Christopher Stone Gate Circle Loudon, was charged with Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. I & VI. Officer Cory Fritts LCPD, observed a black vehicle run a posted stop sign at intersection of W 3rd Ave and Kingston Street. While behind the vehicle Officer paced the vehicle traveling between 39-42 mph in a 30 mph zone. The driver also appeared to be messing with something in the center console area and drifting back and forth in his lane of travel. Upon stopping the vehicle made contact with driver Christopher Merrell, Officer could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Officer was given consent to search and located in the center console was a plastic container that contained a baggy with 15.2 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana. The container also had 4 papers that contained 5.6 grams of hash oil, and \$3743.00 cash was located. Merrell was transported to the Loudon Jail.

Rape


Ashley Lohrer, 28, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Statutory Rape. The victim reported to Sgt. Detective Jason Smith LCSO, and the Dept. of Children Services Investigator Rick Gaylor, that he had been

with Ashley Lohrer. The victim stated the two had sexual intercourse with the victim.

DUI Related Crash Heaton, Blockhouse Maryville, was charged with DUI. Deputy JC Schultz LCSO, answered a single vehicle crash on Hwy 411 at Black Road in Greenback. Upon arrival the driver of the crashed vehicle Joseph Heaton was sitting on the top of the vehicle. Deputy ask Heaton to come down so we could talk. Heaton had trouble climbing down, was unsteady on his feet, had the odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from his person, bloodshot eyes, and was confused. Heaton denied injury. Heaton performed poorly on sobriety test. Heaton was placed under arrest. Heaton did give breath sample and blew a .116g/21ol.

Rice also bought credit card numbers from a friend who worked at a Syracuse restaurant who had skimmed numbers from customer credit cards on Rice's behalf.

Rice had an associate in New York City with a credit card cloning machine, and he would provide the numbers to the person to make new cards for him. Rice and his accomplices then used these cards to buy gift cards, which they would convert into cash or money orders.

"It's unfortunately not that hard or complicated to get your hands on stolen crednumbers." card e said Special Agent Brandon Mercer of the FBI's Albany Division, who investigated this case along with the U.S. Inspection Postal Service, New York State Police, and local law enforcement in the Syracuse area. "This information is readily available on the dark web from hackers and other criminals."

There was nothing a merchant could have done to stop the fraudulent transaction, because the thieves put the fake

cards in their own names. So even if a cashier asked for identification, the name on the credit card would have matched their IDs.

"It was a numbers game. They would print out hundreds of these cards. They would go to the register and swipe, and if it didn't work, they would just throw it away and use the next one." Mercer said. "A lot of these cards were only able to used once because the cardholder noticed the fraud and shut down the card."

The fraudsters made about \$80,000 over two years.

After his 2016 arrest for credit card cloning, Rice tried continue scheme—from his jail cell. In 2017, he worked with an accomplice, who was not in prison, to put more than \$8,000 in funds stolen through credit card fraud on Rice's prison commissary account. Rice tried to use that account to write large checks, but the prison shut down his account for the unusual activity and contacted the FBI.

Rice pleaded guilty to wire fraud, money laundering, and aggravated identity theft,


and in October, he was sentenced to more than 11 years in prison. Several accomplices have also been sentenced for their roles in the scheme.


Mercer said largescale credit card fraud schemes like this one are important investigations for the FBI because of the sheer volume of the crime, with hundreds of credit card numbers and thousands of dollars stolen.

It's also a reminder to the public to be vigilant about fraud.

"It's important to do the simple things—checking bank statements, checking your credit report regularly, making you are signed up for any suspicious transaction alerts your bank or credit card issuer offers," Mercer said.



(VEC) accountant. VEC serves more than 115,900 customers and has its corporate office in Decatur, Tennessee.

Investigators determined that Kittle stole at least \$994,981 between June 2011 and December 2017. Kittle used three schemes to steal VEC money for his personal use. Kittle stole \$735,318 by making 242 transfers from a VEC account to his personal bank account.

Kittle stole \$229,293 by making 204 payments to his personal credit card account.

Kittle stole \$30,368 by making 48 payments to a credit card account in the name of a family member.

Kittle was able to his conceal his misappropriation by recording the fraudulent transactions in VEC's accounting

transactions. Kittle also managed and reconciled the statements of the VEC bank account, which allowed the theft to remain undetected for years. Kittle admitted to VEC officials that payments were made to his personal credit card account from the VEC bank account. His employment was terminated on January 2, 2018.

In November 2018, Jason Kittle was indicted by the Meigs County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$250,000.

"This is one of the largest cases of theft that we have investigated," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "However, the weaknesses that allowed this activity to occur are not unusual. Financial responsi-
