

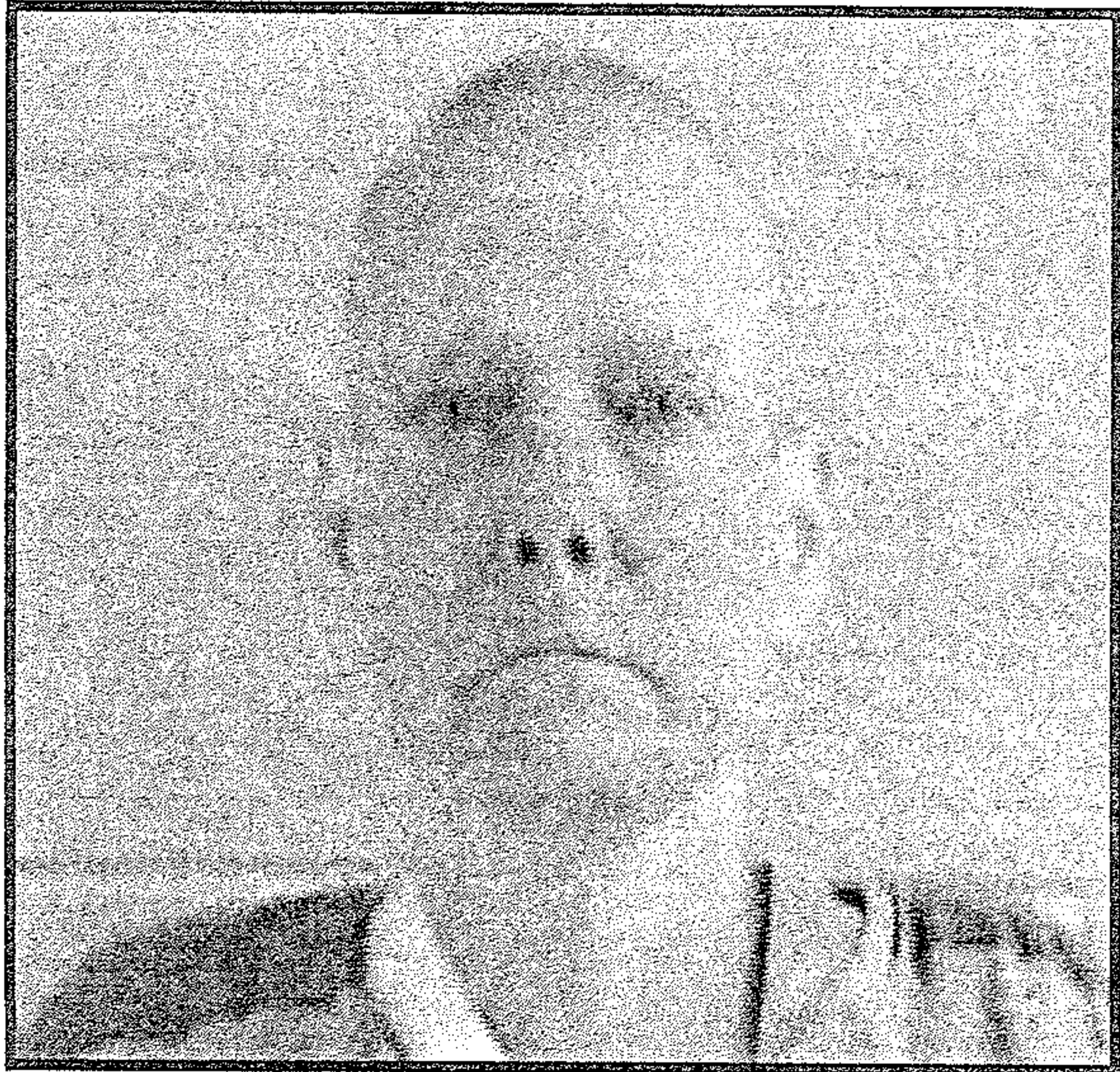

Illegal alien sentenced for unlawful reentry and possession of a firearm

On March 7, 2018, Ludwin Leonel Monterroso-Lemus, a/k/a Ludwid Lemus, 31, a native of Guatemala, most recently residing in Lenoir City, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable Pamela Reeves, U.S. District Judge, to serve 24 months in prison. Monterroso-Lemus pleaded guilty in October 2017 to a three-count indictment charging him

with illegally reentering the United States after being deported and illegally possessing a firearm and ammunition.

According to documents on file with the U.S. District Court, Monterroso-Lemus, a native of Guatemala, was deported from the United States near Hidalgo, Texas, in May 2010, by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. He reen-

Jennifer Harris, 29, Hwy 411 Madisonville, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Poss. of Drug Para., Resisting Arrest, and Assisting other Agency.

Deputy A. Akins LCSO, observed a white vehicle stopped at a stop sign at Steekee School Road with the driver of vehicle not wearing a seat belt. Deputy got in behind vehicle and identified it as a Toyota Scion. The vehicle turned onto Highway 72 and took an immediate left on Clear Branch Road South. Vehicle was traveling at a high rate of speed and it took Deputy a minute to catch up with it. After making contact with vehicle, Deputy noticed a male had already exited the vehicle and the driver not in sight. The male later identified and was detained for a brief period of time until they located the female driver. After a few seconds of searching the immediate area. She was located inside a shed building trying to hold the door shut. She was later identified as Jennifer Harris. Ms. Harris opened the door and was advised to put her hands behind her back and she resisted. She was eventually placed in handcuffs with the minimal amount of force necessary to apprehend suspect. Jennifer stated that she had a suspended license (which was confirmed through dispatch) and no insur-

ance. She was asked to search her car and she refused consent. Ms. Harris was placed under arrest for driving on Suspended License. During vehicle inventory, Ms. Harris purse was located and inside of it was seven needles (discarded), elastic band, three spoons and bottom of a can "for drawing out Meth". She was transported by EMS to Fort Loudon Emergency Room, with vehicle being towed by James' towing. This all occurred in the County Of Loudon TN.

tered the United States without the consent of Homeland Security and was arrested in Lenoir City, Tennessee in June 2017, after officers responded to a shots fired report. At the time of his arrest, he was in possession of a firearm and ammunition. Monterroso-Lemus admitted to discharging the firearm after a dispute with three males.

"This case emphasizes the commitment of the U.S. Attorney's Office to enforcing immigration laws and reducing violent crime, two top priorities of the Department of Justice and Attorney General Jeff Sessions," said U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey. Agencies involved in the investigation of this case include the Lenoir City Police Department and U.S. Department of Homeland Security Investigations.
