



Stashed

ed a traffic stop on a vehicle for a traffic violation on Old Highway 95. During this stop Deputy Dailey saw the occupants making furitive movements and detained both the driver Hailey Wiggins and the passenger Fredrick David Hall. Ms. Wiggins gave verbal consent to a search of the vehicle and agents conducted that search.

This search resulted in locating several small bags of marijuana, numerous hypodermic needles, a glass pipe, a hand rolled marijuana cigarette, numerous live rounds of ammunition and a 22 long rifle. Ms. Wiggins produced a bag containing numerous pills to include one clonazepam and two Gabapentin and Phentermine. Fredrick Hall also produced a bag that he was hiding

in his rectum. This bag contained 2.7 grams of methamphetamine. Also located in the vehicle was numerous plastic baggies for resale and two digital scales. A search at the jail of Mr. Hall resulted in locating an additional bag of methamphetamine in his rectum with approximately 3 grams of methamphetamine. During transport to

the jail Ms. Wiggins was moving throughout the back of the patrol car and was suspected of injesting narcotics. At the jail Wiggins provided a statement stating that she ate a \$20 dollar bag of methamphetamine so she would not be charged with it. This incident occurred in Loudon County

a couple." However, shortly after the women began working for Williams, he would take all or nearly all of their earnings, beat them, and limit their access to food. Williams also took the women's identification, cell phones, and money to make it difficult for them to escape. When one victim tried to leave, he severely beat her with a belt and threatened to kill her children. With another, he beat her beloved dog to keep her under his control.

The investigation began in 2015 when a woman contacted the Racine Police Department saying she could not find her sister, whose photo appeared on a prostitution website. The police department collaborated with the FBI's Wisconsin Human Trafficking Task Force to begin an investigation. Racine Police Department Investigator Neal Lofy, who works human trafficking cases for his department and also serves on the local FBI task force, explained the importance of taking a collaborative approach in human trafficking cases and using the FBI's available resources, such as administrative subpoenas of prostitution websites.


