Mr. Caudill if there was any "dope" inside the vehicle, he hesitated and then stated he had "Ice" (Meth) in the center console. Upon search Officer did locate a clear baggy containing a white powdery substance weighing approximately 0.09GM believed to be Meth inside the center console in reach of both subjects. Behind the backseat Officer located a white plastic container holding three bags of green leafy substance believed to be marijuana weighing approximately 2.8 GM. Mr. Caudill stated the green leafy substance was his but the Meth was not his. When asked Mrs. Mcburnette stated the Meth was not hers and she did not know it was there. Upon check Mrs. Mcburnette returned with two VOP warrants out of Blount County

(case CR-15048-CT-4 and CR-15048). Officer placed both subjects in custody at that time. Officer is charging Mr. Caudill with poss sch. 2, poss sch. 6, and possession drug para. Officer is charging Mrs. Mcburnette with poss sch. 2 and poss para.

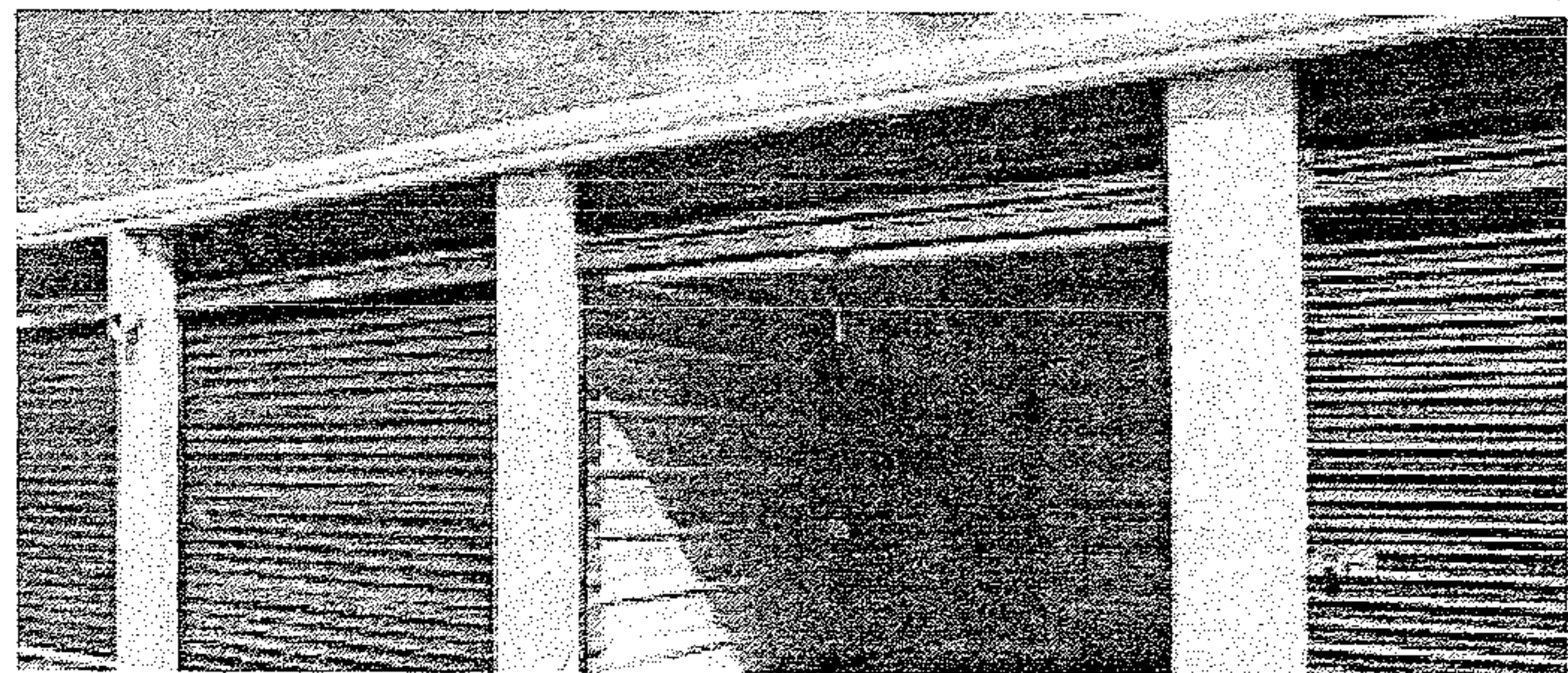

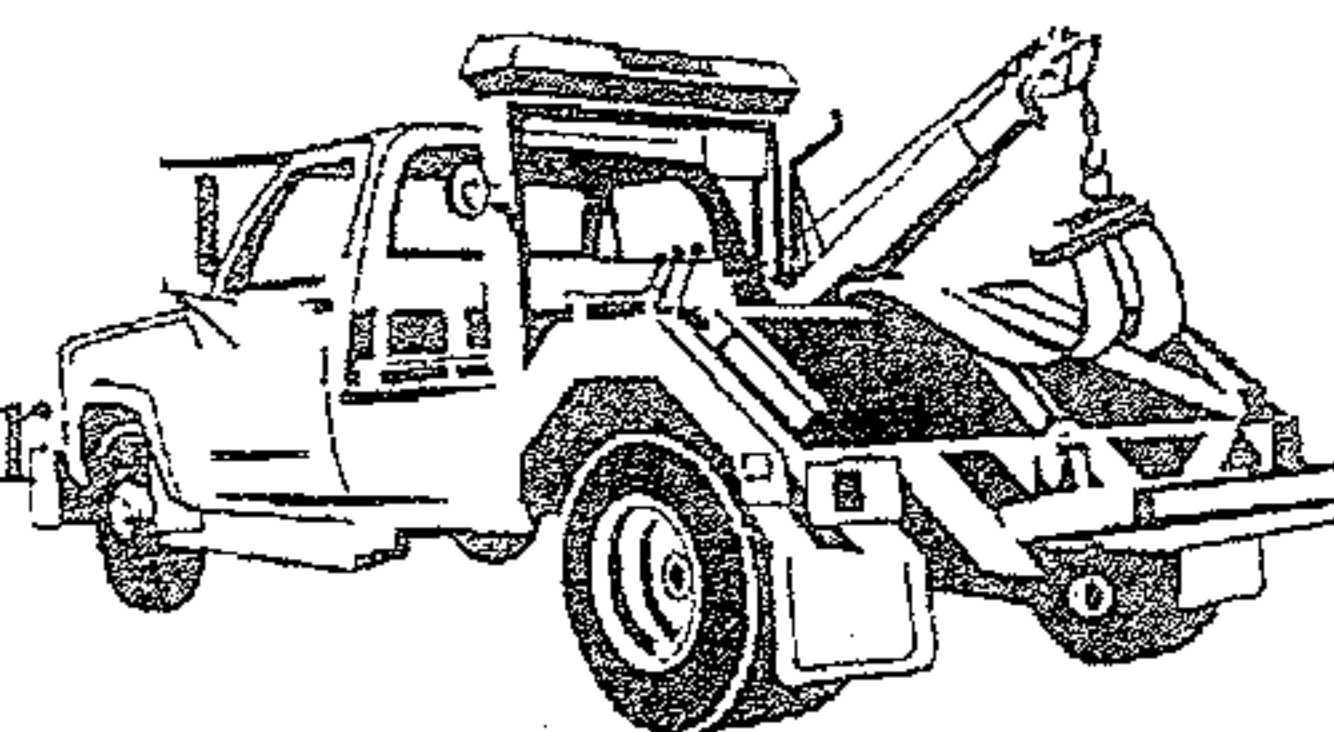

Honor Air

American Legion Post 256 member Jim Warner shared his experiences on Honor Air Knoxville Flight No. 23, which took place on April 5th, 2017. Jim praised Eddie Mannis, founder of Honor Air Knoxville, for his selfless dedication to Veterans. Eddie and his Prestige Cleaners, the primary sponsors of Honor Air Knoxville, insure that World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War Veterans are able to visit the War Memorials in Washington, DC, that were built in their honor. Jim described the history of Honor Air Knoxville, starting when Eddie Mannis served as an Escort on a flight from North Carolina, and Eddie was so moved, that he was driven to start the program in Knoxville, starting with the first flight in 2007.

"We had 134 Veterans, about 20 Volunteers, and 20 or so Escorts. Most Veterans were from the Vietnam War, but there were 20 WWII Vets, 20 Korean War Vets, and 4 "Calutron Girls" that worked at Oak Ridge. There was also one engineer from Oak Ridge, Hugh Barnett, who, at 100, is the oldest ever Honor Air Knoxville participant." Jim shared his collection of photos via PowerPoint program of the flight. He described the departure from McGhee Tyson which included a "Welcome Aboard" message from Eddie Mannis, one from Mayor Tim Burchett, and from Mayor

Madeline Rogero. They also personally greeted each Veteran as they boarded the plane.

The flight was met by a huge welcome in Washington, DC. Their 4 buses had a police escort throughout the day, which made traveling to the memorials a seamless experience. They visited the Air Force Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans, Korean, and Lincoln Memorials, the World War II Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, Changing of the Guards at the Tomb of the Unknowns, and the Marine Memorial.

The Veterans received an incredible Welcome Home upon arrival at McGhee Tyson, consisting of about 2,000 people from the surrounding area, a high school band, AFJROTC cadets, families, and lots of children. It was especially heartwarming for the Vietnam Vets to receive the Welcome Home they never got; It was a far cry from their reception upon their initial return from Vietnam. Also impressive was the number of children and young people that greeted the Vets.

In Jim's words, "This was absolutely the best organized trip I've ever taken. Everything went like clockwork. The logistics were perfect. We were treated like royalty, and it seemed like the support team couldn't do enough for us. Eddie Mannis is the driving force that has made Honor Air Knoxville an incredibly successful program, and he is a true hero! His adapted motto "No one

left behind" has insured that the program will continue, maybe indefinitely."

DUI

Ann Flores, 38, Jim Hartsook Drive Lenoir City, was charged with DUI.

Officer Green LCPD, observed a Green Honda Civic traveling North on Hwy 321. Officer observed this same vehicle make a left hand turn into Tellico Plaza and make another left turn striking a curb and continued driving the vehicle over the curb. Officer awaited the vehicle to travel back onto Hwy 321 and initiated a traffic stop. Officer made contact with the driver, Ann D. Flores, and immediately smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage consistent with beer. As Officer spoke with the Driver he observed she had bloodshot, watery eyes and slurred speech. Officer asked Ms. Flores

if she had consumed any alcoholic beverages prior to operating the vehicle in which she stated she consumed two drinks. Officer requested Ms. Flores to exit the vehicle to perform Standard Field Sobriety Testing in which she agreed and performed poorly. Officer took Ms. Flores into custody and transported

her to Loudon County Jail where Ms. Flores consented to a breath sample for chemical testing. After observing Ms. Flores for the 20 minute observation period I requested her to give two samples of breath. Both of the tests showed Ms. Flores blood alcohol content to be .132. All of the above occurred in Loudon County.

Since 1886, the people of Knox County have had access to an impressive collection of library resources. As the oldest continuously operating public library in the state of Tennessee, we have a proud heritage.



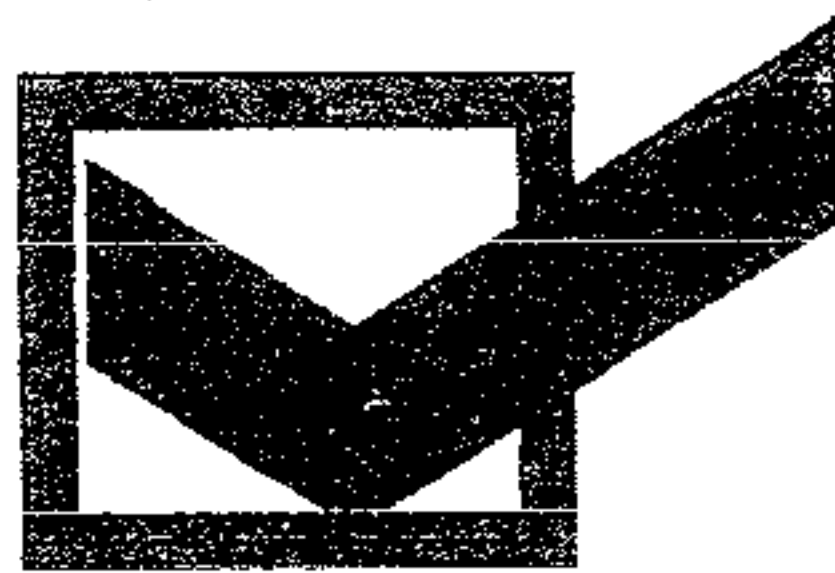
