

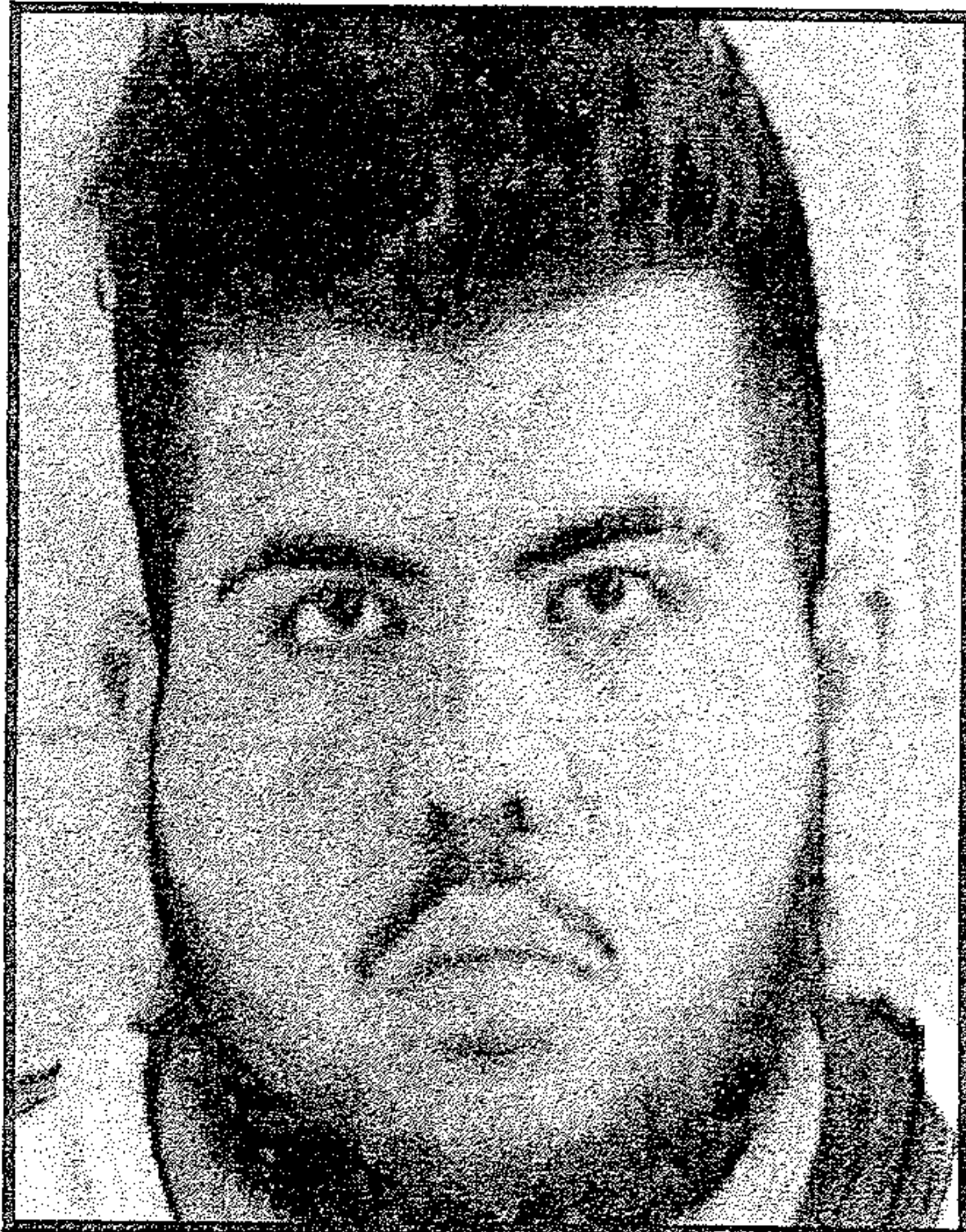

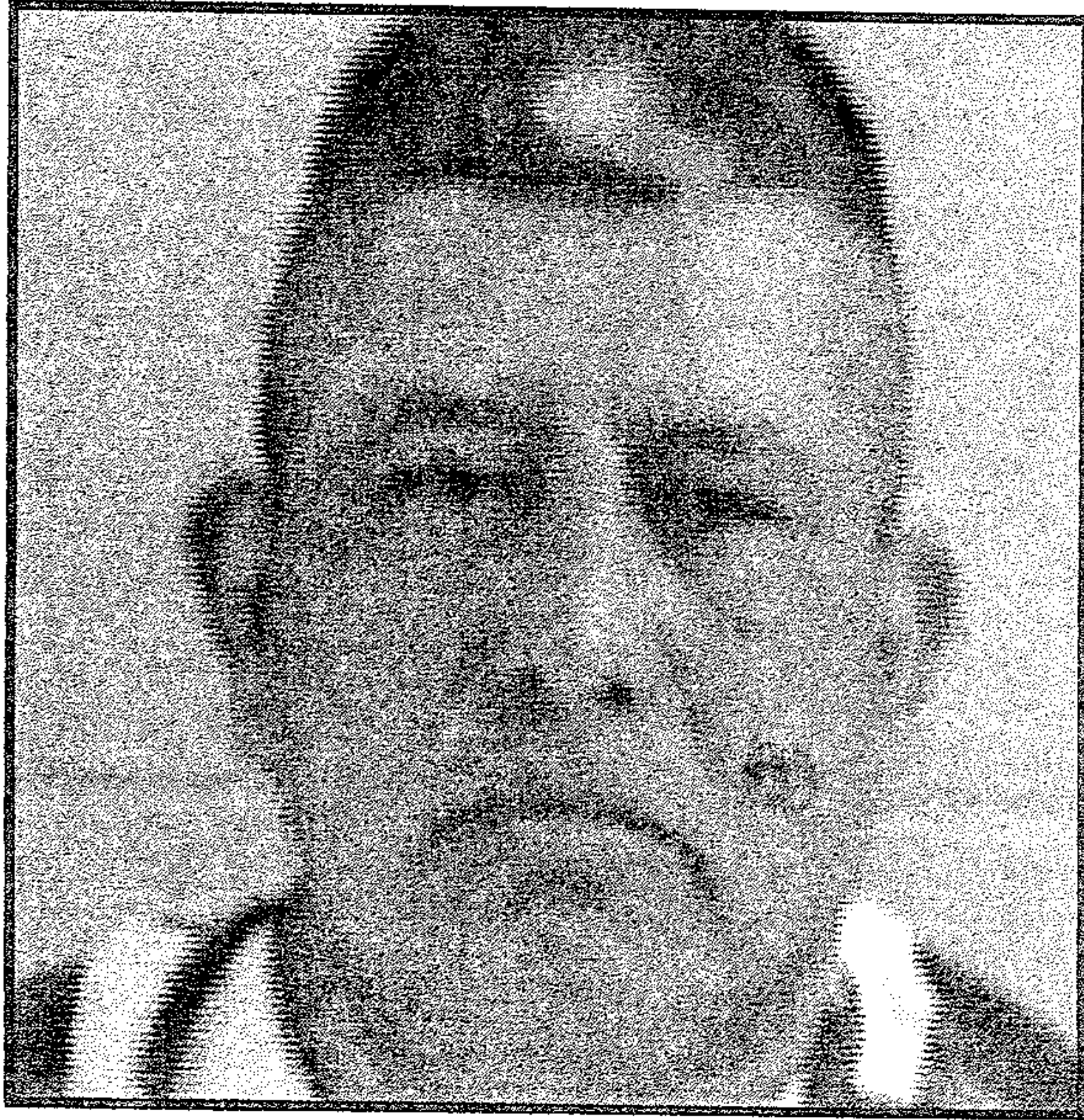

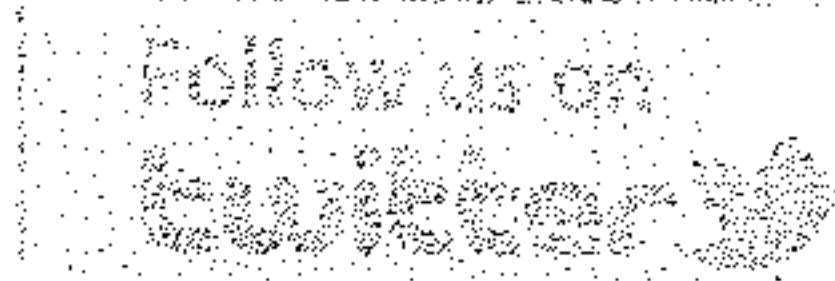
Tampa Man Sentenced After Threatening to Burn a House Down

Marco Munzo, 24, Church Street Loudon, was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

Officer Trey Clemmer LPD, was driving down Maremont Parkway when

he noticed a vehicle parked at Maremont Parkway at the Westside Terrace apartments with the back left door opened. Officer pulled in the parking lot to observe the vehicle as he came to the vehicle he smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage and marijuana and seen that the vehicle was occupied by a couple of



Deputy Spradlin LCSO, along with Deputy Parton, was dispatched to Maple Hill Rd. In reference to a do-

nicated criticisms that hurt members. Frequently, we recall our pain, but are unaware of pain we cause.

Isolating this passage's painful reproving and excommunicating instructions from this chapter's wider context risks missing Jesus' overall loving message. In previous verses, Jesus says the "greatest" have child-like humility, warns against being stumbling blocks or sinning, and tells the Lost Sheep parable about God's unrelenting efforts to reunite each sheep with the flock. In the verses following today's reading, Jesus says to forgive limitlessly and he shares the Unforgiving Servant parable that teaches how God forgives us infinitely more than we forgive our neighbors. Today's reading instructs us to communicate our concerns -- but for the purpose of loving reconciliation. If reconciliation fails, God keeps calling -- just as Jesus lovingly remained in community with Gentiles and tax collectors. Prayer: Forgiving God, we praise and thank you for continuously calling us to return to you each time we stray. Please be merciful with us when we are too quick to reprove and too slow to forgive. Guide our communication so that we lovingly reconcile with our neighbors. Amen.

marijuana. Mr. Marin told him that he had smoked about 2 grams all day and that Marco Munoz gave him a couple of sips of beer. Officer asked Mr. Munoz (the driver of the vehicle) how much he had to drink tonight and he told him that he had only one. Mr. Munoz had slurred speech and bloodshot eyes and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breathe. Marco Munoz was placed under arrest for contributing to the delinquency of a minor, Gerardo Marin was placed under arrest for underage consumption, and both subjects were also charge with public intoxication.

desired location, and the right to sell that home—was under attack. And it was under attack by a neighbor who didn't like the religious beliefs of the buyers.

The FBI—the primary federal agency responsible for investigating allegations of federal civil rights violations—ultimately became involved. And this past June, that neighbor—59-year-old David H. Howard—was sentenced to a federal prison term for violating the civil rights of both buyer and seller.

According to Tampa FBI case agent Susana Mapu, the incident occurred in November 2016, when “a Muslim couple originally from India—the husband wearing a woven cap often worn by Muslim men, and both wearing traditional Indian clothing—arrived for their final walk-through at the Tampa home they planned to purchase the following day.” She said that the buyers had worn similar clothing during several earlier visits to look at the home, and that for that final inspection visit, the

couple—who had two college-age children—was accompanied by the wife's elderly parents.

Also present during the walk-through were the sellers and their two adult children, two realtors, movers, and a cleaning person.

Not long after the buyers got there, Howard left his nearby home and walked toward the sellers' home, angrily yelling at the sellers about the potential buyers. He threatened—twice—to break all the windows in the house and then burn it down. And he pointedly told the buyers, “You are not welcome here!”

Said Mapu, “The husband and wife, along with the wife's elderly parents, hurried back to their car and quickly drove away. And the seller went inside to calm his upset family.” And the following day, according to Mapu, the buyers canceled the closing on the house.

During the incident, one of the realtors present had called 911. Local

authorities quickly responded, but by the time they arrived, Howard had already returned to his own home. In the days that followed, Howard recounted his version of what happened to other neighbors.

But that wasn't the end. Allegations made their way to the U.S. Attorney's Office in the Middle District of Florida, and the FBI began looking into the incident.

Original FBI Tampa case agent Maritza Conde-Vazquez, since reassigned to the Bureau's Civil Rights Unit in Washington, D.C., said, “It appeared that both buyers and sellers were considered victims under the Fair Housing part of the Civil Rights Act, so we opened an investigation in early 2017.”

With the victims and plenty of other

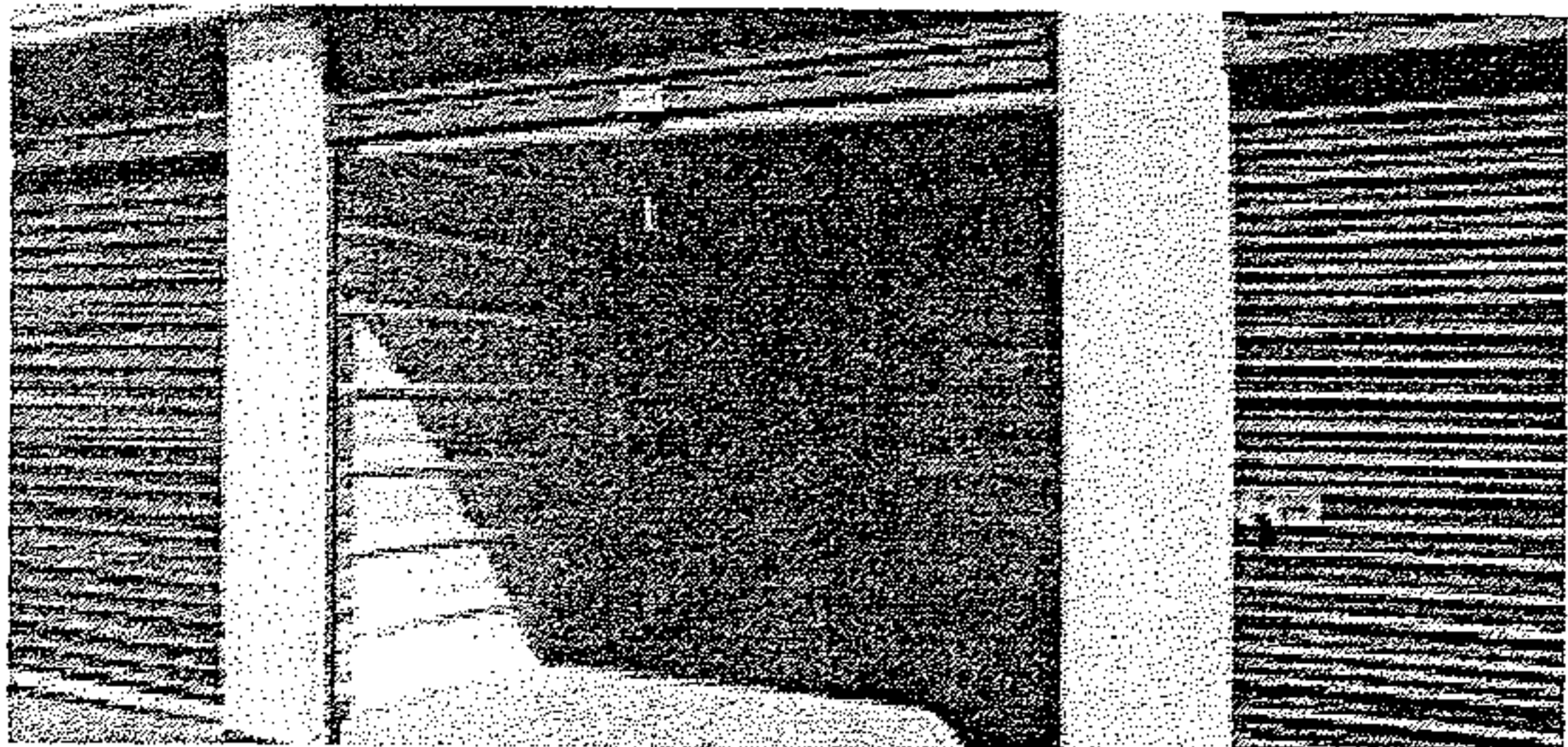

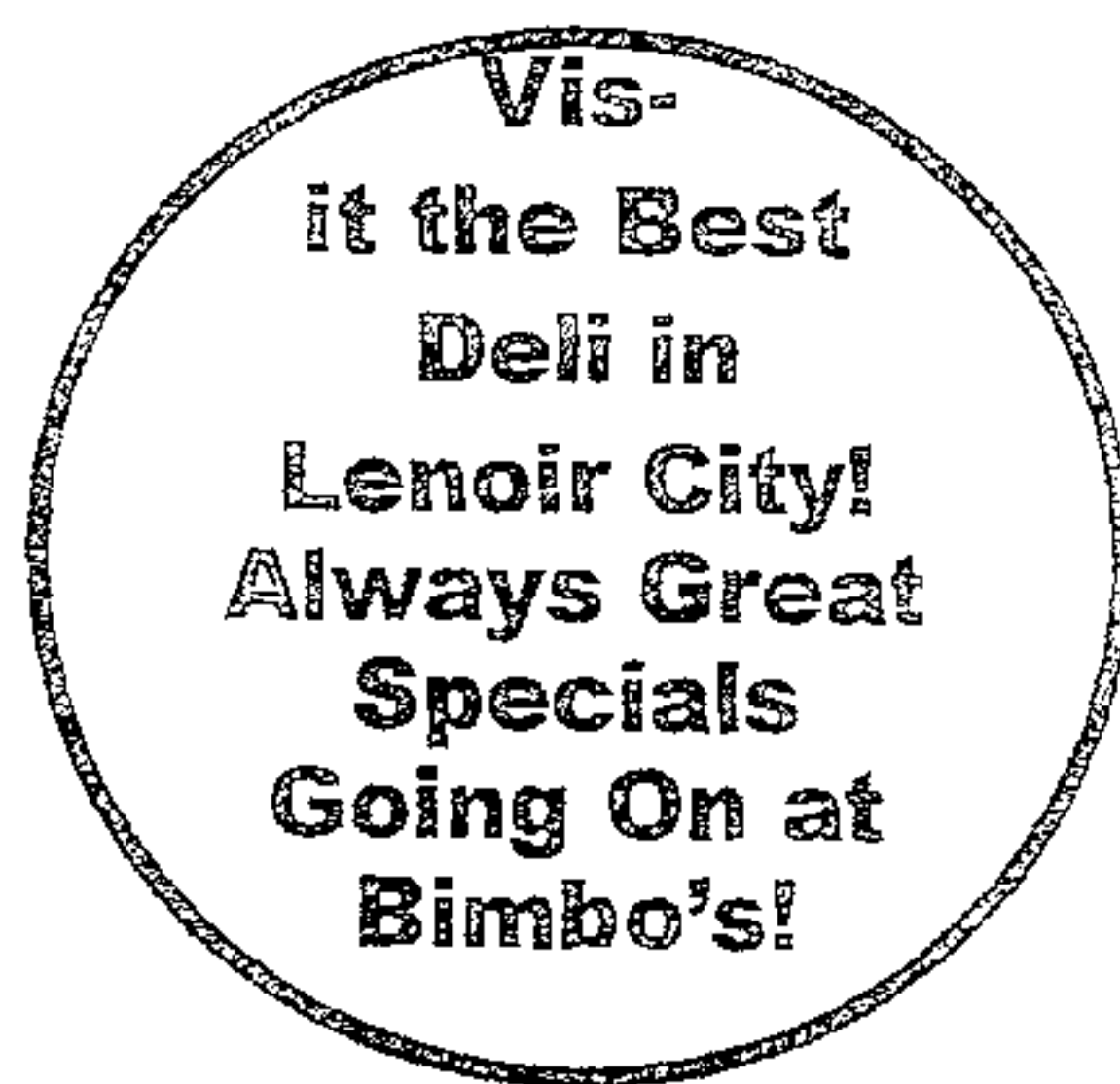
willing witnesses, investigators were able to piece together what had happened, and Howard was eventually charged with interfering with housing rights. "He pleaded guilty in February 2018," according to Mapu, "acknowledging that the only reason he threatened the buyers was because they were Muslim."

In addition to his federal prison sentence in May 2018, Howard was ordered to pay \$30,000 in restitu-

tion and told that, after he serves his sentence, he will be subjected to two years of supervised release.

"Nobody has the right to interfere with any person's right to buy or sell a house based on the buyers' race, color, religion, gender, national original, disability, or familial status," said Conde-Vazquez. "As an investigator, there is no greater feeling than restoring victims' perceptions of justice. And in this case, I believe we did that not only for victims, but also for the entire neighborhood."

She added, "Neighbors and other witnesses came forward when they saw an injustice, and they trusted the FBI to conduct a fair investigation with respect and compassion."
