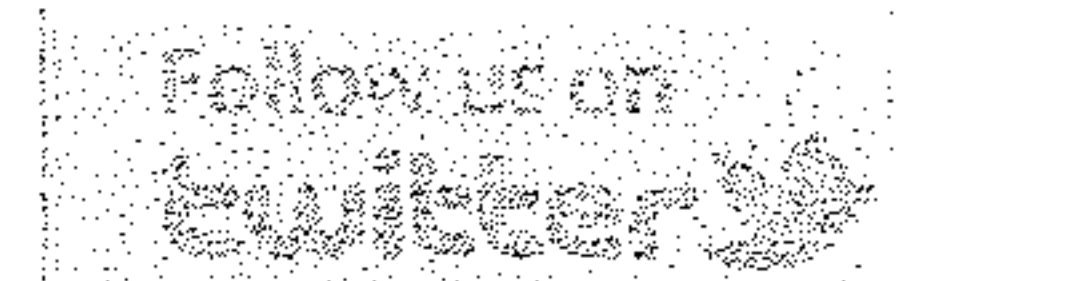

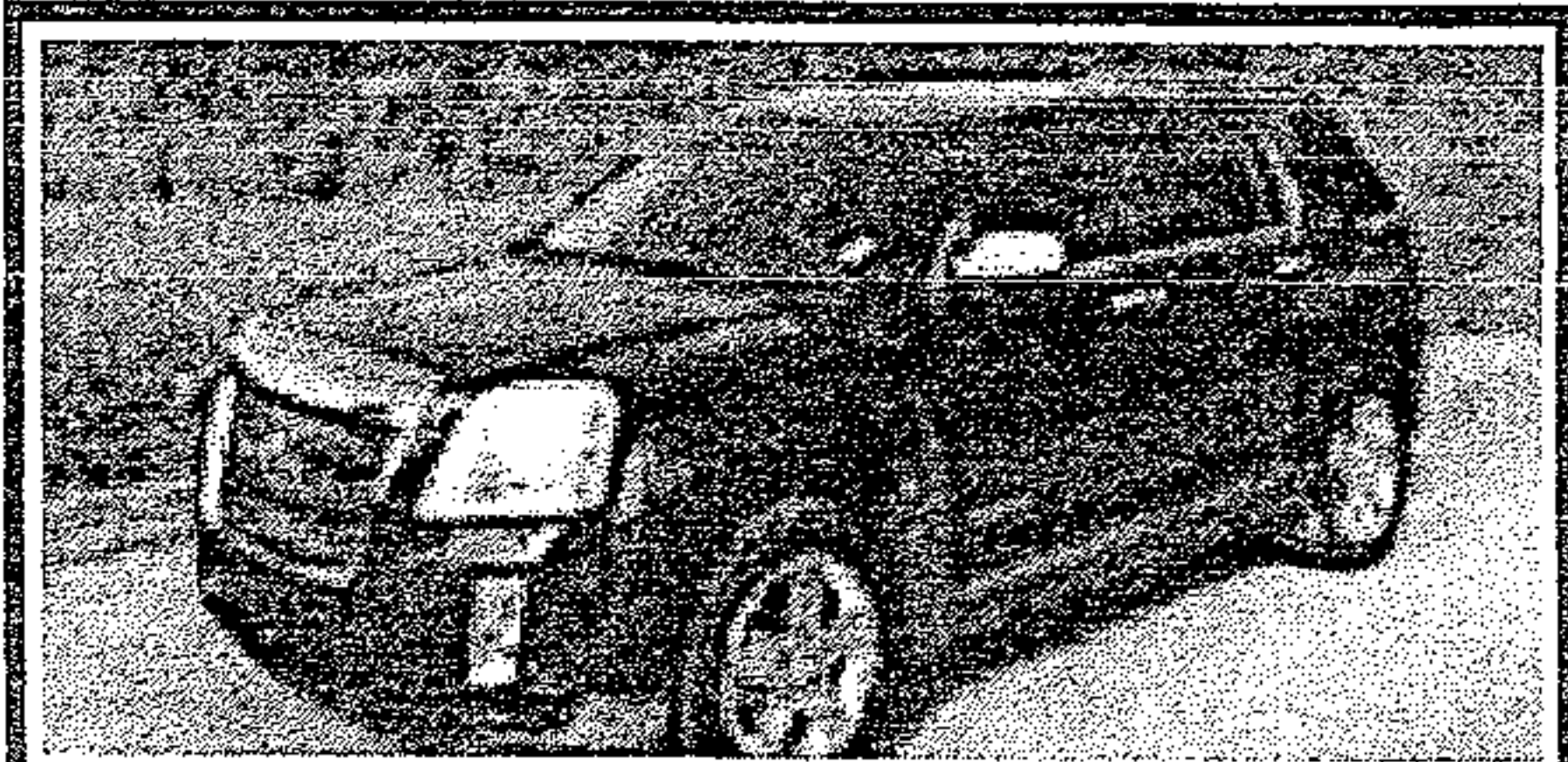

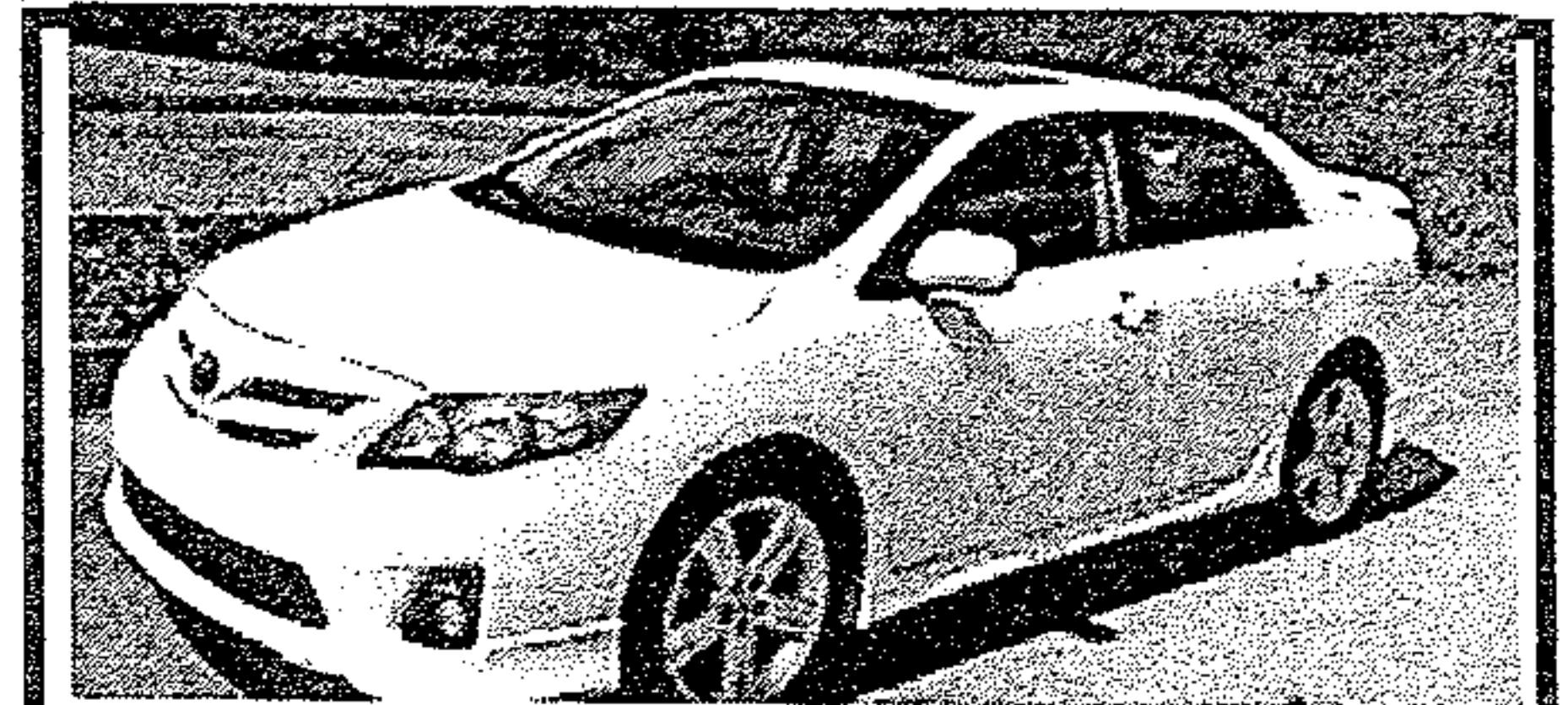

## DUI

Jason Mills, 37, Hwy 11 West Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault. Deputy Spradlin LCSO, along with Cpl. Hutchins were dispatched to Hwy 11 in reference to a domestic disturbance. The victim stated that a male subject that lives at this address with him pulled a knife out on him during the argument. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with the offender Jason Mills who was sitting in his vehicle. Deputy ask Mills what had happened he stated he did not know. Mills also had an odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. Deputy patted down Mills and located a knife in his right pocket. Through an investigation and witness video of the argument, it was learned that Mills

did have an open knife while arguing with victim. The victim was in fear of serious bodily injury due to Mills displaying a knife. Mills was placed under arrest.

## Elderly

On October 16, 2018, a federal grand jury in Knoxville returned a six-count indictment against Christina Erin Myers, 36, of Lenoir City, Tennessee, charging her with wire fraud and money laundering. Myers appeared before U.S. Magistrate Judge Deborah Poplin in U.S. District Court on October 18, 2018, and pleaded not guilty to the charges included in the indictment.

Myers trial is set for December 18, 2018, in U.S. District Court. If convicted, she faces 20

years in prison.

The indictment alleges that from May 2014 through July 2018, Myers engaged in a scheme to defraud elderly individuals under the guise of selling them residential properties at Williams Ferry Pointe (WFP), which is a senior living community in Lenoir City, Tennessee. WFP is operated by Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes (TBAH), a provider of residential care for senior adults and adults with exceptional needs. She allegedly implemented her scheme by diverting funds that were for the purchase of the real estate to her own personal use and marketing non-existent senior community housing. The indictment further

alleges that Myers promoted and sold fictitious investment opportunities and diverted those funds to her own personal use instead of investing them for the victims. In total, Myers fraudulently obtained approximately \$518,000. Additional details of her scheme are outlined in the indictment, which is on file with the U.S. District Court and available to the public.

Agencies whose investigation led to indictment of Myers include the Internal Revenue Service - Criminal Investigation and the Lenoir City Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney Frank Dale will represent the United States in court proceedings. Members of the


public are reminded that an indictment constitutes only charges and that every person is presumed innocent until his or her guilt has been proven beyond a reasonable doubt.

Officer ran both Ashley and the passenger Mary Miller through dispatch in which Mary came back with warrants out of McMinn County and Meigs County. Mary admitted to having meth on her person so a search of the vehicle was also conducted where 2 meth pipes and 1 marijuana pipe was recovered with a small amount of marijuana. 11 boxes of tile was also recovered that had been taken from the apartment estimated to be over a \$1000.00. Both Mary and Ashley was taken
