FBI Pittsburgh Special Agent Jennifer King is no stranger to Carter's activities—she was part of the team that initially investigated Carter in 2016, uncovering his conspiracy to transmethamphetport amine from California to West Virginia. For those crimes, he was arrested in March 2016, pleaded guilty in July 2016, and sentenced in February 2017 to his original 20-year term. Carter's Mexican cartel contact in California was also charged and is serving time in prison.

Shortly after Carter's guilty plea in the initial conspirhis criminal acy, activities started up again. While being held in a jail in Barboursville, West Virginia, he became the ringleader for distributing illegal drugs to members of his network through coded phone calls and personal visits. According to case agent King, "Carter knew the jail recorded telephone calls, but he told one of his associates on the phone he believed it was safe to talk because he had already pleaded guilty."

For months the FBI monitored Car-

ter's calls and figured out what the coded conversations meant. Investigators were eventually able to get a number of court-authorized electronic surveillance orders on various communication devices and members of Carter's network.

"Carter's criminal network was tough to penetrate because it was composed mostly of family members," King explained. "It included Carter's sister, uncle, and several cousins and close associates that he had grown up with."

The FBI used informants, found cooperating witnesses, and conducted undercover operations and physical surveillance, but it needed electronic surveillance to fully dismantle Carter's criminal network. The investigation ultimately resulted in a mountain of evidence and a June 2017 indictment, which led to the takedown of Carter's criminal organization after the execution of 23 federal arrest warrants and about a dozen search warrants.

In one of those searches alone, law enforcement seized more than \$70,000 in cash, jewelry, a car, and real estate. They also found more than 700 grams of a mixture containing heroin and fentanyl, a quantity of cocaine, a kilo press, and firearms.

December 2017, Carter pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute more than five kilograms of cocaine, more than 280 grams of cocaine base, and more than one kilogram of heroin. King said that Carter admitted to directing other participants outside the jail to cook cocaine into crack


and to distribute controlled substances in and around Raleigh County. "He also admitted to, in some instances, directing what prices should be charged for the drugs and how the money collected through the sale of the drugs should be distributed," she added.


Carter's co-conspirators have pleaded guilty and are in various stages of the sentencing process.

Like many other investigations the FBI undertakes, this case involved the assistance of multiple law enforcement partners, each contributing individual expertise, talent and resources. "But in particular," said King, "we worked very closely and seamlessly with the Beckley-Raleigh County Drug and Violent Crime Unit, representing the Raleigh County Sheriff's Office, Beckley Police Department.

Shawn Hatchett, the former superintendent of the Town of Rogersville Water Department and contractor for the Hawkins County Board of Education has resulted in additional charges against Hatchett. Hatchett was contracted as a certified operator for the Hawkins County Board of Education and fraudulently claimed

ceived \$64,800 in fees between April 8, 2011 and December 12, 2017. Investigators found that Hatchett did not perform the work he was paid to do.

Hatchett was contracted to conduct required tests for wastewater treatment systems at various schools in Hawkins County. After performing the tests, he was responsible for filling out reports to document the test results.

Hatchett documented that he performed the tests at the Town of Rogersville sewer treatment plant laboratory. However, Town of Rogersville employees at the sewer treatment plant told Comptroller investigators that samples from the schools had not been tested at their facility. Additionally, no logs,

notes, or records documenting that Hatchett had used the sewer treatment plant's laboratory were found.

On August 20,
