

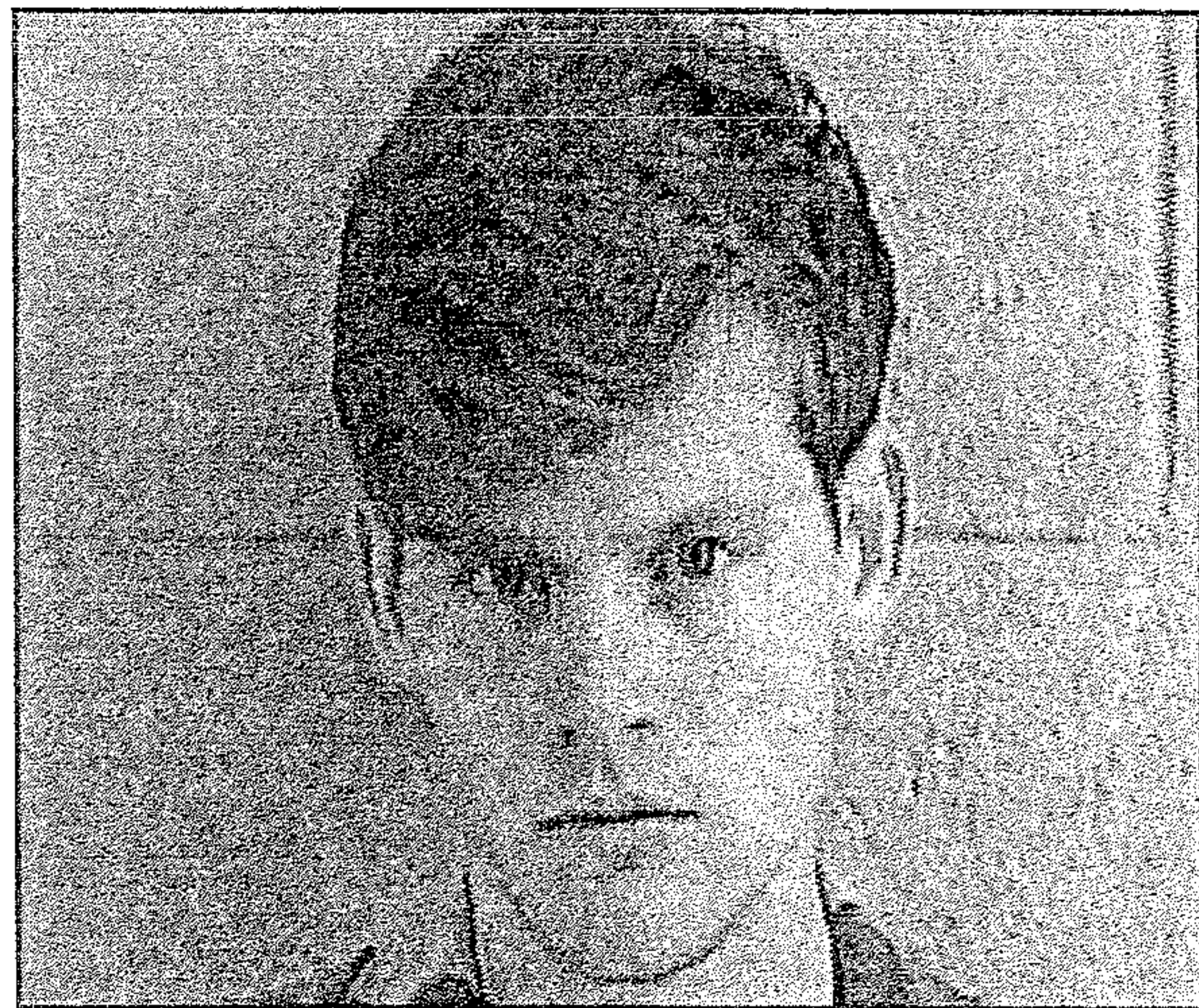

of more than \$2 million, announced U.S. Attorney Don Cochran for the Middle District of Tennessee. Young is the final defendant to be sentenced in the

Richard Dean, 29, Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Criminal Impersonation, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Dep. A. Parton LCSO, stopped a vehicle for the front seat passenger not wearing a seatbelt on

Highway 321 in front of the Ford dealership. Deputy could smell the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Deputy then asked the driver if she would provide consent to search the vehicle and she stated that she would. Upon searching the vehicle Dep. D. Sel-

mo recovered a black box in the back seat containing 1.0 grams of Methamphetamine and four needles. Upon speaking with the back seat passenger, he provided a false so-

cial security number and attempted to give a fake name associated with that social. He was later identified as Richard Dean. Seeing that Mr. Dean provided







Joshua Havelka, 29, Cedar Circle Lenoir City, was charged with DUI.

Officer Green LCPD, was Dispatched to the area of Hwy 70 E. and Hwy 321 in reference to a reckless driver described as a silver Nissan Altima all

over the roadway, headed Southbound on Hwy 321. Officer made contact with a vehicle matching the description and observed the vehicle driving in the middle of the two lane Hwy. This vehicle continued traveling along both lanes for approximately 75 ft. Officer conducted a traffic

stop on this vehicle in the Krystal's parking lot. Officer made contact with the driver, Joshua Havelka, and observed a slow, slurred speech. Officer asked Mr. Havelka if he had ingested any alcohol or illegal narcotics in which he denied. Officer requested this subject to exit the vehicle. Officer asked Mr. Havelka for consent to search his person which was granted. Upon search Officer located a pill bottle containing Trazadone. After exiting the vehicle this subject was unsteady on his feet. Officer requested Mr. Havelka to perform Standard Field Sobriety Testing in which he agreed. Mr. Havelka did perform poorly on SFST. Officer also had Mr. Havelka perform the Lack of Convergence Test as well as the Modified Rhomberg Test in which Officer observed several indications of impairment. Officer took Mr. Havelka into custo-

dy and transported him to Fort Loudon Medical Center where Mr. Havelka consented to provide a sample of blood for chemical testing. Officer then transported Mr. Havelka to Loudon County Jail, where he was charged with Driving Under The Influence. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

Public Notice

The Loudon county commission will be holding a public hearing on November 5, 2018 at 6:00 pm at the Annex to amend the Loudon County zoning resolution

1. Eliminate the \$100 fee to appeal to the Loudon County Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA).

Christopher Butler, 27, Grove Street Loudon, was charged with DUI, Possession of Handgun while under the Influence, Simple Possession, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer with LPD, observed a black sedan turn off of Highway 72 (east bound) and onto Carding Machine Road at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was traveling at such a high rate of speed that the tires were breaking traction as the vehicle slid through the intersection. Upon making contact with the vehicle at the Big Red Car Wash on Carding Machine Road, Officer noticed a male subject standing at the rear of the running vehicle who had opened the trunk. The subject, later identified as Christopher D. Butler, admitted to driving in an erratic fashion because

he was angry, thinking that somebody has stolen his jacket. This officer noticed several beer cans inside the passenger compartment of the vehicle. Butler was unsteady on his feet, had very blood-shot eyes, slurred speech and had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person and breath. Butler also performed poorly on consented sobriety checks, administered by this officer, and was placed under arrest for DUI. Also laying in plain sight in said vehicle was a small amount of a leafy substance believed to be marijuana. A loaded revolver and numerous rounds of ammunition was also located in the vehicle. Butler was read the Tennessee Blood and/or Breath Consent Advisement form by this officer, and Butler refused to submit to any tests to determine the drug and/or alcohol content of his blood. Butler was additionally charged with Pos-

session of Firearm While Under the Influence, Simple Possession of Marijuana and Violation of the Implied Consent Law. Butler was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Said actions did occur on 10-02-2018 in the City of Loudon.

conspiracy, which resulted in charges against eight other individuals. U.S. District Judge Aleta A. Trauger also ordered \$550,001 in forfeiture and restitution.

According to court documents, All About Giving, Inc. was formed by LaShane Hayes and incorporated as a non-profit agency in September 2014. The entity was registered as a sponsor agency in the United

States Department of Agriculture's Child and Adult Care Feeding Program (CACFP), which is administered by the Tennessee Department of Human Services (TDHS). The CACFP was created to reimburse child care providers for meals served to low-income children and other qualifying individuals.

Between January 2015 and July 2016, Tammy Young used her residence as the Knoxville office for All About Giving, Inc. and enrolled other individuals as pro-



viders for the purpose of submitting fraudulent reimbursement claims to TDHS, representing that the funds had been used to provide meals for eligible CACFP participants. Young pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit wire fraud and admitted that she registered individuals as providers, knowing that they were not providing child care and overstated the number of providers who actually furnished meals to children and inflated the number of children who actually received meals. During the course of this conspiracy, Young personally received checks totaling more than \$54,000.

The other eight defendants charged in this case previous-

ly pleaded guilty and have been sentenced by the court.

The case was investigated by the USDA Office of Inspector General and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Henry Leventis and Sara Beth Myers.
