Jason Massengill sentenced to over three years for role in conspiracy.

On March 22, 2018, Jason Massengill, 39, of Kingsport, Tennessee, was sentenced to serve 37 months in federal prison by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Judge, for his role in a conspiracy to produce counterfeit obligations of the United States with intent to defraud the government.

Massengill pleaded guilty in October 2017 to one count of a

four-count indictment charging him and three co-conspirators with the offense referenced above. Details of their scheme are included in Massengill's plea agreement on file with U.S. District Court. According to the plea agreement, from March 2017 through July 2017 Massengill and his co-conspirators produced counterfeit Federal Reserve See conspiracy P.5

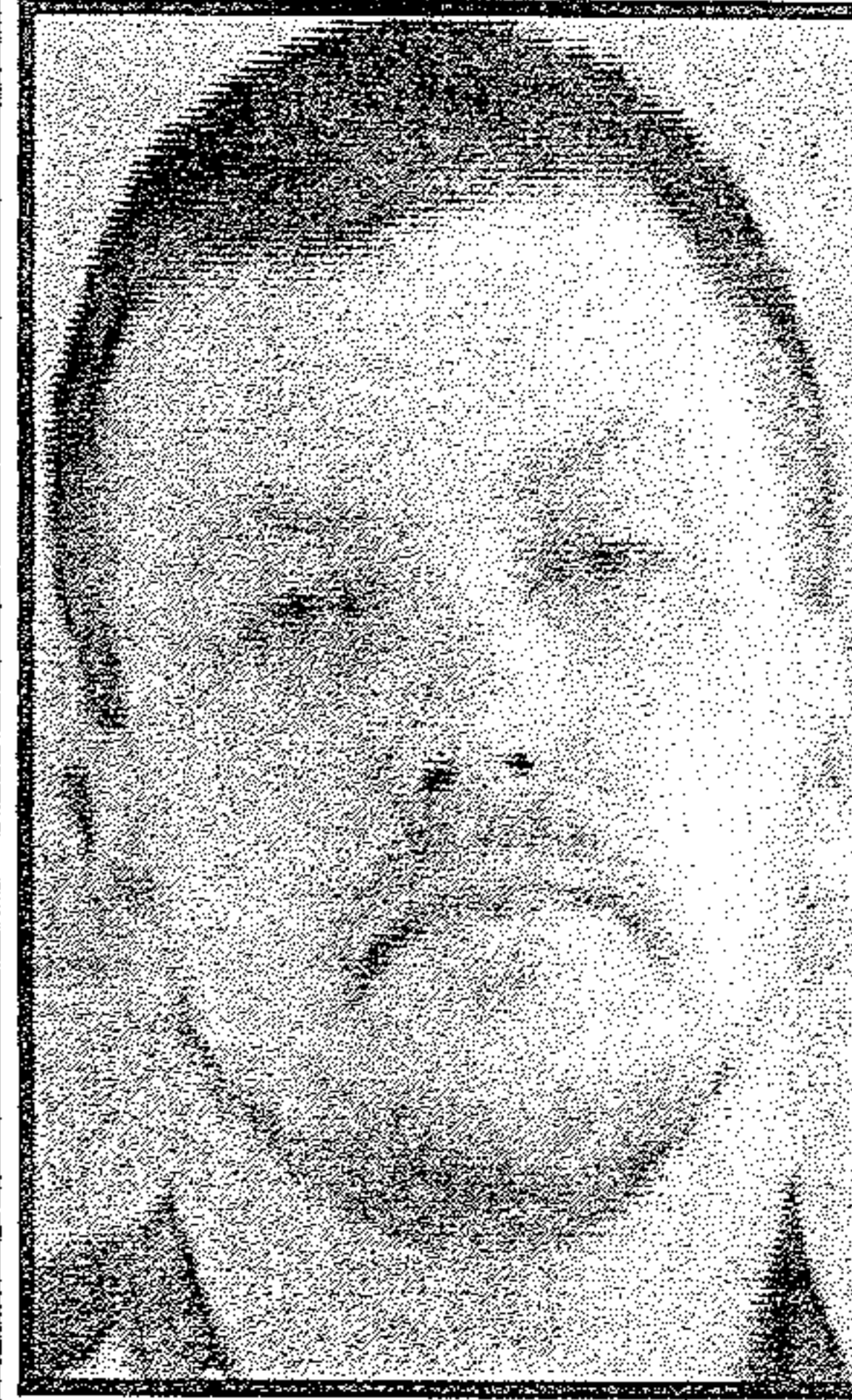

Comptroller's Office Reviews Corporal Punishment in Tennessee Schools

The Comptroller's Office of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) has released a new report on corporal punishment in Tennessee public schools, including an analysis of its use for students with disabilities. The report was requested by members of the Tennessee General

Assembly in July 2017. Corporal punishment refers to paddling, spanking, or other forms of physical punishment imposed on a student.

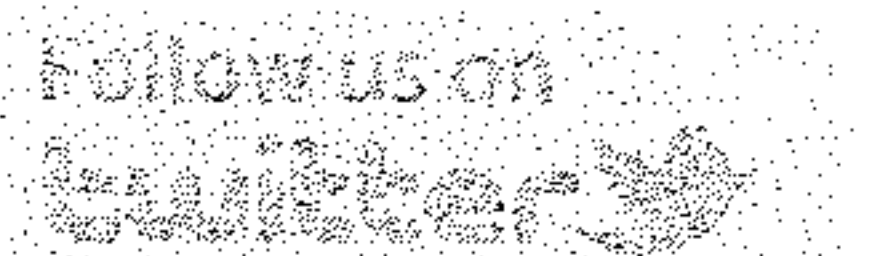
The Comptroller's Office reviewed 148 school board policies in Tennessee and determined that 109 districts have a policy which allows corporal pun-

and Depot Street. Officer observed a green vehicle that did not stop at the stop sign. Officer attempted to catch up with the vehicle who traveled north on Depot Street, and then did not stop at the stop sign at Grand Street. Officer caught up to vehicle and traffic stop at Pike Street. The driver was identified as Christopher Smallen, who had exited the driver seat and fled on foot through a yard on Pike Street.

Officer saw Smallen while giving him command to stop, pull out a brown paper from his short pocket and a silver spoon and throw it on the ground. Officer then detained Smallen. While

sitting on the ground Officer noticed Smallen attempting to pull something out of his pocket. During pat down for weapons of Smallen Officer located a small soft black pouch containing several small plastic baggies in Smallen front pocket with a crystal powder believed to be methamphetamine, which tested positive for meth and weighed 2.2 grams. 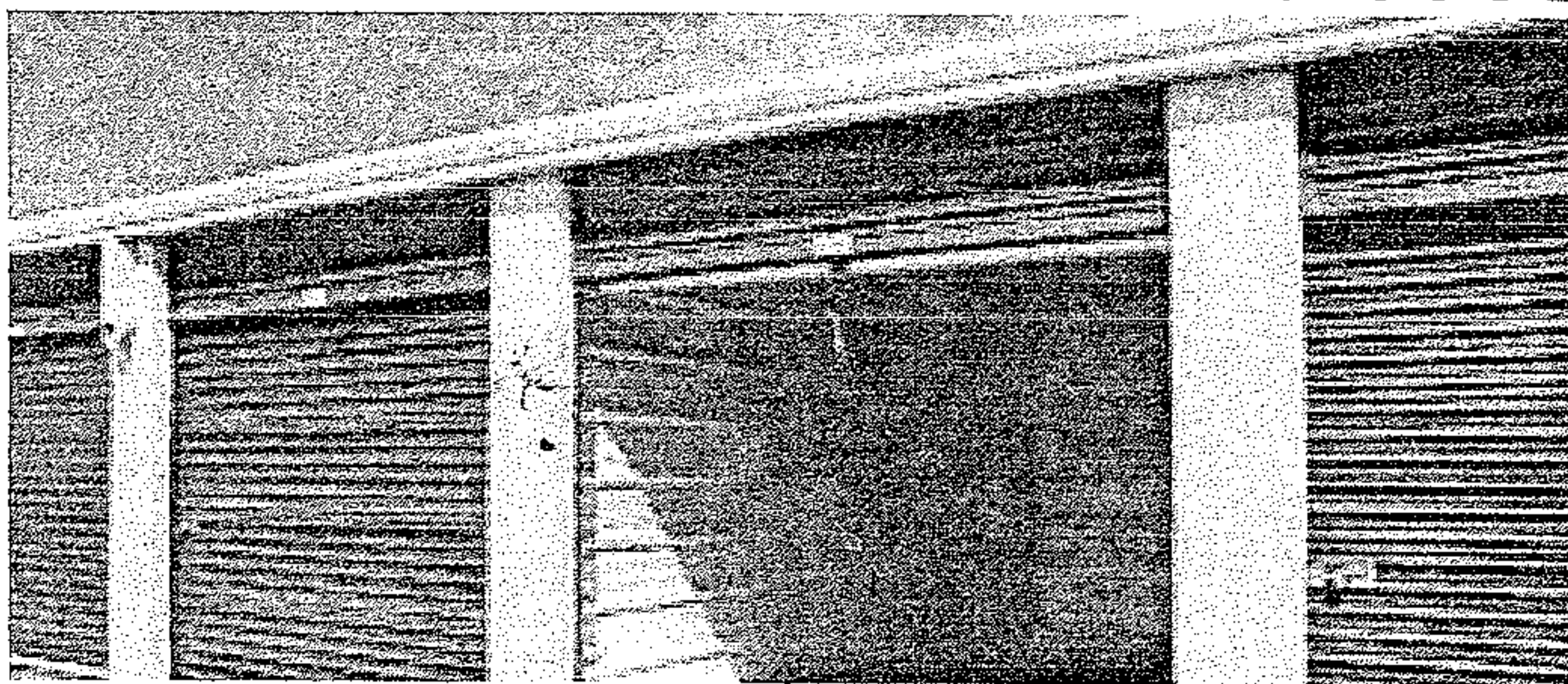

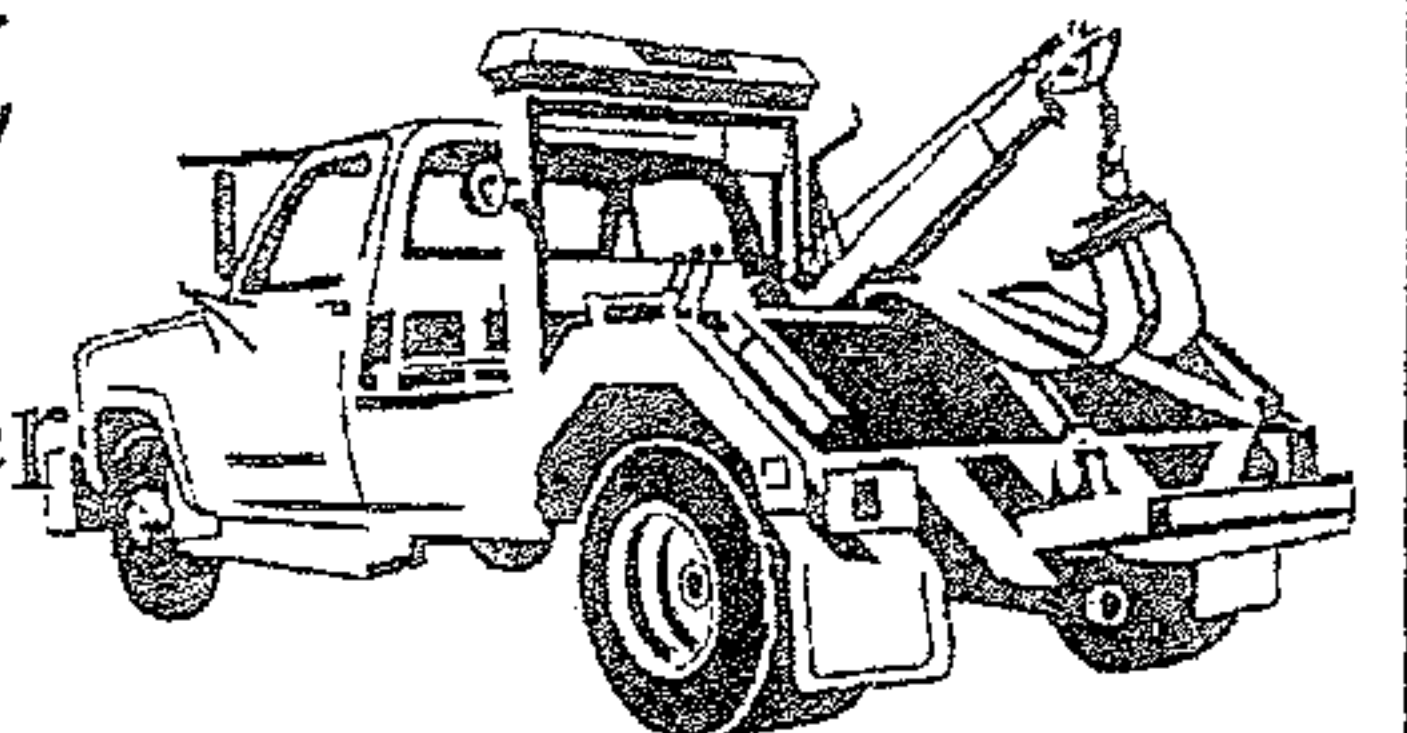

ishment. Most of these policies are similar to one another and leave discretion to the principal, assistant principal, or teacher who administers corporal punishment. Researchers examined federal and state laws, local school board policies, interviewed school and district personnel, surveyed principals and

directors of schools, and analyzed available data on corporal punishment use.

OREA's analysis showed:

The use of corporal punishment varies in districts where it is allowed. In the 2013-14 school year, 907 schools were located in districts allowing corporal punishment. Of those 907 schools, 40

notes, which were used and attempted to be used to purchase various items from retail outlets and private individuals. One such purchase was a vehicle from two individuals in Elizabethton, Tennessee. This vehicle was later proven to have been used by Massengill and one of his co-conspirators as a place to produce and hide the counterfeit notes as well as supplies needed to make them.

Massengill along with his co-conspirators produced the counterfeit notes by taping real money to a flatbed scanner, scanning it, and then printing the front and back of the scanned notes to various types of parchment paper purchased from a local retail establishment. Investigators determined that Massengill and co-conspirators produced between \$95,000 and \$150,000 in counterfeit Fed-

eral Reserve notes, of which Massengill was personally involved with at least \$35,000. Others charged in this conspiracy included: Sean Bowman, 19, of Jonesborough, Tennessee; Robert William Guy, 19, of Kingsport, Tennessee; and Darrell Lansing Hobbs, a/k/a Darrell "Lance" Hobbs, 36, of Gray, Tennessee. Bowman pleaded guilty to the conspiracy and was sentenced to serve five years of probation after serving approximately five months in prison. Guy also pleaded guilty to the conspiracy and awaits sentencing. Hobbs pleaded guilty to conspiracy to produce counterfeit obligations of the United States with intent to defraud the government as well as begin a felon in possession of firearms and possession of stolen firearms. Sentencing for Hobbs is set for March 27, 2018, in U.S.

District Court in Greeneville. Investigative agencies participating in this case included the United States Secret Service, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, Kingsport Police Department, Washington County Sheriff's Office, Carter County Sheriff's Office, Bluff City Police Department, Erwin Police Department and Elizabethton Police

Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney TJ Harker represented the United States in court proceedings.

 percent reported using it to discipline students.
 Students with disabilities received corporal punishment at a higher statewide rate than students without disabilities for two of the three most recent reporting years.


The number of students with disabilities receiving corporal punishment declined from 2009-10 to 2013-14, but not as much as the decline for students without disabilities. There were about seven percent fewer students with disabilities who received corporal punishment in 2013-14 than in 2009-10, while the number of students without disabilities receiving corporal punishment declined by about

46 percent across the same time frame.
 Of the schools that used corporal punishment for students with and without disabilities, about 80 percent used corporal punishment at a higher rate for students with disabilities in all three reporting years.


The report includes policy considerations for the General Assembly and school leaders. OREA has also created a supplemental appendix of all schools that reported using corporal punishment in one or more of the last three reporting years, including the number of students with and without disabilities who received corporal punishment and the corresponding rates of use.
