vestigation after the Tennessee Department of Agriculture reported concerns regarding this project.

investiga-The tion revealed that in 2016 Hinson requested district assistance to stabilize a stream bank on his property. Hinson signed the standard application and agreement acknowledging the district would reimburse him no more than 75% of the cost of the project.

Prior to starting the project, Hinson made a deal with a contractor which would allow Hinson to recover his total project costs, in direct violation of the agreement's terms. Hinson submitted a false and inflated invoice for \$14,469.40 to the district, and he was reimbursed \$10,852 (75% of \$14,469). Hinson paid the contractor \$9,447.55 and kept \$1,404 to cover the value of services and equipment he personally contributed to the project.

As a result of submitting this inflated invoice, Hinson received excess public funds totaling \$2,713 to which he was not entitled.
