



Officers, Thursday agents, deputies and prosecutors with the Rockwood Police Department, the 9th District Drug Task Force, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (Drug Enforcement Division), the National Guard Drug Task Force, the US

Postal Service, the Roane County Sheriff's Office and the 9th District Attorney General's Office met at a briefing at the DA's office at 6:00 am before heading out at 6:20 am to round up thirty-four (34) individuals that were indicted on Monday by the Roane County Grand

Jury on drug offenses involving opioids and other pills, methamphetamine and heroin, including some heroin laced with fentanyl. While the grand jury indicted over seventy cases

overall, a large number of these were those drug cases brought by Chief Bill Stinnett's Rockwood Police Department in a year-long operation
