
fused Implied Consent and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. The vehicle was picked up by the owner. This all did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.



assault. The call was dispatched as a woman screaming that her boyfriend had hit her. Upon arrival, Officer came into contact with victim, at that address. The victim appeared to have visible bruising and red marks on her arms and chest. She also had a cut on her forehead. She stated that her boyfriend, Dylan Graves, had come into the shower with her. She stated that he got upset because the water was cold and started calling her names. When she asked him to stop, he threw a bag of candy at her, hitting her in the chest, and breaking the bag of candy. She stated that he then got her belt and started hitting her.

After making contact with Mr. Graves, he admitted to throwing a water bottle down the hall, and throwing the bag of candy. Mr. Graves also had visible evidence of a physical altercation, with a cut on his hand and a bump on his forehead. He stated that these were from victim attacking him. Mr. Graves was arrested at the scene for two warrants that had already been issued (Violation of Probation #16-CR-1095 and FTA-Domestic Assault #2017-CR-1652), along with a new charge of domestic assault.
