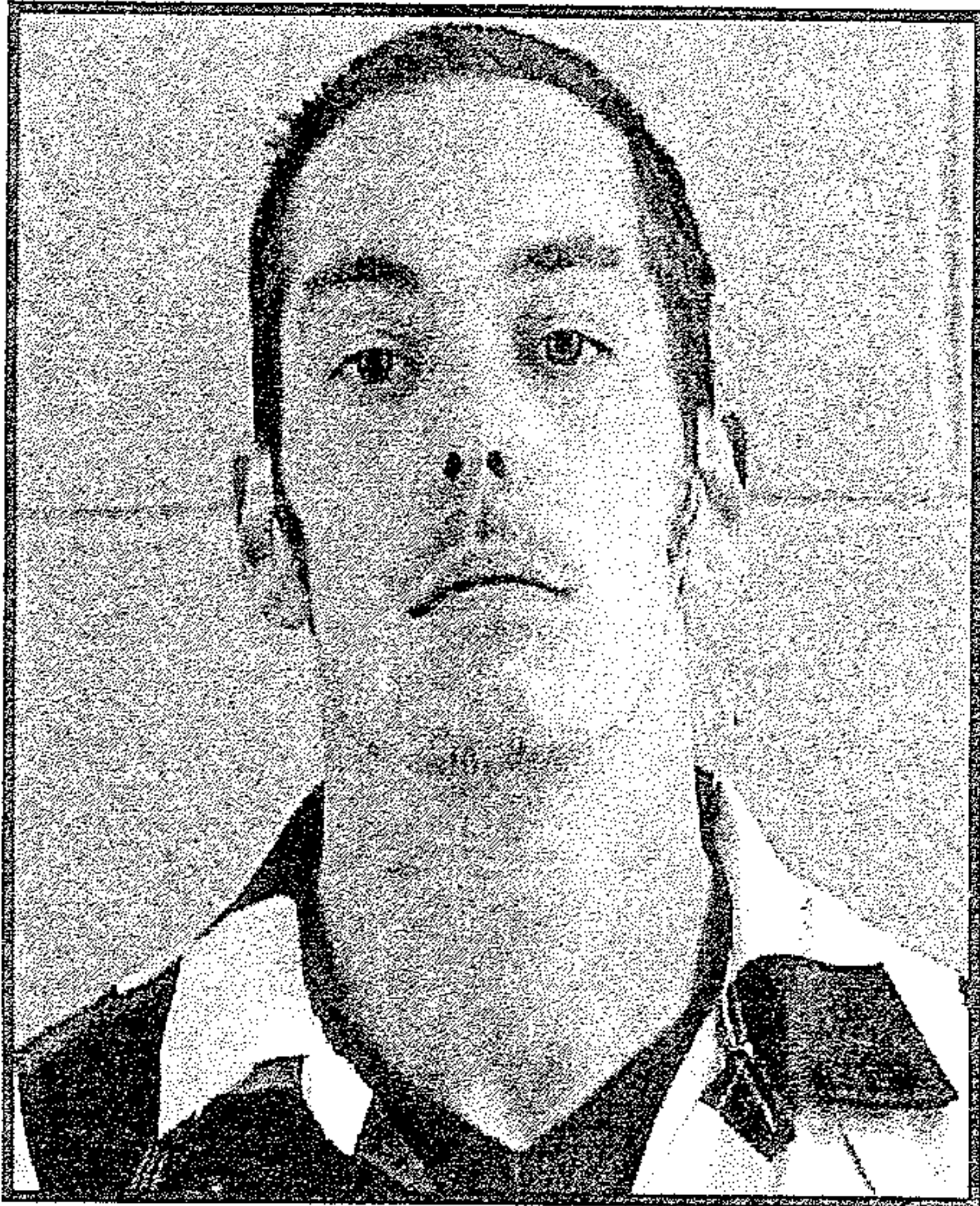

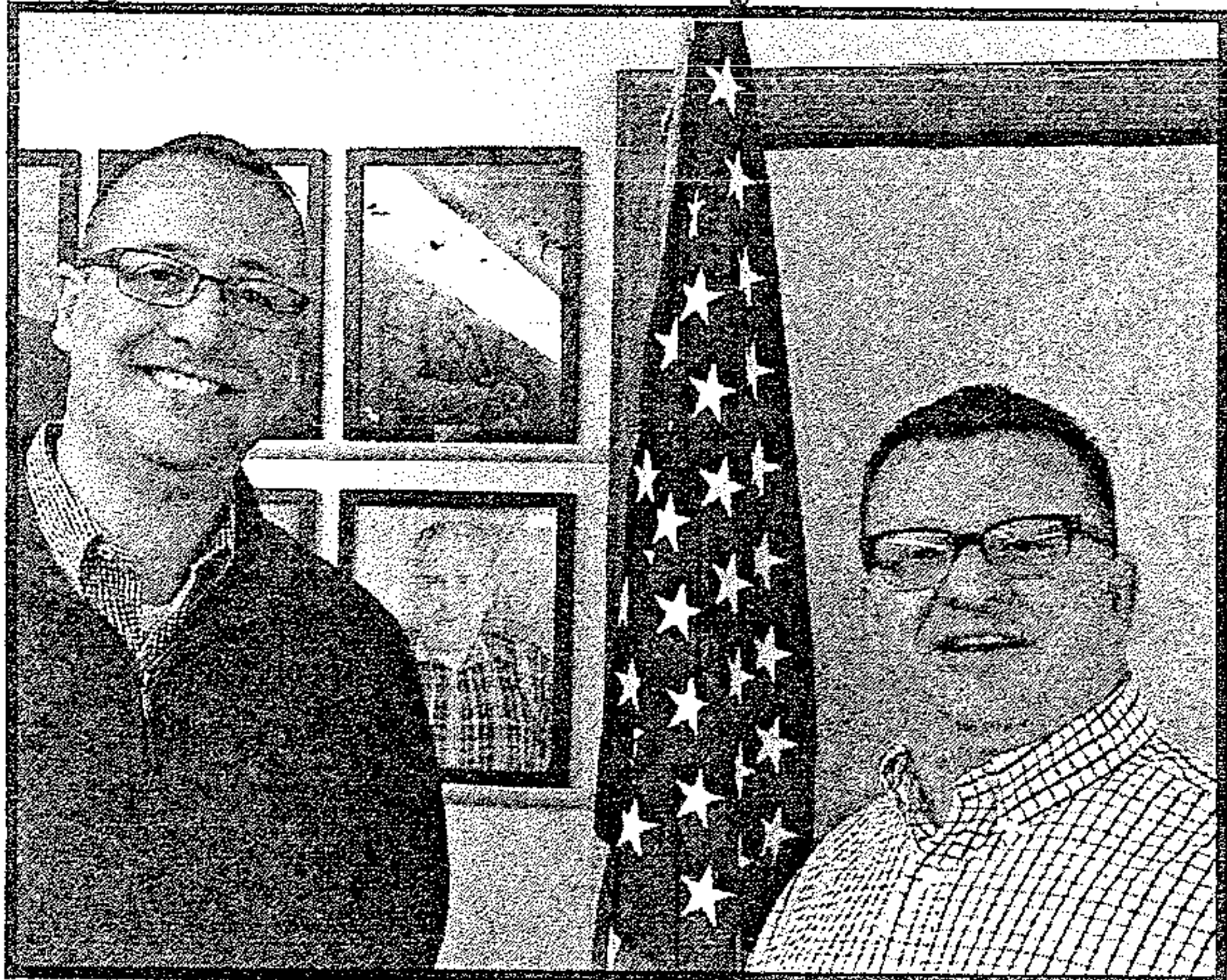

On March 21, 2017, Gayle Sicard Shapiro Green, 65, of Greeneville Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 16 months in federal prison for mail fraud and money laundering. Green was the former Greeneville

City Schools Director of Finance and volunteer treasurer for both the Tennessee Basketball Association and the Greater Kingsport Kennel Club.

Upon her release from prison, U.S. Probation will supervise Green for three years. Additionally, she was ordered to

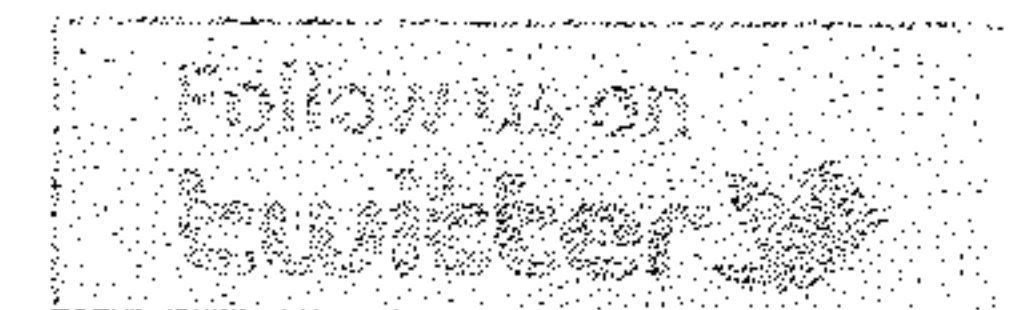

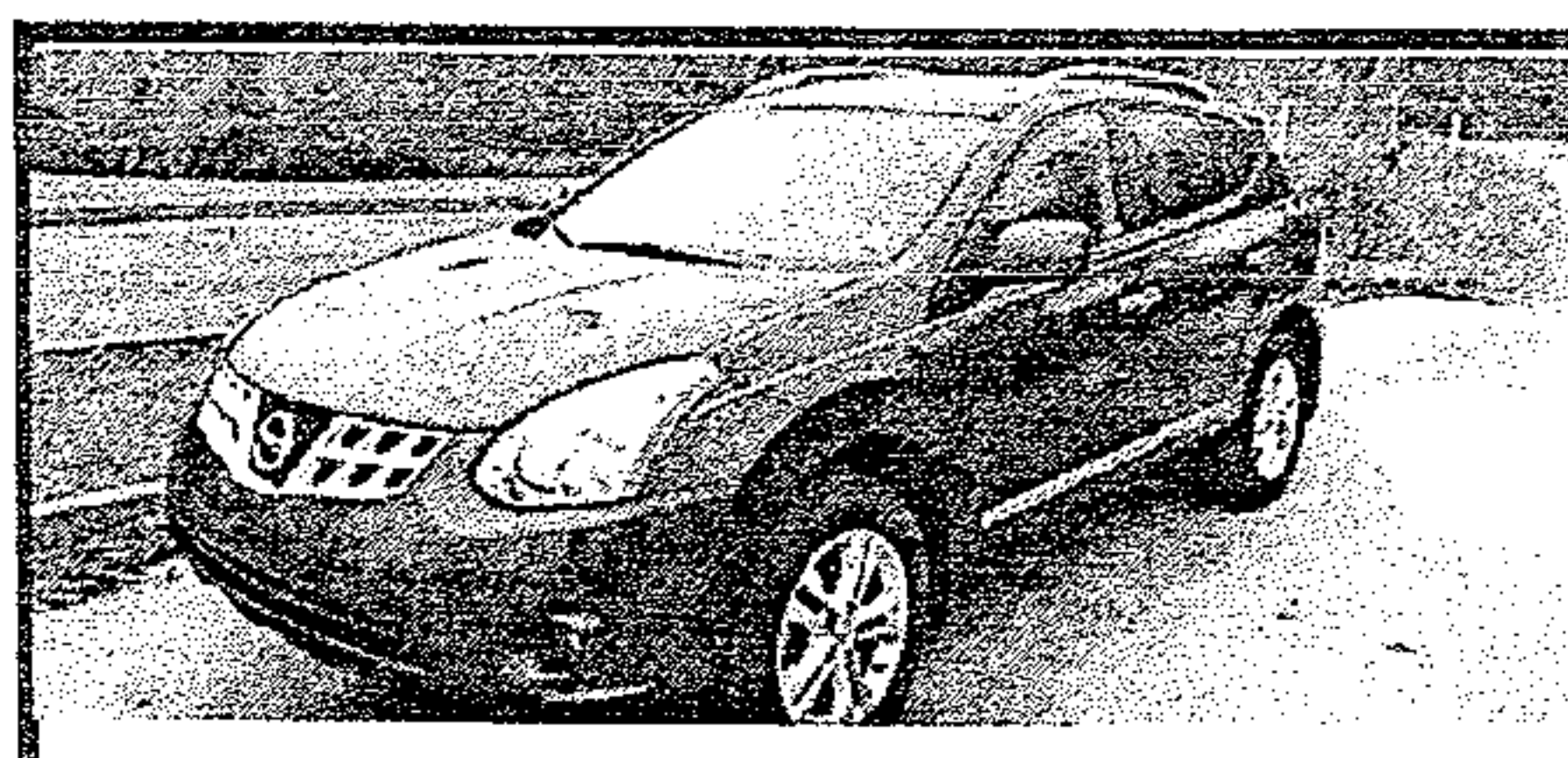

Victim stated that Almanza did hit her in the back of the head victim was in fear and crying. Officer didn't see any marks but there was obvious signs of violence in the home. Almanza was placed under arrest.

pay \$116,309 in restitution to the victims of her crime. Green pleaded guilty in September 2017 and admitted that while serving
