Mother throws knife at son



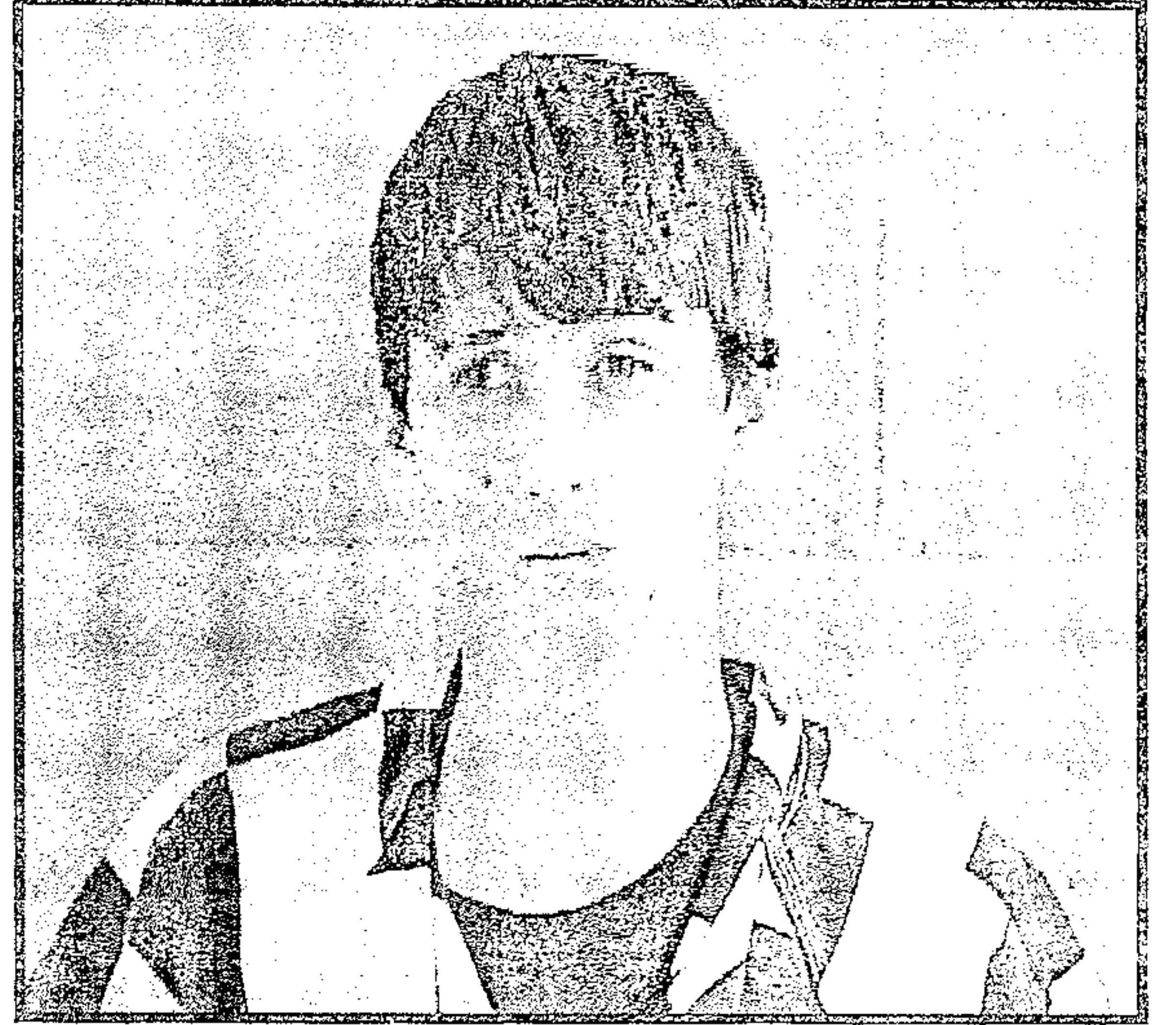

Lead defendants in Methamphetamine distribution conspiracy sentenced to serve time in federal prison

On April 17, 2018, David Byron Jones, 61, of Chatsworth, Georgia, was sentenced by the Honorable R. Leon Jordan, Senior U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 180 months in federal prison for his role in a conspiracy to distribute methamphet-

amine (meth) in the Eastern District of Tennessee.

Jones pleaded guilty in January 2018. According to his plea agreement on file with U.S. District Court, he admitted to being responsible for at least 1.5 kilograms but less than 4.5 kilo-

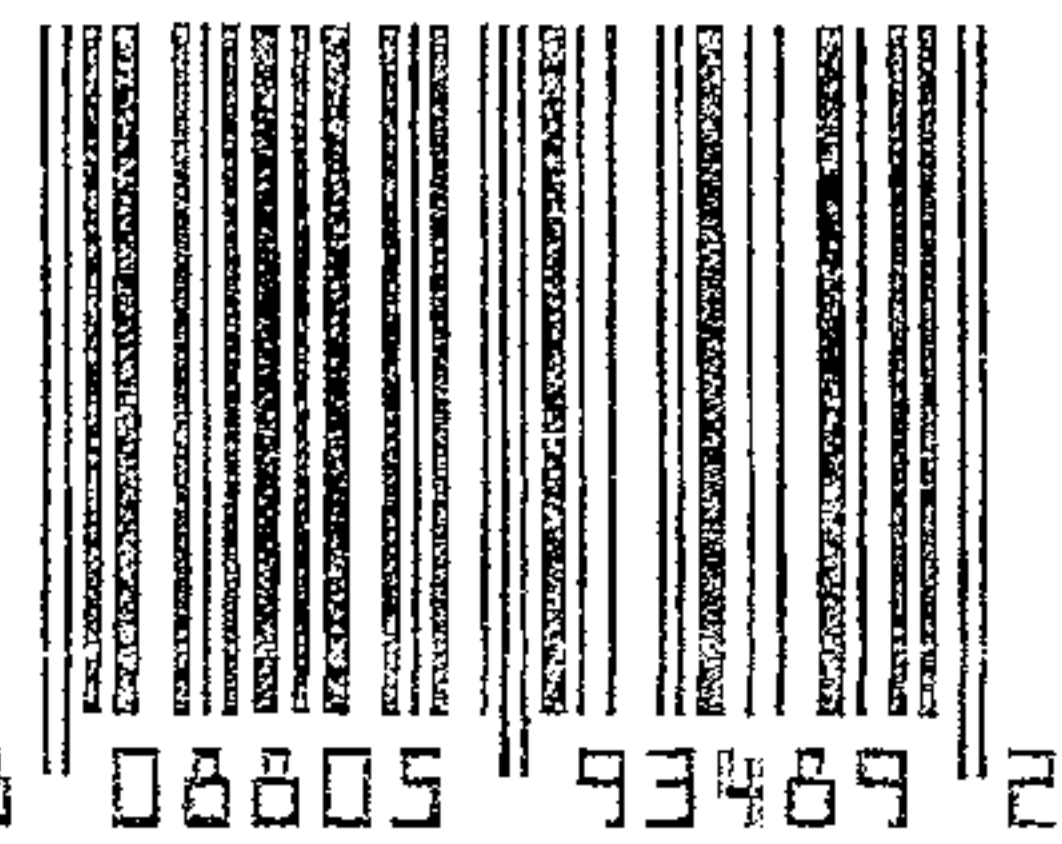



Roy Oller, 21, Matlock Shores Philadelphia, was charged with Reckless Endangerment, DUI, Prohibited Weapon, Capias, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Z. Frye LCSO, responded to Hwy 72 North in reference to a suspicious vehicle parked across the street from that address. Deputy made contact with a silver Ford Expedition parked on a gravel pull-off across the street from Hwy 72 North. The vehicle was running. Deputy observed a male subject asleep in the driver seat of the vehicle. The vehicle was locked. Myself and Cpl. C. Hutchens attempted to have the male unlock the vehicle and were unsuccessful. The male then placed the vehicle in reverse and backed into Cpl. Hutchens patrol vehicle damaging the front push bumper. Deputy then used his Asp baton to break out the passenger side window

and unlock the vehicle in order to remove the driver from the vehicle. Cpl. Hutchens was then able to place the subject in custody. The driver was identified as Roy Oller. EMS did arrive on scene to check out the subject. The subject's BSL was checked and registered 94. I then asked the driver if he had used any drugs or drank any alcohol and he stated that he had drank alcohol earlier in the night but could not provide an amount. The driver was unable to tell what time of day it was and where he had come from. Deputy could smell the odor of alcohol coming from his person. EMS stated to Deputy that Mr. Oller did state to them that he had also used meth earlier in the night but when Deputy asked he stated that he did not use meth. After a check of the subjects drivers license through dispatch, it came back to be suspended out of Loudon County. The driver was then transport-

ed to the Loudon County Jail. Once at the jail the driver did agree to conduct field sobriety tasks and did perform poorly on all tasks given. Mr. Oller was then read the TN Implied Consent Advice and he did refuse to provide a blood or breath sample. This all did occur in Loudon County, TN.

grams of actual meth.

In 2016, local, state and federal law enforcement agencies working together began an investigation into an evolving meth distribution network that was distributing multiple kilogram quantities of meth in and around Hawkins County, Tennessee. Jones, who lived in north Georgia, supplied this organization with kilograms of meth that was then distributed by members of conspiracy, most of whom were from Hawkins County, Tennessee. One of his distributors, Jonathan Delph, 51, of Rogersville, Tennessee, was sentenced in March 2018 to serve 210 months in federal prison after pleading guilty and admitting to being respon-

sible for at least 1.5 kilograms but less than 4.5 kilograms of actual meth.

The convictions of Jones and Delph are the result of a 49-count indictment that also charged the following individuals for their roles in the conspiracy:

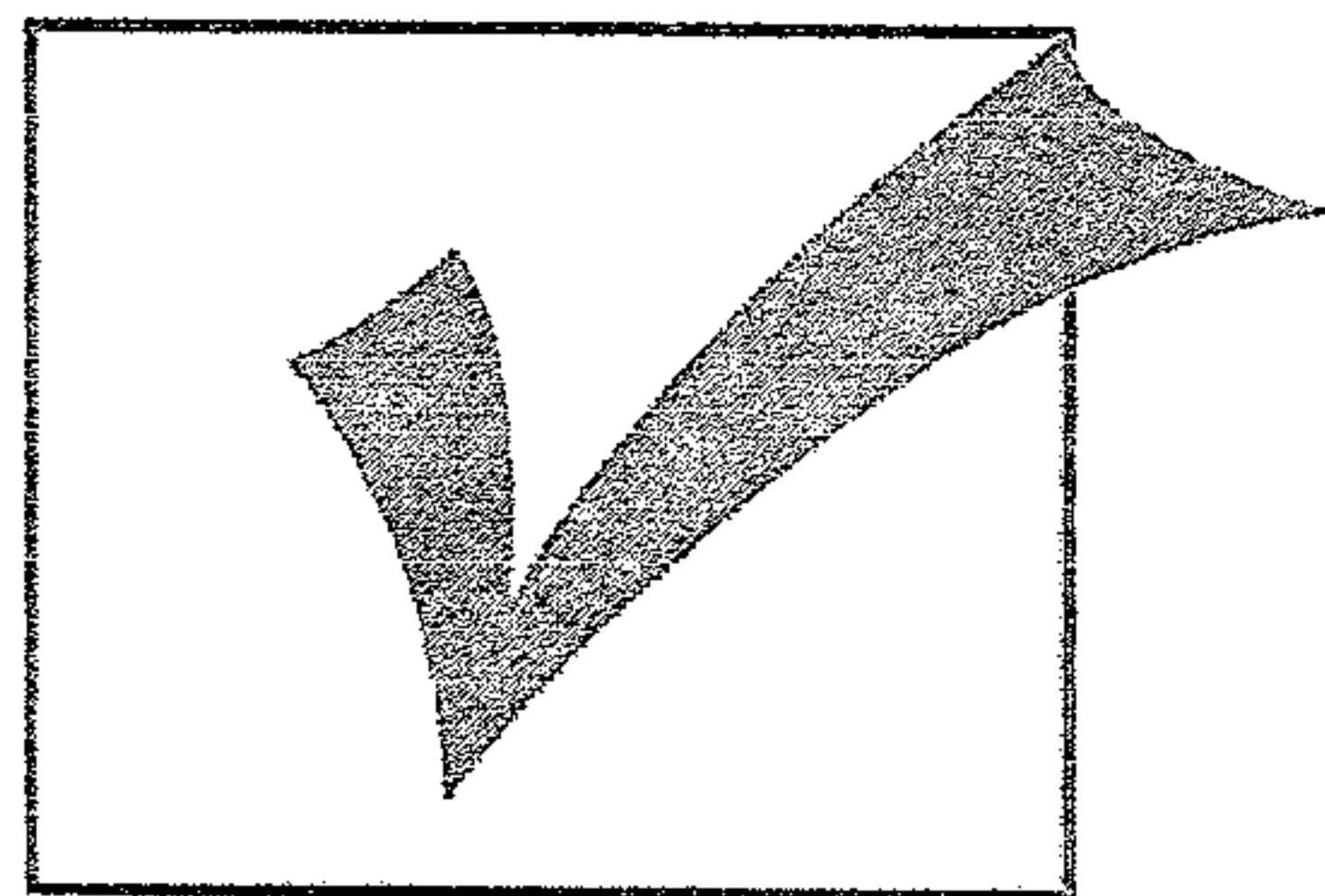
All of the individuals charged in this case have been convicted of conspiring to distribute meth.

Several have already been sentenced in U.S. District Court and the remainder are scheduled to be sentenced between now and June 12, 2018.

The ongoing investigation leading to the indictment was the product of a partnership between Hawkins County Sheriff's Department, Third Judicial Drug Task Force, Hamblen County Sheriff's Department, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Appalachian High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area - Rocky Top Task Force, Third Judicial District Attorney General's Office, U.S. Marshals Service, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and FBI. Assistant U.S. Attorney J. Christian Lampe

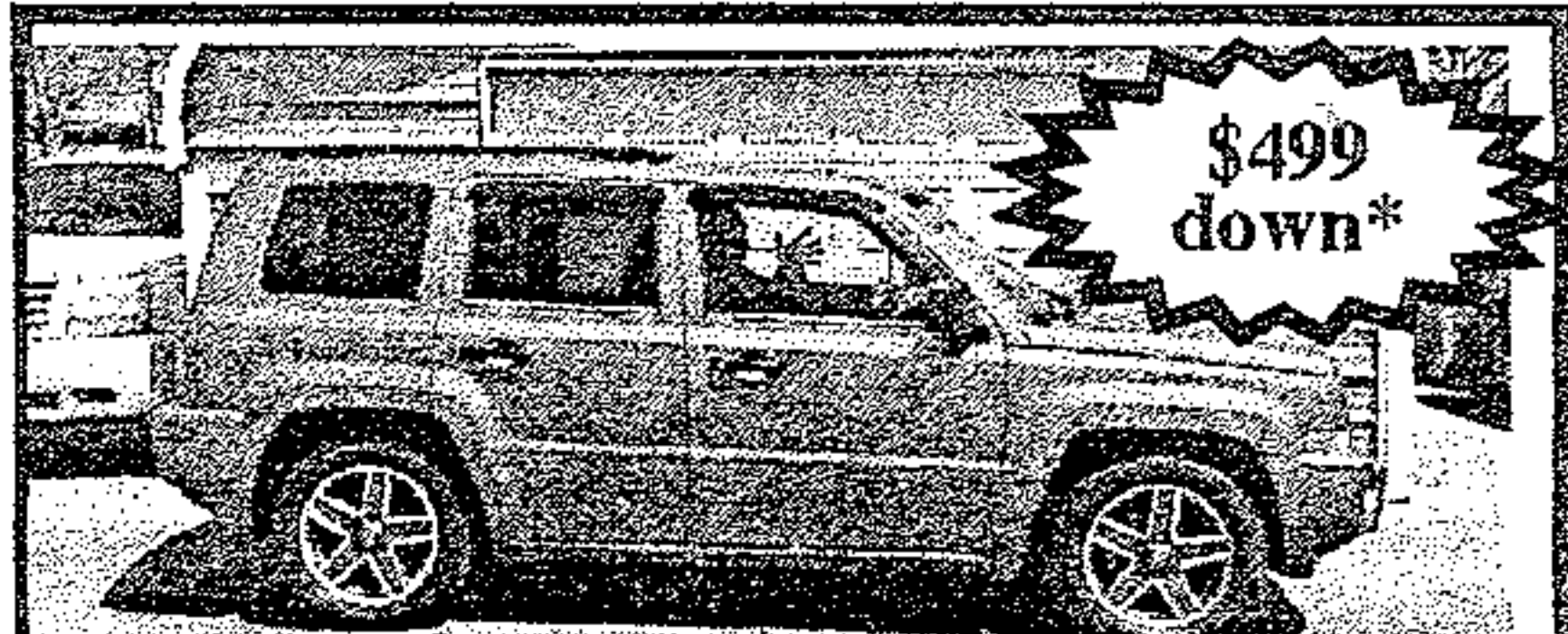
