## Assault

Randall Jackson, 48, West Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault, and Aggravated Burglary. Randall Jackson did knowingly and intentionally enter the residence of the victim without the consent of the residence and victim for

the purpose of committing an aggravated assault. Jackson was making noise with the light fixture on the front porch of the residence. Victim heard Jackson taking the globe off the fixture, when she open her front door, Jackson struck her in the forehead with an aluminum ball bat and pushed his way into

the residence. The victim fell to the floor and was struck several more times. The victim stated Jackson stated he was going to kill her and instructed her to kneel on the floor, the victim was in fear of bodily harm or even death. Victim quickly ran out the front door to the neighbors and called 911. Jackson ran out the front door and to his truck that was parked in the parking lot of 6th Avenue Church of God and fled the scene. Victim was transported to the hospital where she received stitches in her forehead and was diagnosed with a broken bone in her lower left leg. Jackson was later arrested.

## Violence

Richard Sinclair, 41, Bird Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault. Deputy JC. Schultz LCSO, answered a domestic call at Bird Road. Upon arrival victim gave verbal and written statement that Richard Sinclair, whom resides with her had come home intoxicated and kicked the front door in. The children ran into

the bathroom and victim called 911. Sinclair told victim to give him the phone and he tried to take it from the victim. All parties stated they were scared and Sinclair would have been physical if she hadn't called 911. The front door was badly damaged and the whole casing was laying in the floor. Sinclair fled the scene before arrival but returned as victim was writing a statement. Sinclair was placed under arrest

## FBI

In a violent two-Koren Jones stole about \$450 from small Philadelphia businesses in two armed robberies and one attempted robbery. In pursuit of that small amount of cash, Jones threatened three shops, seriously injured a store customer, and left a neighborhood shaken.

In August 2018, Jones, 25, pleaded robberies, one atrobbery, tempted and firearms offenses and was sentenced to 35 years in prison, followed by five years of supervised release.

The first robbery occurred on the afternoon of November 4, 2016. Jones reportedly pointed a gun at a store employee, threatened to shoot her, and demanded money. fired at a cashier, When a customer attempted to come to the employee's aide, Jones fired a single shot that guilty to two armed went through both of the customer's legs. Jones left with about \$200 in cash, and the shooting victim was rushed to the hospital, where he recovered.

Less than 24 hours later, Jones entered another a dozen blocks store. Once inside, Donahue, the FBI he reached around a protective acrylic barrier and fired his gun toward the register. The cashier was not physically harmed and handed over about \$250.

Just a few hours

later and a handful of blocks south of the second robbery location, Jones attempted to rob another deli and grocery store. During this attempted robbery, the cashier fought with Jones. and his gun fired during the struggle. No one was harmed by the shot, and the cashier was able to disarm Jones before he fled on foot.

Detectives with the Philadelphia Police Department were the lead on the investigation, but the work of several agencies, including the FBI, played a role in the successful arrest and prosecution of Jones.

The case was prosecuted as part of the Project Safe Neighborhoods program, which works to bring together the courts and law enforcement to reduce violent crime in communities nationwide. The program was reinvigorated in 2017 and encourages U.S. Attorneys' Offices to collaborate across law enforcement agencies to direct resources to locally driven crime and violence prevention efforts.
