

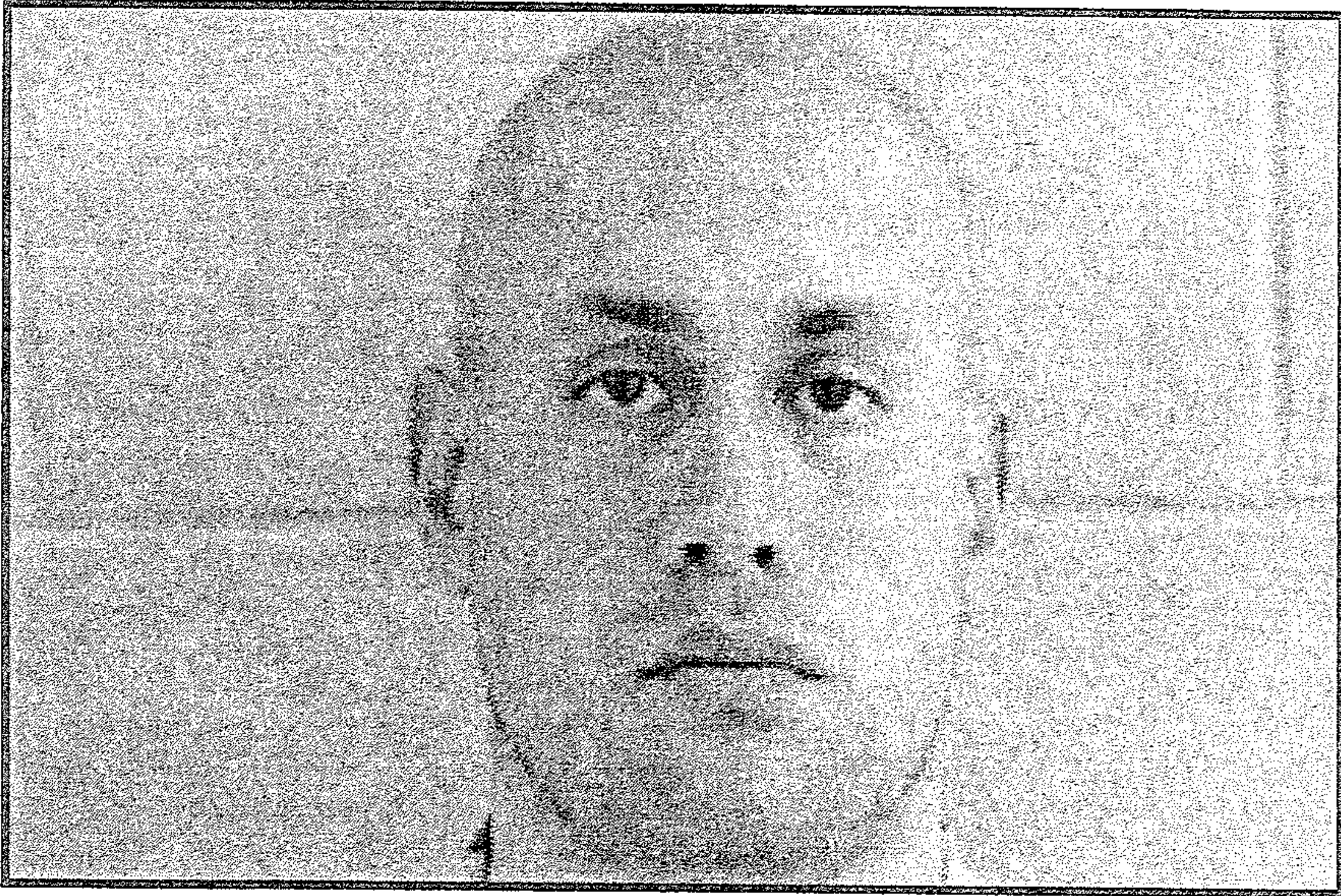

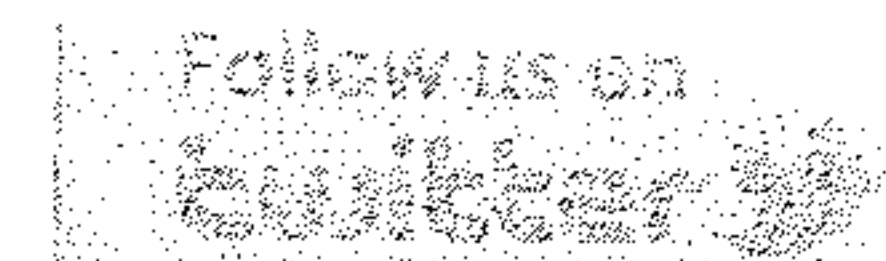

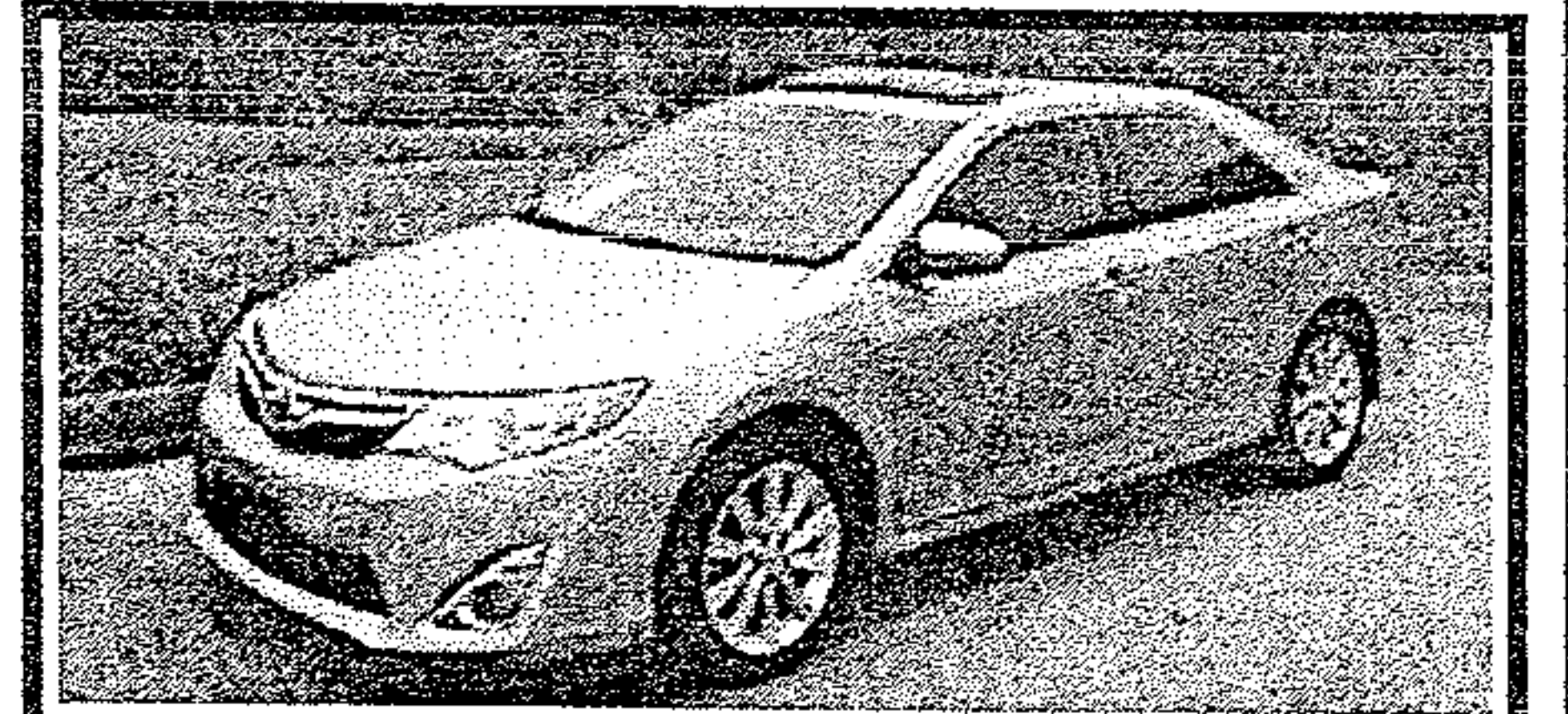

Fight

Phillip Sloan, 26, Stevens Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault and Assisting other Agency. Deputy Kevin Kirkland LCSO, was dispatched to Stevens Lane in reference to a fight. Upon arrival Dep-

uty made contact with the victim, who stated that Phillip Sloan had assaulted him and was at the neighbor residence. Victim did have a busted lip, and appeared to have a broken tooth and was spitting blood. While en route to neighbors residence Deputy did notice

a trail of blood leading from the front steps of the house. Deputy attempted to locate Sloan at the neighbors and a female stated he was not there he had ran out the back door. Upon search of the residence Deputy did locate Sloan in a bedroom closet. Sloan was checked through dispatch and discovered he had 3 active warrant out of Blount County. After an investigation it was determined that Sloan was the primary aggressor and placed under arrest.

Assault ctd from pg. 2 and grabbed his hands, which is allowed in the touch tour. Victim further stated Joshua Cardenez then pushed her hands away and grabbed her throat, at that time Joshua Cardenez squeezed her

throat, making it difficult for her to breathe and pushed her backwards. Victim estimated the strangulation to be approximately 5-7 seconds in duration and stated Joshua Cardenez then released her and continued on through the course. Deputy made contact with Joshua Cardenez, who stated he made the decision to go on the touch tour. Joshua Cardenez admitted to pushing victim hands away when she attempted to grab him and touching her in the neck area but stated he did not grab ahold of her neck. Victim was advised of the investigative process and given a copy of the report number. Joshua Cardenez was arrested, searched, and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

David Day, 29, Kelly Pointe Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault. Officer A. Andrew LCPD, was dispatched to Kelly Pointe in reference to a physical domestic. Upon arrival Officer made contact with the victim who advised she was at home when her boyfriend David Day entered the residence intoxicated. Victim stated she told Day to leave because she did not want her daughter to be around someone who was intoxicated. Victim then advised Day became aggressive and started to strike her in the face several times, then strangled her keeping her from breathing. Day fled the scene after victim stated she was calling the cops. Officer did observe multiple marks on victim including bite marks on her chest, neck, and hand. Victim had red and blue marks on her neck and a large bruises on her leg along with a busted lip. David Day was arrest and transported to the Loudon Jail.

trict's handling of complaints of election fraud and voting rights abuses in consultation with Justice Department Headquarters in Washington.

"Every United States citizen must be able to vote without interference or discrimination and to have that vote counted without it being stolen because of fraud," said U.S. Attorney Overbey. "Aggressive and prompt action will be taken by the Department of Justice to protect the integrity of the election process."

The Department of Justice has an important role in deterring election fraud and discrimination at the polls, and combating these violations whenever and wherever they occur. The Department's long-standing Election Day Program furthers these goals, and also seeks to ensure public confidence in the integrity

of the election process by providing local points of contact within the Department for the public to report possible election fraud and voting rights violations while the polls are open on Election Day.

Federal law protects against such crimes as intimidating or bribing voters, buying and selling votes, impersonating voters, altering vote tallies, stuffing ballot boxes, and marking ballots for voters against their wishes or without their input. It also contains special protections for the rights of voters, and provides that they can vote free from acts that intimidate or harass them. For example, actions of persons designed to interrupt or intimidate voters at polling places by questioning or challenging them, or by photographing or videotaping them,

under the pretext that these are actions to uncover illegal voting may violate federal voting rights law. Further, federal law protects the right of voters to make their own ballot or to be assisted by a person of their choice.

The franchise is the cornerstone of American democracy. We all must ensure that those who are entitled to the franchise exercise it if they choose, and that those who seek to corrupt it are brought to justice. In order to respond to complaints of election fraud or voting rights abuses on November 8, 2018, and to ensure that such complaints are directed to the appropriate authorities, U.S. Attorney Overbey stated that AUSA/DEO Piper will be on duty in this district while the polls

are open. He can be reached by the public at 423-385-1332.

In addition, the FBI will have special agents available in each field office and resident agency throughout the country to receive allegations of election fraud and other election abuses on election day. The local FBI field office can be reached by the public at 865-544-0751.

 ensure free and fair elections it is imperative that those who have specific information about discrimination or election fraud make that information available immediately to the U.S. Attorney's office, FBI, or Department of Justice Civil Rights Division."

Catherine Jenkins, 42, Dailey Ave Loudon, was charged with Criminal Impersonation, Theft OF Property, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Poss. Of Drug Para, and Assisting other Agency. Deputy Fritts LCSO, observed a White Chevy truck pulling out of Philadelphia Park onto Fork Creek Road. The tag displayed on the truck, expired on 06/30/2018 and the front windshield was busted. Upon running the TN tag,

it returned on a 1983 Chevy Truck but was displayed on a 1994 Chevy Truck. Upon stopping the vehicle, the driver gave the name Valerie and the date of birth 12/25. 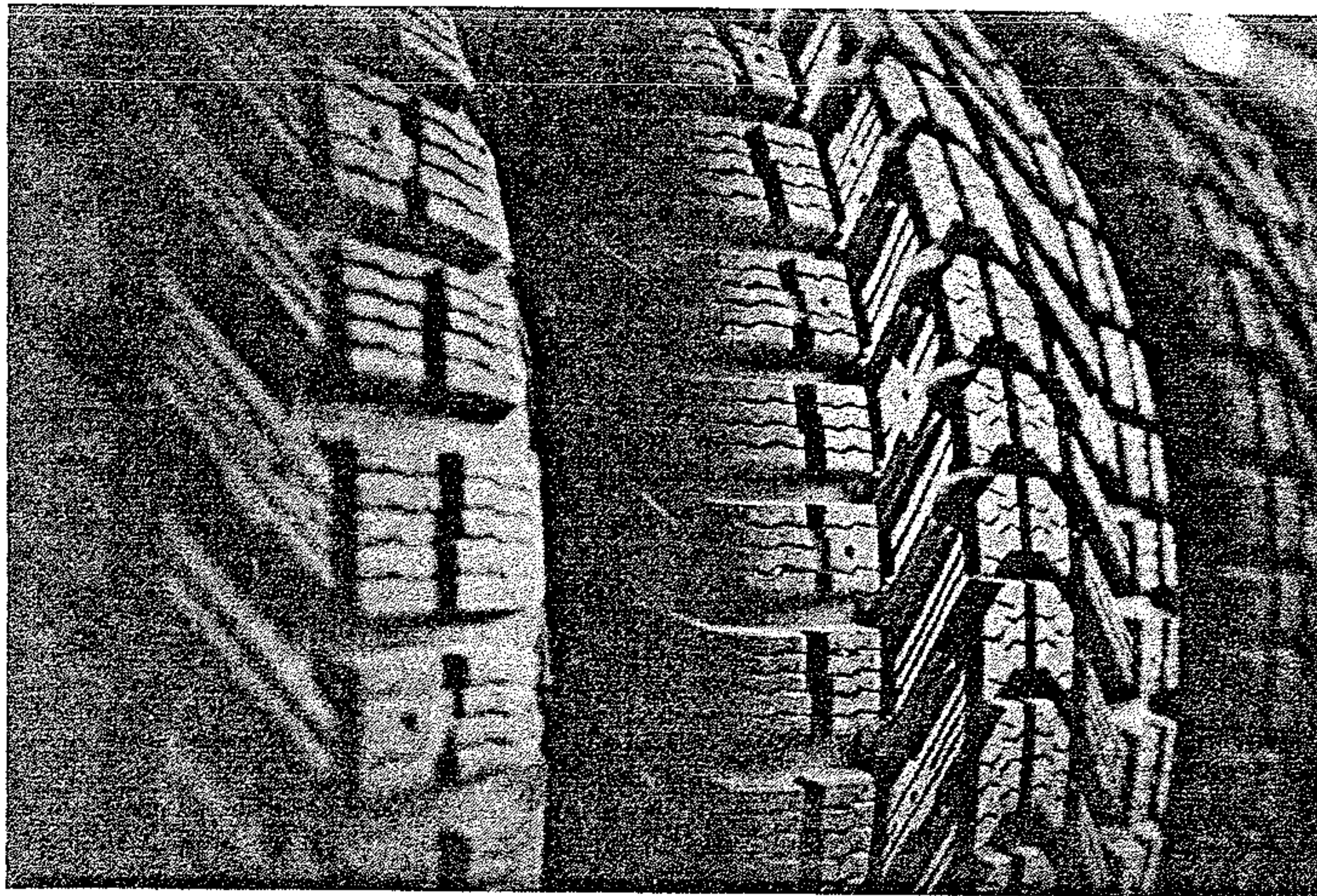

9. Committee's next meeting date/2019 meeting schedule

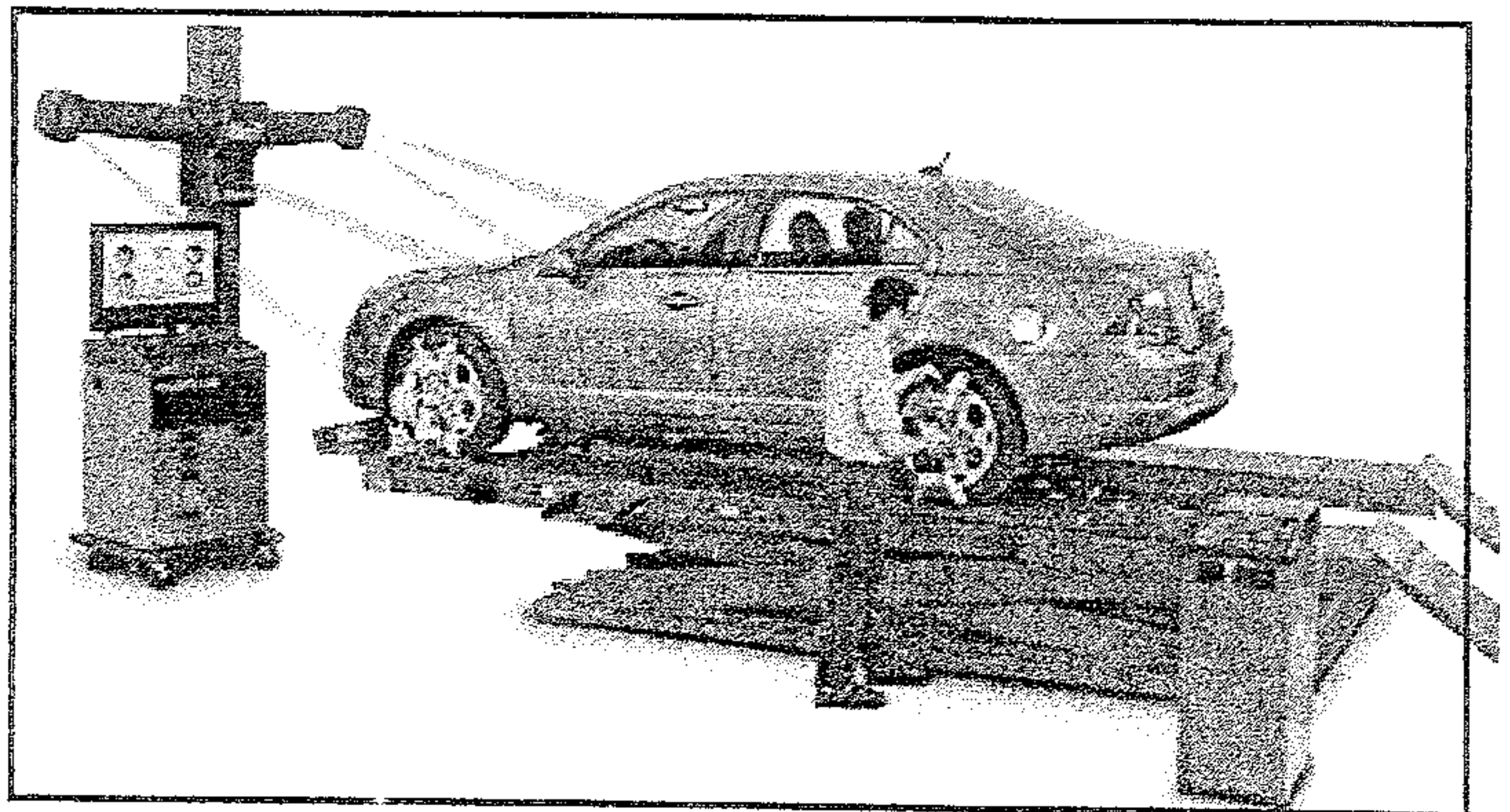
