Child Sexual Exploitation Ring Collaborative Law Enforcement Efforts Dismantle Conspiracy

In late 2015 through early 2016, vulnerable girls as young as 14 and 16 were sex trafficking ring run by a group of conspirators in Ohio and Indiana.

enforcement effort conducted by the FBI-led Toledo Child Exploitation Task Force, the ringleader of the conspiracy as well as the other six participants were eventually brought to justice and sentenced to lengthy federal prison terms.

The case started in December 2015, when the Lima (Ohio) Police Department began investigating

allegations of human trafficking and forced prostitution involving a juvenile being exploited as part of a victim. One of the Lima officers who originally interviewed the victim was also a member of the Child But thanks to a joint law Exploitation Task Force. That officer—based on his previous task force experiences—understood that the interstate aspects of the case made it a good candidate for federal jurisdiction, which often results in enhanced investigative resources and stronger criminal justice penalties.

So the case was referred



Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced today the creation of a new effort, the Department of Justice Prescription Interdiction & Litigation (PIL) Task Force, to fight the prescription opioid crisis. The PIL Task Force will aggressively deploy and coordinate all available criminal and civil law enforcement tools to reverse the tide of opioid overdoses in the United States, with a particular focus on opioid manufacturers and distributors.

The PIL Task Force will include senior officials from the offices of the Attorney General, the Deputy Attorney





This epidemic actually lowered fice for the Eastern District American life expectancy in 2015 and 2016 for the first time in decades, with drug overdose now the leading cause of death for Americans under age 50. These are not acceptable trends and this new task force will make us more effective in reversing them and saving Americans from the scourge of opioid addiction."

"The nation is currently facing the deadliest drug crisis in American history. Unfortunately, east Tennessee is not immune to this problem. In fact, sented areas with a significant statistics show that Tennessee is a 'hot spot' for drug abuse and overdose related deaths in the country," said U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey. will build on a number of other involving doctors, pharmacies new initiatives begun by Attorney General Sessions over the past year that will help end the drug crisis. The Opioid Fraud and Abuse Detection Unit, a new data analytics program to help find evidence of overprescribing and opioid-related health care fraud, was created

in August 2017. The Attorney General assigned 12 experienced Assistant U.S. Attorneys to opioid "hot-spots" to focus solely on investigating and prosecuting opioid-related health care fraud.

The U.S. Attorney's Ofof Tennessee was one of 12, out of 94 districts across the country, chosen to participate in this program. The district received funding for an Assistant U.S Attorney, for a threeyear term, to focus solely on investigating and prosecuting healthcare fraud related to prescription opioids, including pill mill schemes and pharmacies that unlawfully divert or dispense prescription opioids for illegitimate purposes. The 12 districts selected repreprescription opioid problem, where the Department can effectively investigate and prosecute the medical providers idemic by unlawfully diverting the scope of professional practice and not for a legitimate medical purpose.

Assistant U.S. Attorney David P. to the task force—specifically to Special Agent Devon Lossick, the task force coordinator who works out of the FBI Cleveland Division's Toledo Resident Agency.

According to Lossick, Lima resident Lorenzo Young was the leader of the group and was assisted, in varying degrees, by his longtime friend Aundre Davis, as well as by his girlfriend, mother, and three acquaintances. "Members of the conspiracy would go after vulnerable and trusting young girls—usuinto posing for sexually explicit photos," Lossick explained. The photos would be posted to the adult entertainment sections of a classified ads website; when interested customers reached out, the girls would be transported to apartments in Lima or to motel rooms in nearby Fort Wayne across the Indiana state line.

Once the task force was on the case, investigators began to question some of the victims, gathered motel records and receipts, reviewed video surveillance, and conducted physical surveillance and court-authorized electronic surveillance on the suspects.

At one point, Young suspected he might be under federal investigation and began instructing his mother to delete text messages and e-mails related to the criminal activity. > By June 2016, investigators had enough evidence, and seven individuals-including Young-were charged by a federal jury in Ohio. Five were indicted on human trafficking charges, and two on charges related to obstructing the investigation. Five subjects eventually pleaded guilty and were sentenced, but Lorenzo Young and his friend Aundre Davis opted for a trial. Both were convicted at trial in May 2017, and in December 2017, Young was sentenced to life in prison, while

for nearly 10 years. Prior to that time, he served on active duty for five years in the U.S. Army JAG Corps, serving in Korea, Hawaii, and Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Assistant U.S. Attorney Lewen has experience in prosecuting a wide range of federal crimes, including large-scale drug trafficking and money laundering organizations, violent crimes, public corruption, and complex white-collar and corporate fraud crimes. Two of the higher profile defendants Lewen has prosecuted in U.S. District Court include former Knox County Criminal Court Judge Richard Baumgartner and bank extortionist Michael Benanti.

In November 2017, Attorney General Sessions ordered all U.S. Attorney's Offices to designate an opioid coordinator to be responsible for facilitating intake of cases inheroin, and fentanyl; constate, local, and tribal law enforcement to identify opioid

cases for federal prosecution, facilitate interdiction efforts, and tailor their district's response to the needs of the community it serves; providing legal advice and training to Assistant U.S. Attorneys regarding the prosecution of opioid offenses; maintaining statistics on the opioid prosecutions in the district; and developing and continually evaluating the effectiveness of the office's strategy to combat the opioid epidemic. Assistant U.S. Attorney Tracy Stone was chosen to fill this position for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

Prior to joining the U.S. Attorney's Office in 2006, Assistant U.S. Attorney Stone prosecuted state felony cases as an Assistant District At-

torney in Tennessee's Fourth Judicial District. For the first few years with the office, he was assigned to the Violent Crime Unit, investigating and prosecuting violent offenses such as carjackings, interstate kidnappings, bank robberies, Hobbs Act robberies, and firearms offenses.

As a veteran prosecutor currently assigned to the Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force, Assistant U.S. Attorney Stone investigates and prosecutes drug trafficking organizations and other criminal enterprises operating within the Eastern District of Tennessee and elsewhere. The bulk of his caseload is devoted to combatting pill mills and the opioid scourge ravaging people, families, and communities within the Eastern District of Tennessee.

In conjunction with the announcement of the PIL Task Force, the Department also announced today that it would be filing a Statement of Interest in a multi-district action regarding hundreds of lawsuits against opioid manufacturers and distributors.

The plaintiffs include nu-

merous cities, municipalities, and medical institutions that have borne the costs of the prescription opioid crisis. The plaintiffs seek to recover the costs associated with providing treatment and public safety measures relating to the opioid epidemic from those who allegedly used false, deceptive, or unfair marketing practices for prescription opioid drugs.




