In her plea agreement on file with the U.S. District Court, Sue Ann Salazar agreed that she distributed between 1.5 and 4.5 kilograms of actual methamphetamine and that she had a prior felony conviction and she possessed a firearm.

Federal law provides enhanced penalties for drug dealers who have prior felony drug convictions, and Sue Ann Salazar faces a 20-year mandatory minimum sentence.

The plea agreement provided that between January of 2016 and October of 2017, Sue Ann Salazar obtained multiple ounces of methamphetamine which she distributed to various individuals, including her co-defendants listed above. In May 2017, she gave consent to search her residence, during which law enforcement agents located four ounces of methamphetamine and multiple firearms. She confessed to distributing approximately four kilograms of methamphetamine during the conspiracy. Co-defendants Billy R. Buchanan, Sr., Jesse W. Harris, Meliah D. Slone, Brittany N. Talley, Jennifer R. Livesay, Tabitha C. Taylor, and Megan H. Hash have also filed plea agreements with the U.S. District Court. Trial for the remaining co-defendants is set for August 21, 2018.

Law enforcement agencies participating in this joint investigation include the Hamblen County Sheriff's Office, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, Fourth Judicial District Drug Task Force, Third Judicial Drug Task Force, Morristown Police Department, White Pine Police Department, Jefferson City Police Department, Tennessee National Guard Counter Drug Task Force, Tennes-

see Highway Patrol, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, and Federal Bureau of Investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorney Caryn L. Hebets represents the United States.

Thomas Robinson, 57, Wilson Road Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Court Capias.

Deputy White LCSO, transported Thomas Robinson from Criminal Court on an active warrant 17-cr-248 (FTA hunting/trapping without permission). Deputy West did serve Robinson with warrant 17-cr-248 at the Loudon County Jail.

Investigation Finds Problems Within Henderson County Assessor's Office

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has identified altered records and a cash shortage within the Henderson County Assessor of Property's Office.

On November 11, 2015, the assessor's daughter, who is also a field appraiser in the

office, intentionally altered 105 property records by removing a Code 8 indicator. This indicator is added to property records of new home construction, additions, pools, barns, etc. When a Code 8 is in place, a field appraiser is required to physically observe the property. This often results in increases to the coun-

ty's overall appraised values.

After the Code 8s were removed, the Comptroller's Division of Property Assessments performed an evaluation of the office. As a result, appraised values increased by \$10,473,900, including \$2,489,300 in increased appraised val-

Todd Enright, 52, Malone Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Charles Huskin LCSO, was dispatched to a domestic on Malone Rd. When Deputy arrived on scene he made contact with Mr. Todd Enright and victim who states that Mr. Enright held her against her will by blocking the back door keeping her in the house not letting her leave and again by locking her in the master bedroom and not letting her leave. Victim did have a wound to her lower lip that occurred when Mr. Enright blocked the door she states that she did bite him and when he removed his hand from the door she did get hit in the mouth, but stated she was not assaulted. Victim states from her statement the couple have been arguing since Christmas day over her not giving him sex

or anything else beneficial to him in the relationship, and she tried to leave this date from the residence with their dog and would not let her. Mr. Enright states he just tried to get her to not take the dog. Mr. Enright was advised that he was under arrest for domestic assault and escorted to the Loudon County Jail. ues for those properties with the removed Code 8s.

The assessor's daughter admitted to altering the records to make it appear that she had performed work on these properties. The property assessor also admitted that he was aware that his daughter had intentionally altered the records.

Investigators also determined a field appraiser was paid at least \$1,987.79 for 22 days when the employee was absent from work. The property asses-

sor falsified 16 timesheets by approving time that the field appraiser did not work.

During the course of the investigation, the Comptroller's Office also learned the assessor allowed his office employees to be absent from work one day each week with pay. This employee benefit was called a "free-day." The assessor approved payroll records that indicated employees worked the days they were absent. The assessor does not have the au-

thority to alter records and pay employees who did not work or use leave.

"I'm hopeful that Henderson County will be able to recover the \$1,987 that was improperly paid to the assessor's employee," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "A system of good government must have accurate time reporting at its core."


