Fire

With a new school year on the horizon, the SFMO is encouraging parents to talk to their kids about when to stop, drop, and roll.

"Teaching children to stop, drop, and roll when their clothes are on fire is an important step in ensuring they are fire safe, "said Tennessee Department of Commerce and (TDCI) Insurance Commissioner and State Fire Marshal Julie Mix McPeak. "It is important that children can differentiate stop, drop, and roll from what to do in a house fire. We encourage parents to talk to their kids about when stop, drop, and roll is necessary, and when to deploy other fire safety messages like 'get out, stay out'."

Make sure you and your family know what to do in case a clothing fire occurs: If your clothes or
