highly organized operation. Throughout the scam, Qasmani opened numerous bank accounts to avoid detection and shuffled the illicit earnings to more than 650 transferees spanning 10 different countries.

For four years, Qasmani continued to pay the hackers and dialers for their work while laundering money even after Aziz was arrested in connection with the scheme and later released by foreign authorities.

A major telecommunications provider discovered the fraudulent activity and reported it to the FBI. The ensuing investigation into the conspiracy hit a major turning point when the Bureau received information that Qasmani would be visiting the United States from Bangkok. Agents arrested him shortly after he arrived at Los Angeles International Airport on December 22, 2014.

Qasmani was sentenced on June 28, 2017 after being found guilty of conspiracy to commit wire fraud. He is now serving a 48-month prison term for his involvement in the scheme.

"Telecommunications fraud not only has a severe impact on victim companies but the industry as a whole," said Cocklin. "While the FBI continues to track down the criminals responsible for this type of crime,




