



burg, Tennessee, who was also convicted of participating in a money laundering conspiracy, will serve 235 months. Larry Wayne Martin, 54, of Russellville, Tennessee, and Jeremy Kane Jones, 31, of Morristown, Tennessee, will serve 120 and 110 months respectively.

Lengthy Prison Term for Estate Planner Who Betrayed Clients

Julie Kronhaus was a well-regarded estate planner with impressive training and credentials. She was a licensed attorney, a certified public accountant, and had earned a master's degree in taxation. Unfortunately, she was also home-schooled in fraud.

Between 2009 and 2015, according to



court records, Kronhaus defrauded clients and banks out of approximately \$2.7 million. The Florida resident often acted as a trustee for her clients and held their money in bank accounts she controlled. With that access, she diverted money into her law firm's bank accounts







According to the plea agreements on file with the U.S. District Court, the combined total amount of actual methamphetamine attributed to Munsey-Killian, Martin and Jones was between 235 to 700 grams.

Law enforcement agencies participating in the investigation included the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Hamblen County Sheriff's Office, Morristown, Tennessee Police Department and the Third and Fourth District Judicial Drug Task Forces. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Wayne Taylor and David Gunn represented the United States.

This case was a result of the Department of Justice's

Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF) program, the centerpiece of the Department of Justice's drug supply reduction strategy. OCDE-TF was established in 1982 to conduct comprehensive, multi-level attacks on major drug trafficking and money laundering organizations. Today, OCDETF combines the resources and expertise of its member federal agencies in cooperation with state and local law enforcement. The principal mission of the OCDETF program is to identify, disrupt, and dismantle the most serious drug trafficking and money laundering organizations and those primarily responsible for the nation's drug supply.

county are also accepted with proof of their homeschooling.


