Parks

Tennessee State Parks has been named one of only two state park systems in the country to receive accreditation through the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA). The announcement was made official at the Na-

tional Recreation and Park Association's annual conference in Indianapolis this week.

"Achieving this independent accreditation means Tennessee State Parks meets national standards of best practice," said Brock Hill, deputy commissioner of the Tennessee

Department of Environment and Conservation. "It also acknowledges that visitors can expect the best in terms of recreation, programming and amenities when they visit any one of our 56 state parks."


CAPRA accreditation assures park visitors, policy makers, department staff and taxpayers that a parks system has the operational capacity to deliver high-quality programs, services and facilities. There are just over 160 accredited park and recre- tal sustainability policy ation agencies in the Unit- that includes protections ed States. Only one other parks system in Tennessee has received accreditation - the City of Germantown in Shelby County.

"To receive this accredi-

tation is truly an honor." said Anne Marshall, senior advisor to Deputy Commissioner Hill. "It reflects the commitment and dedication of our parks' staff and the benefits available to visitors. We hope this accomplishment will set the bar for other state parks systems and encourage them to seek accreditation as well."

Scoring is based on the adoption of efficient and effective processes, such as having an environmenfor natural resources; soliciting employee and visitor feedback on park management plans; proper utiliza-

Charity

Charity scams are sadly common; after high-profile disasters, there are often reports of fraudulent charities seeking to take advantage of those who want to help. The National Center for Disaster Fraud received more than 400 complaints of fraud after Hurricanes Harvey and Irma last year. the recent And in wake of Hurricanes Florence and Michael, donors should remain vigilant about this type of fraud.

Yet Georgia fraud-

ster Kai Brockington took a different—and rather lucrative approach to charity fraud. Rather than stealing from individual givers, he convinced (or paid) people to lie to their employers about donating to his charity matching funds provided by their companies.

"He created a real charity on paper, but it never actually did anything other than line his own pockets," said Special Agent Brockington re-James Harter of the FBI's Atlanta Division, who worked this case alongside investigators from the his family. Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Postal Service.

Brockington set up a charity known as Our Genesis Project shoes, and jewelry. them—in two cases, that claimed to create He took his family to employees claimed community medical clinics and other facilities to serve those in need. He registeredthe organization as a charity with both the state of Georgia and the Internal Revenue Service.

He then tricked his

own employer into matching his donation and also got several friends and associates to provide fake documentation their own employers stating that they had donated thousands of dollars. 


Harter noticed that the charity's website was constantly under construction, and there was no other evidence of anything charitable occurring. When interviewed, Brockington admitted his scheme. He pleaded guilty in May to tax fraud and mail fraud and was sentenced in August to 41 months in federal prison.

for him last night at an unknown time which he injected intravenously. Mr. Curtis stated he did not know what it was. He also stated that he felt like he was "coming down" whatever the substance was. Mr. Curtis refused to do any field sobriety tests as well as refused to give blood. Mr. Curtis began to complain of dizziness and back pain. Priory ambulance did transport Mr. Curtis to the Fort Loudoun Emergency Room where he remained for testing. Fort Loudoun will contact us when Mr. Curtis is to be released. Given that companies have limited budgets to provide to their charity-matching said this case was important to pursue.

"It's definitely rewarding to stop someone who was not just stealing from a big company, but stealing money the company would have given to a legitimate charity," Harter

said. "That makes served populations. . it a very rewarding arrest and conviction."
