indicted for one count of theft over \$2,500.


