## Michael J.W. Potter Sentenced To Life In Prison For Conspiring To Distribute Methamphetamine

On August 1, 2018, Michael J.W. Potter, 36, of Kingsport, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Judge, to serve the remainder of his life in federal

prison. There is no parole in the federal system.

Potter was sentenced pursuant to a federal statute which provides for a mandatory sentence of life in pris-

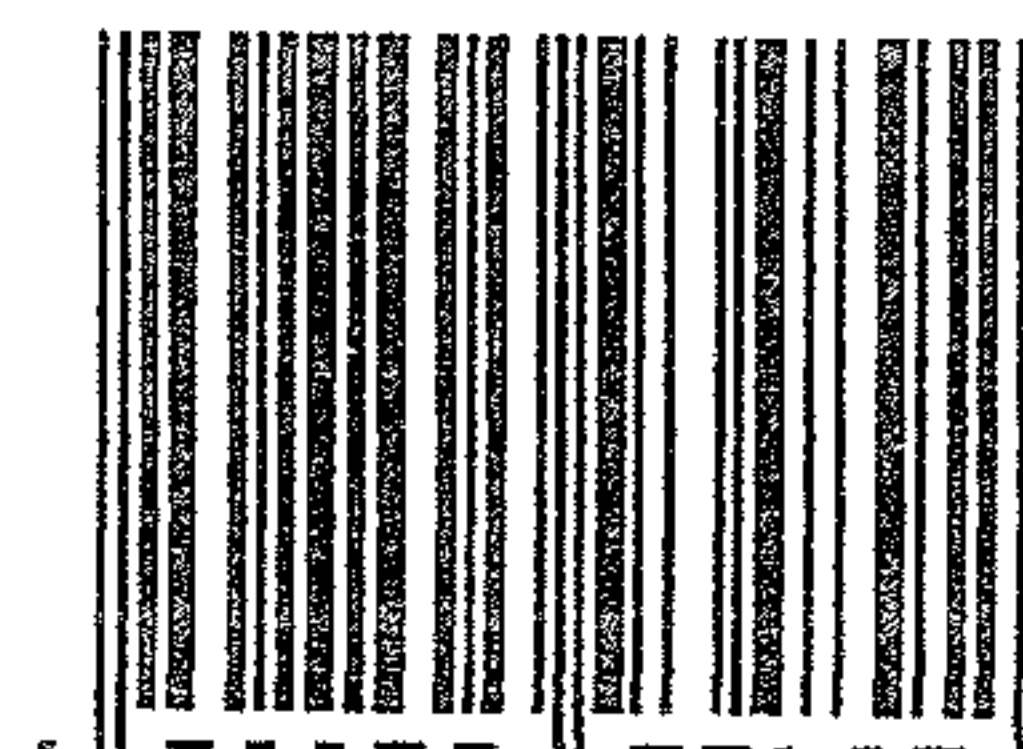
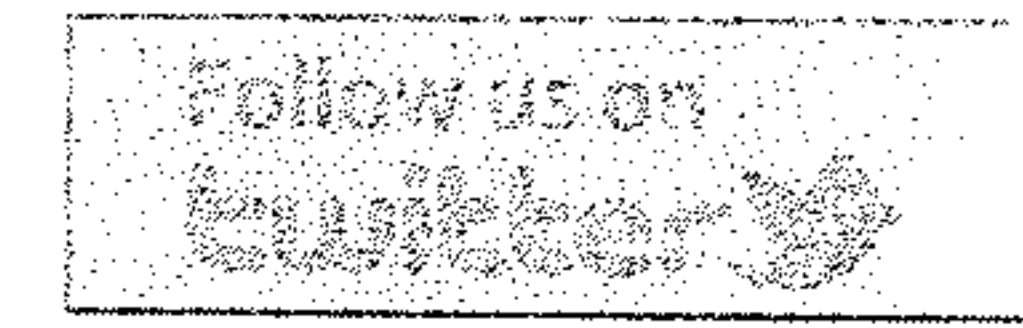

Randi Reppert, 32, Cedar Drive Nashville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Contraband in a Penal Institution, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Assisting other Agency.

Deputy Pesterfield made

contact with Mrs. Randi Reppert (the offender) walking on Highway 11 at Highway 70. Mrs. Reppert stated she was trying to get to the Greyhound bus station in Knoxville and asked for a ride. Deputy informed Mrs. Reppert he could not take her that far but was will-

ing to get her as close as he could. Upon checking Mrs. Reppert through dispatch she did return with a valid FTA warrant out of Cumberland County (warrant #GS16CR5826) Deputy placed the offender in custody at that time. Deputy asked the offender if she had anything hidden on her and informed her she would be searched at the jail to which she stated she didn't have anything. Upon arrival at the jail the offender was asked before entering if she had anything illegal on her person and was informed if she brought contraband into the jail it would be a felony, she again stated she did not. The offender was searched by Deputy S. Bevins located in the offenders right side of her bra a one dollar bill containing less than a gram of a crystal substance believed to be methamphetamine. Deputy is charging the offender with possession of meth (TCA 39-17-434), possession of paraphernalia (TCA 39-17-425), and introduction of contraband in a penal institution (TCA 39-16-201). All the above actions did occur in Loudon County TN.

driving home and had been texting on her cell phone. The offender then replied, "I had four Miller Light drafts." The offender agreed to perform SFST and performed poorly. The offender also stated she takes medication for seizures that affects her central nervous system. Based on the totality of circumstances, the offender was taken into custody and transported to the Ft. Loudon ER for a voluntary blood withdrawal. The offender was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Deputy Gray advised him a loaded Kel-Tec 380 cal s/n LBP80 with 5 bullets was found in the glove compartment of the crashed vehicle. The firearm was taken into evidence and a property receipt issued. All occurred in Loudon County, TN.

on for individuals convicted of a drug trafficking offense after having previously been convicted of two or more felony drug trafficking offenses in state or federal court.

Evidence presented at trial revealed that an investigation into a large scale methamphetamine distribution ring in northeast Tennessee and southwest Virginia led to the execution of search warrants by agents with the Second Judicial Drug Task Force, working with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF), and Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI). Nearly five kilograms of crystal methamphetamine were seized as a result of these searches. During the investigation, agents identified numerous members of the organization,

which was supplied primarily by Nathan Hogan of Villa Rica, Georgia, who was also indicted in this case.

Potter and his co-conspirators were responsible for transporting hundreds of pounds of crystal methamphetamine, a highly addictive controlled substance, from northern Georgia into Sullivan County, Tennessee, and the surrounding area for distribution. Only Potter proceeded to trial. The other 24 individuals indicted in the conspiracy entered guilty pleas, with the exception of Shawn Dumitras, who died prior to arrest.

Law enforcement agencies participating in this joint investigation were the Second Judicial District Drug Task Force, Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, Kingsport, Police Department, TBI, ATF and DEA. Assistant U.S. Attorney J. Gregory

Bowman represented the United States in court proceedings.

This case was a result of the Department of Justice's Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF) program, the centerpiece of the Department of Justice's drug supply reduction strategy. OCDETF was established in 1982 to conduct comprehensive, multi-level attacks on major drug trafficking and money laundering organizations. Today, OCDETF combines the resources and expertise of its member federal agencies in cooperation with state and local law enforcement. The principal mission of the OCDETF program is to identify, disrupt, and dismantle the most serious drug trafficking and money laundering organi-

zations and those primarily responsible for the nation's

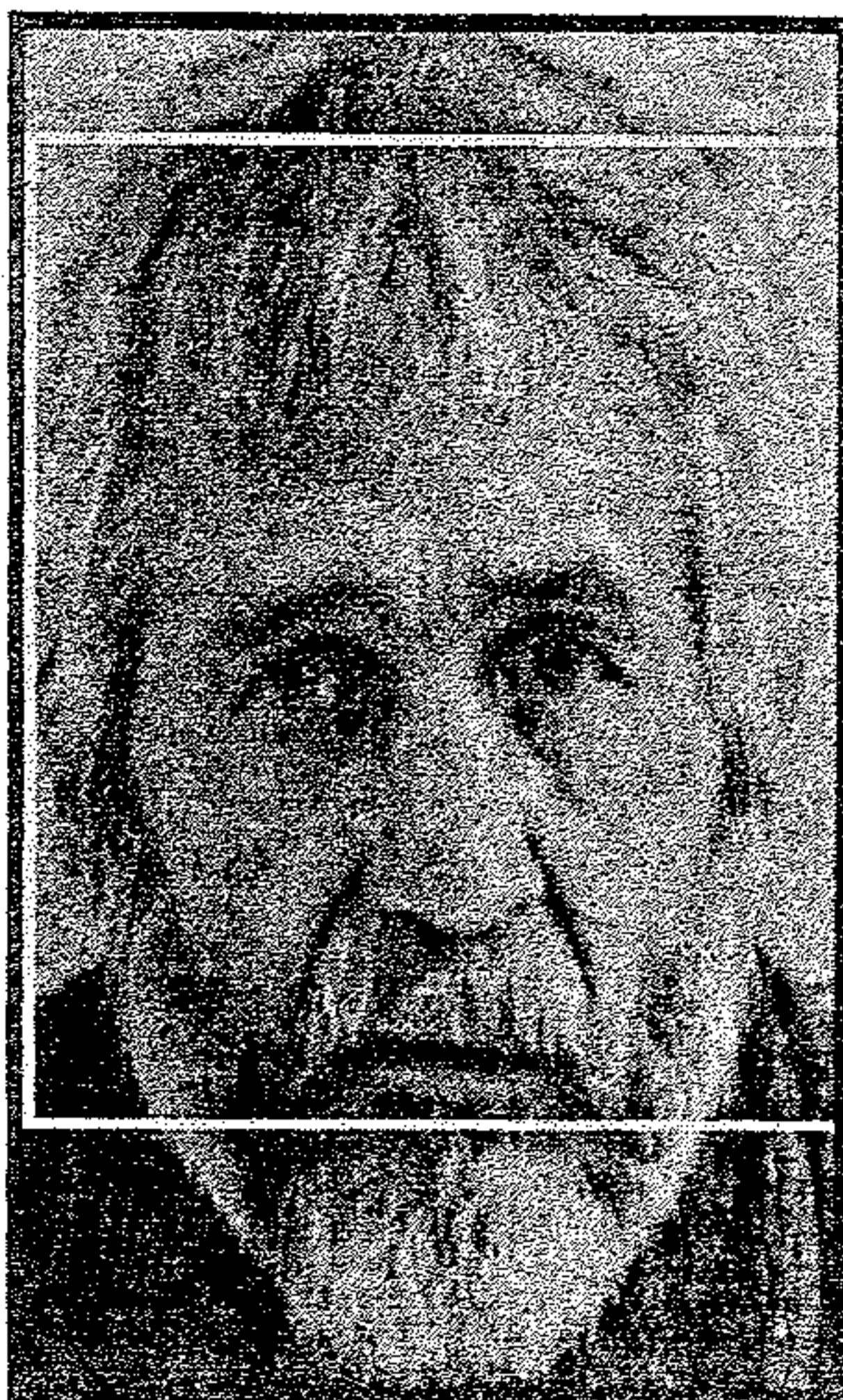
She has friends in Loudon County and possibly Campbell County.
