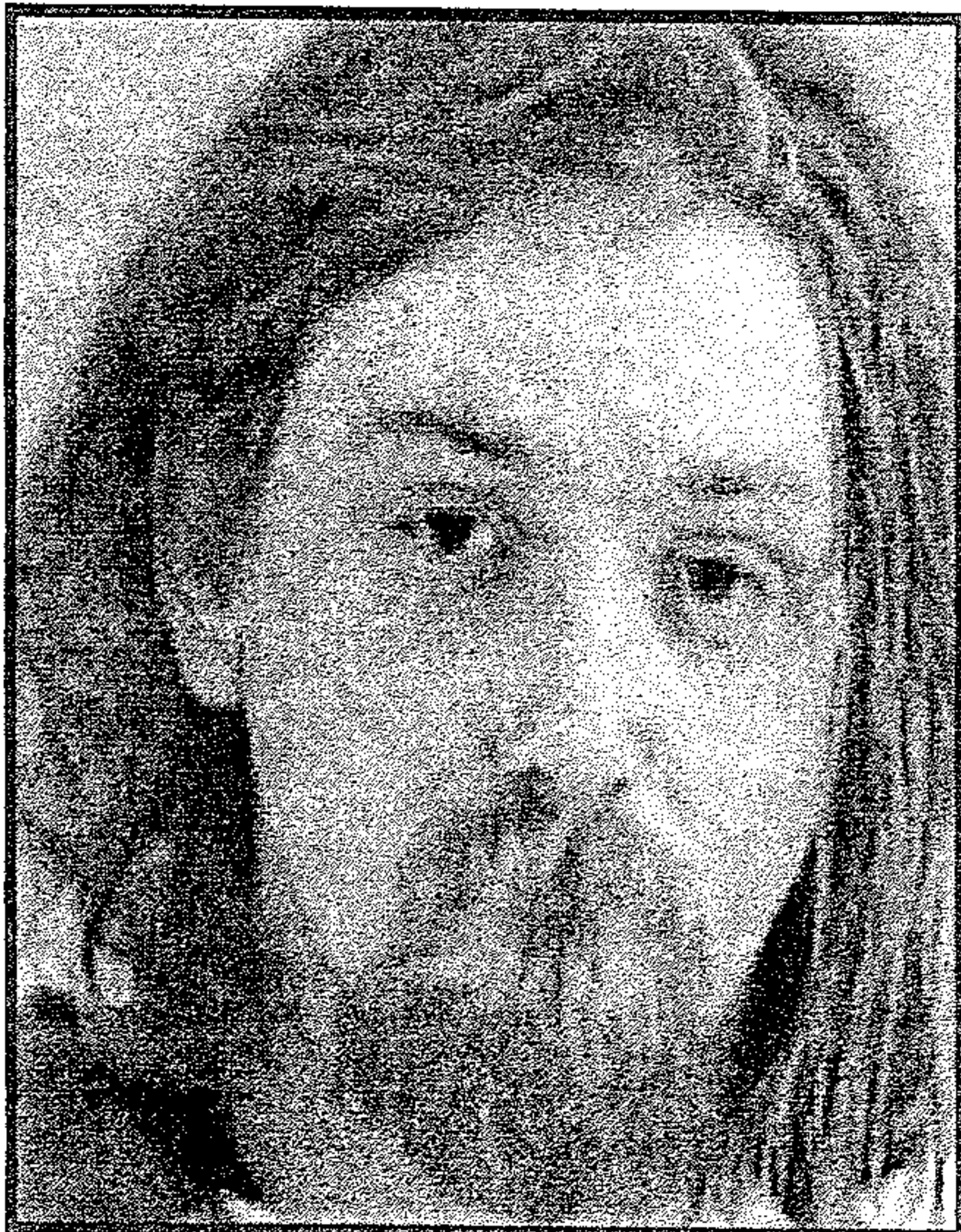

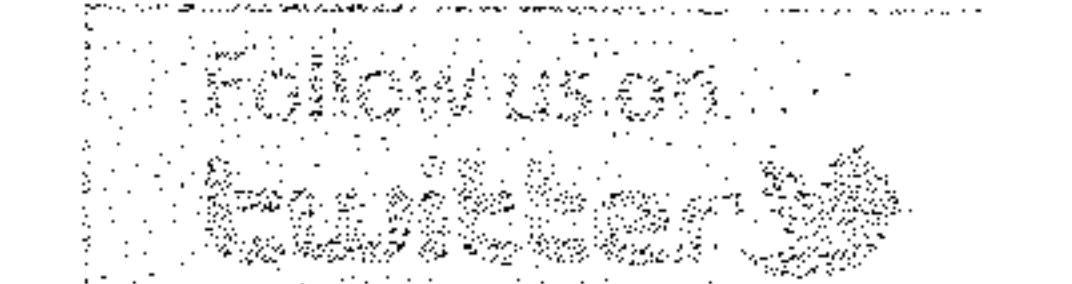
Free Cyber Safety Program Launches with Spanish Version for 2018-19 School Year

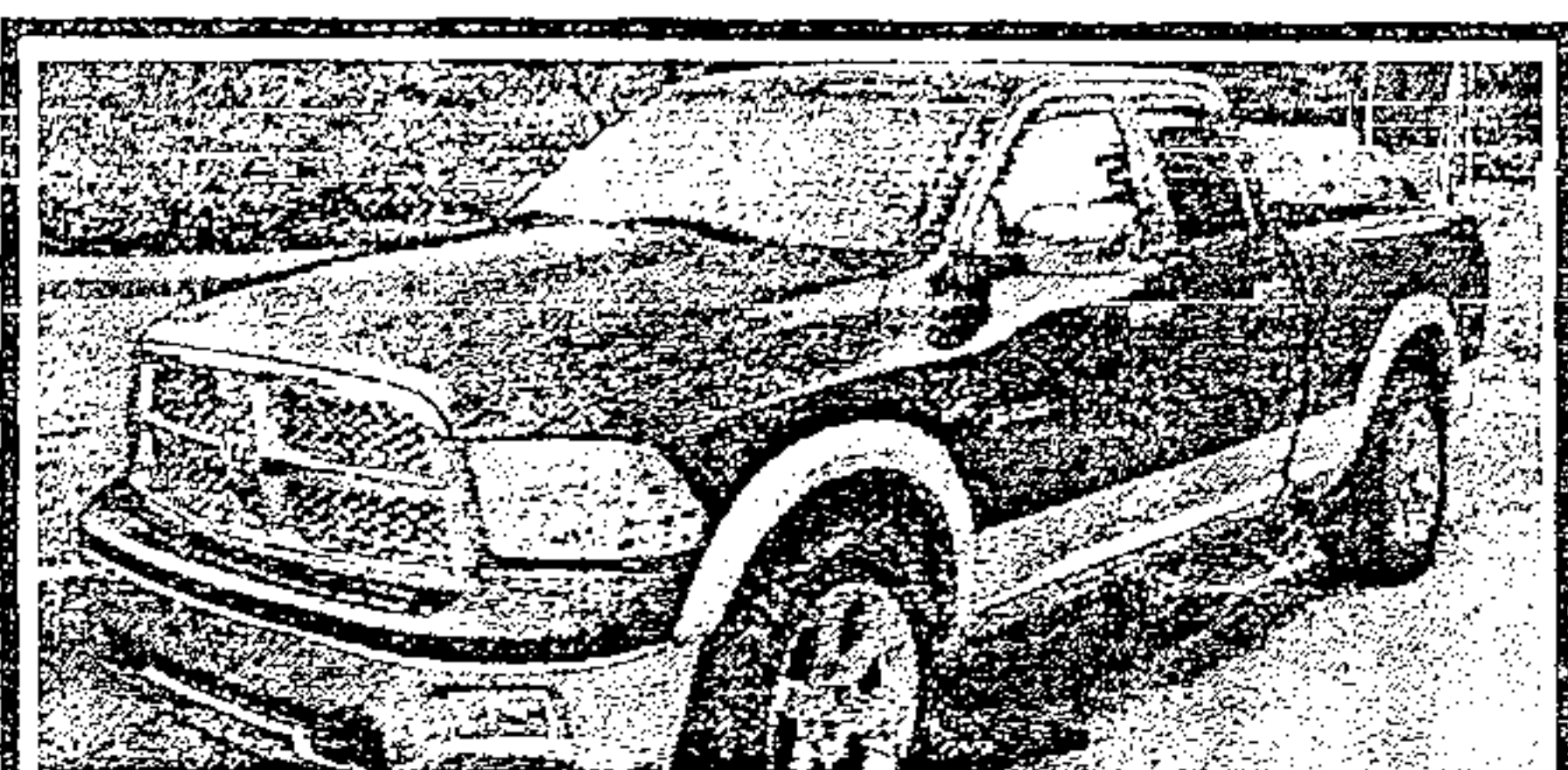

DUI

Jose Reyes-Zacarias, 33, Broadway Street Dayton, was charged with DUI, and Driving without a Valid License.

Corporal Smith LCSO, observed a white Ford F150 traveling south on interstate 75 in Loudon

County. Deputy observed the vehicle cross the white fog line, swerve very erratically then continued south driving on the shoulder. Deputy activated the emergency lights on his patrol vehicle to stop the vehicle and the vehicle contin-

ued south. Deputy then activated the emergency siren to get the vehicle to stop, he observed the driver throw a unknown object into the back seat and then pull over to the right side of the road. Deputy made contact with the driver and identified him to be Mr. Jose Alfonso Reyes-Zacarias. While speaking with the suspect Deputy noticed a strong smell of alcohol coming from inside the vehicle and the suspects eyes were glassy and blood shot. Deputy asked the suspect how much he had to drink and he stated two beers. Deputy ordered the suspect out of the vehicle and he noticed he was unsteady while walking. A check of the suspects name, date of birth he was found to be unlicensed. Deputy asked the suspect if he perform standardized field sobriety tasks and he stated yes. While attempting standardized field sobriety tasks the suspect was unable to follow instructions, then stated he did not speak English. Deputy then placed the suspect in custody for driving under the influence. Upon inventory of the vehicle Deputy observed several empty Modelo beer cans, four that were full and one in the back seat that was half empty. Once at the Loudon County Jail Deputy did read the suspect the Tennessee implied consent form and he did refuse to give a breath sample.

Deputy was dispatched to Spring St. again in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Mr. Jarred Sims who stated that he and his wife got into an argument over the kitten being accidentally killed. Mr. Sims stated this time the argument turned into a physical altercation, but he did not know when he got hit. Deputy did observe several scratch marks on his neck, arms, and on his upper back. Deputy asked Mr. Sims if his wife caused him physical harm and he stated no. Mr. Sims stated further that it was all his fault.

Deputy Akins Made contact with Mrs. Sims walking down the road, and he transported her back to the scene. Upon talking with Mrs. Sims she stated that she caused the altercation between the spouses this time, and that she did not want him to go to jail. Deputy asked Mrs. Sims if Mr. Sims hit her and she stated that he did not. Mrs. Sims stated that she had a swollen upper lip. Deputy did observe her upper lip to be swollen and busted. Both parties involved stated that they initiated the argument, and no primary aggressor could be determined. Based on the totality of the circumstances both were placed under arrest. All occurred in Loudon County T. N.

protecting personal information, recognizing trustworthy and untrustworthy sites, and avoiding malware through age-appropriate activities. Students visit the island that aligns with their grade level and surf through activities that teach how to recognize hazards and respond appropriately. This year, for the first time, the entire curriculum is also available in Spanish.

“As young people spend more and more time online doing homework, gaming, and con-

necting to peers, it is critical that we teach them how to protect both their personal information and their well-being.” Jonathan Cox, unit chief, FBI Office of Public Affairs

The FBI-SOS Internet Challenge had a record level of participation during the 2017-2018 school year, with 906,104 students from schools in all 50 states, D.C., Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands completing the program.

In the 2017-2018 academic year, 15,153 schools completed the pro-

gram; Pennsylvania had the most students participating.

Since October 2012, the FBI-SOS website has been visited more than 3.5 million times, with a total of more than 9.2 million page views. “SOS provides age-tailored guidance for young students who are just learning to navigate the web all the way up to social media-savvy teens.”

SOS activities are available to everyone, but teachers must register their classes to participate in the tests and competition. Any public, private, or home school in the United States and

its territories with at least five students is eligible for the online challenge. Teachers manage their students’ participation in the program, and the FBI does not collect or store any student information. Each month during the school year, the classes with the top exam scores nationwide receive an FBI-SOS certificate and may be congratulated in person by local FBI personnel. Starring in a social media campaign, Mayor Glenn Jacobs touts the many resources of the library, which include information and assistance with job searches, market research, investing, and more.

As an English literature major in college, Mayor Jacobs is a voracious reader and a proponent of lifelong learning. The Library has more than 125,000 active cardholders and a collection of 1.36 million items. Books, movies, and music were checked out 2.7 million times last year.

Library cards are available to children, teens, and adults in Knox County at no cost. Residents

who do not live in Knox County can purchase an out-of-county card for \$40. Library cardholders can now check out up to 50 items at one time.
