## Child Sex Tourism

Florida Man Who Traveled to the Philippines to Exploit Children Sentenced to 330 Years in Prison

A 56-year-old Florida man who frequently traveled to the Philippines to have sex with children—and make video recordings of the abuse will be spending the rest of his life behind bars for his crimes related to child sex tour-ISM.

David Paul Lynch convicted

multiple counts of producing and receiving child pornography familiar with this and traveling with the intent to engage in illicit sexual conduct. A federal judge recently sentenced the Venice, Florida resident to 330 years in prison.







Jason Mealer, 39, Good Hollow Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault Felony.





"Sexual harassment in housing is illegal, immoral, and unacceptable," said Attorney General Sessions. "It is all too common today, as too many landlords, managers, and their employees attempt to prey on vulnerable women. We will not hesitate to pursue these predators and enforce the law. 


