homicides — Special Agent Brian Brusokas and nearly 20 other FBI employees from the Bureau's Chicago Division delivered 125 Louisville Slugger bats and dozens of baseballs to young players whose leagues are sponsored by the Chicago White Sox organization.

The equipment was seized during the Rogers fraud case, and after the forged signatures of Mickey Mantle, Babe Ruth, Albert Pujols, and other famous players were chemically removed or blacked out, the bats and balls found a new home among youngsters who have embraced baseball as a way to stay out of trouble and to possibly earn a college scholarship.

"These kids are dothe right thing ing and trying to live the right path in life," said Brusokas, who led the Rogers investigation as part of the FBI's Art Crime Team. "We wanted to give them something that they needed."

"If we took one of these bats and put it in the hands of one these kids," said Jeffrey Sallet, special agent in charge of the Chicago Division, "could that bat make a difference for that kid?"

Sallet, who was on hand for the equipment donation and spoke to the players and coaches, explained that engaging with the community is fundamental to the FBI's mission

and to its success as an organization.

"These kids are doing the right thing and trying to live the right path in life. We wanted to give them something that they needed."

"We as the FBI earn the American people's trust every single day," he said. "The best way for us to keep that trust is to be out there showing everybody that we are human beings, that we are part of the community."

"We are very thankful for the donation they gave us," said Kenny Fullman, who manages the White Sox Amateur City Elite (ACE) program. "And we are thankful to all the agents who came out today to spend time with our kids, to play catch with them, and talk with our kids. Any time we can get someone to come out and be positive around our kids and talk to them about their careers, we are very thankful for that."

ACE The program—and a similar Major League Baseball initiative, Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI)—aims to keep Chicago teens away from gangs and, through baseball, offer them skills opportunities to help them succeed on and off the field. "We use baseball as a stepping stone to further their education," Fullman said, "so they will be successful people in the future."



eral Richard E. Zuckerman of the Justice Department's Tax Division. According to court documents, Brian Leo Snow failed to pay his federal tax liabilities for the years 2000 - 2008 and then became the subject of collection activity by Internal Revenue Service (IRS). After being held in contempt of court for failing to provide documents and records to the IRS, Snow filed false retaliatory liens claiming that various government officials, including an IRS revenue officer, an Assistant United States Attorney, and a United States District Court Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee owed him millions of dollars. Each of these government officials had been involved in attempts to collect Snow's back taxes. Snow also filed three false claims with the IRS claiming over \$144 million in tax refunds to which he was not entitled. Snow owes the IRS over \$150,000 in taxes.

Sentencing is scheduled for November 28, 2018.

Snow faces a statutory maximum sentence of fifteen years in prison. He also faces a term of supervised release, restitution, and monetary penalties.

Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General Zuckerman commended special agents of the offices of Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration and IRS

Criminal who conducted the investigation, and Tax Division Senior Litigation Counsel Jen E. Ihlo and Trial Attorney Jason M. Scheff, who are prosecuting the case.
