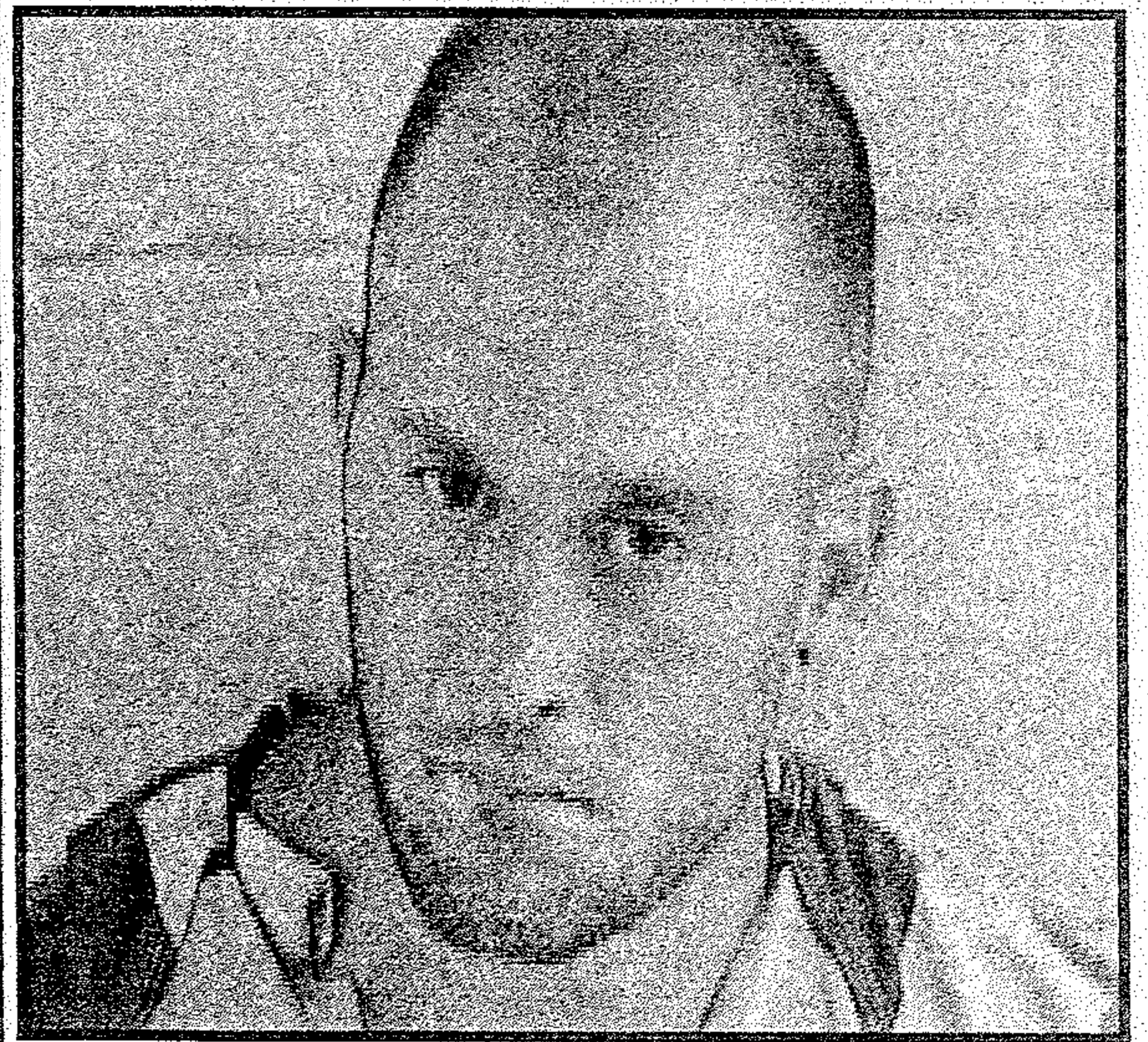

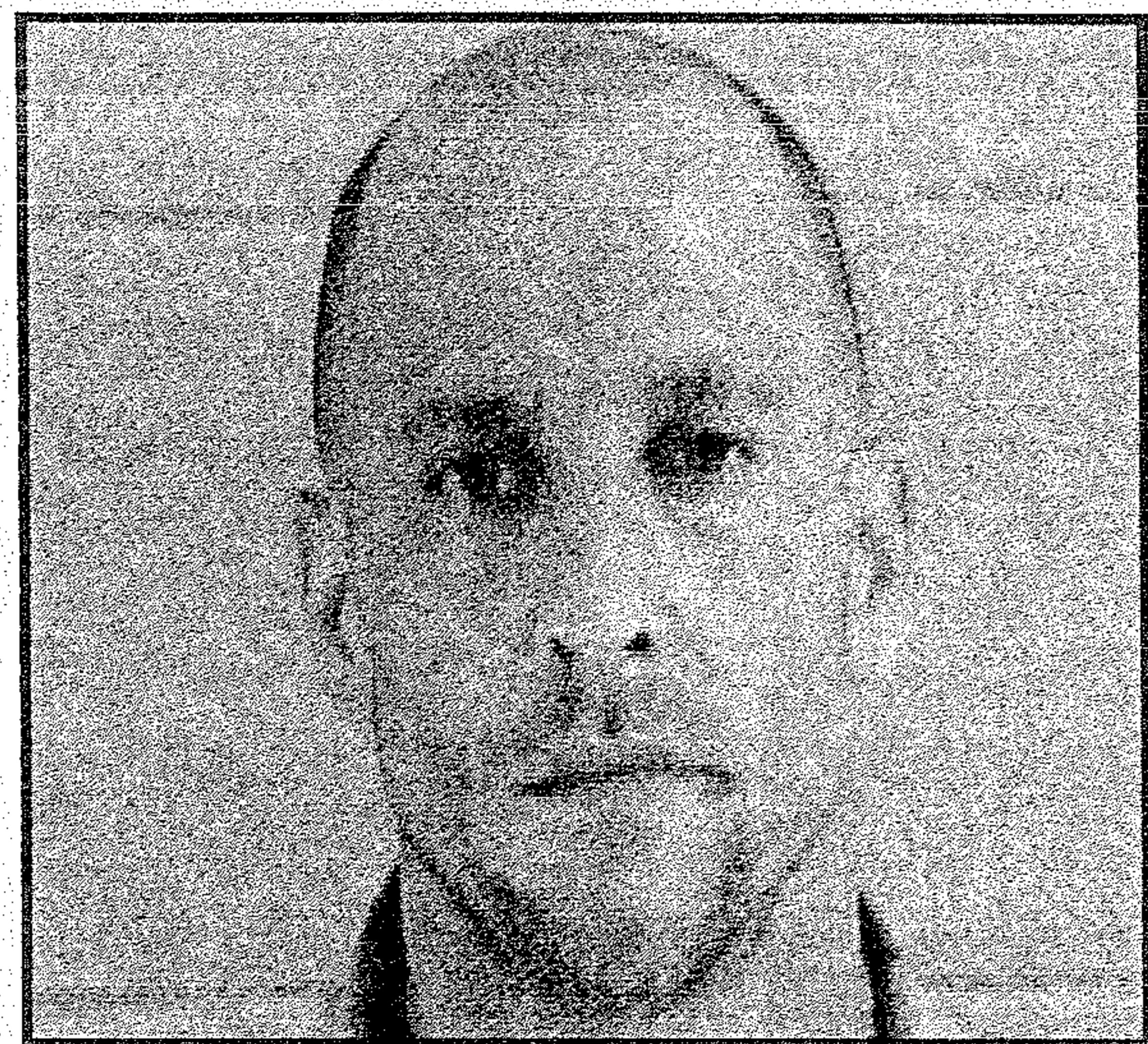

Ryan Peltz, 41, Hines Court Lenoir City, was charged with Contraband in a Penal Institution, and Disorderly Conduct. While on duty at the Justice Center Cpl. McGinley, observed Deputy Ferguson having trouble with a civilian Mr. Ryan

C. Peltz. Mr. Peltz was recording video with his cell phone on a tripod and was told by Deputy Ferguson and Cpl. that electronic devices were not allowed in the General Sessions Court area. Mr. Peltz was asked what kind of business he had at the Justice Center. Mr.

### Assault

Scott Rogers, 33, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault. Deputy C. Rogers LCSO, responded to Vonore for a Domestic. Deputy observed the front door open and

yelling coming from inside. Upon making entry Deputy observed Scott Rogers standing over the victim yelling at her. Rogers was given verbal command to step away which he did not comply. Deputy took Rogers

by the arm and he went limp and fell on the couch, at which time Rogers was detained. Deputy Pesterfield, Sartin and Sgt. Bowen arrived on scene. Deputy then spoke with the victim who stated they were arguing over his drug use. Scott Rogers did take half victims clonazepam. A check the bottle had been filled on Sep. 12 with 90 pills, a count of the pills only had 50 left. Deputy called EMS to check victim due to her injuries. Several clumps of hair were laying around and victim had several visible injuries to her face, neck, head, arms, and shoulder. Both parties were transported to the ER. The victim for her injuries and the defendant for possible overdose. Upon discharge victim called to make a report Detective Bowen arrived on scene at the ER and witnessed the injuries, victim did write a statement. Dec. C. Bowen issued warrants for Scott Rogers. Once released from the hospital Deputy T.J. Scarbrough made the arrest.

with Deputy's for a short time being loud making it uncomfortable for other civilians to enter the building to conduct their business. Deputy's backed away from Mr. Peltz leaving him in the vestibule on the outside of the metal detector. Approximately five minutes went by and Mr. Peltz had not said a word to anyone. Suddenly Mr. Peltz came through the metal detector without warning with his electronic device stating he had to use the bathroom. At this time Deputy Ferguson stood up and tried to stop Mr. Peltz by grabbing Mr. Peltz's arm. Mr. Peltz then pulled away from Deputy Ferguson and Deputy Ferguson put Mr. Peltz up against the wall to put Mr. Peltz into custody for Disorderly Conduct. Mr. Peltz was then walked around to the Loudon County Jail. In the pat down area of the jail Deputy Bengel was the pat down officer. During the pat down Mr. Peltz was asked if he had anything that would be considered contraband, drugs, weapons, knives, or anything that could injury the pat down officer. Mr. Peltz stated no. During a standard search of a inmate being searched upon entering the jail, Mr. Peltz was in possession of 12 sealed Suboxone strips without a prescription. Mr. Peltz was then charged with Contraband in Penal Institution. This did happen in Loudon County Tennessee.

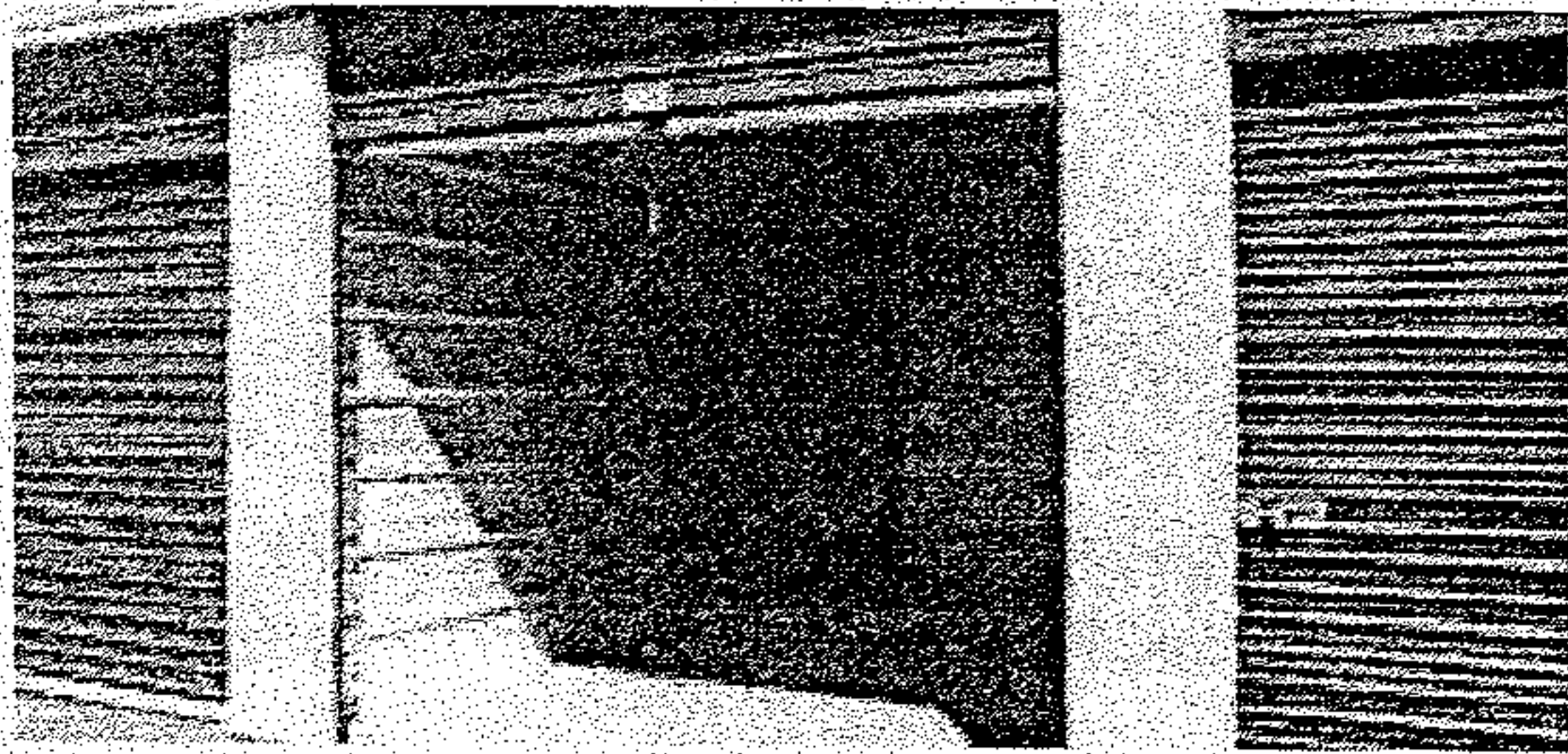



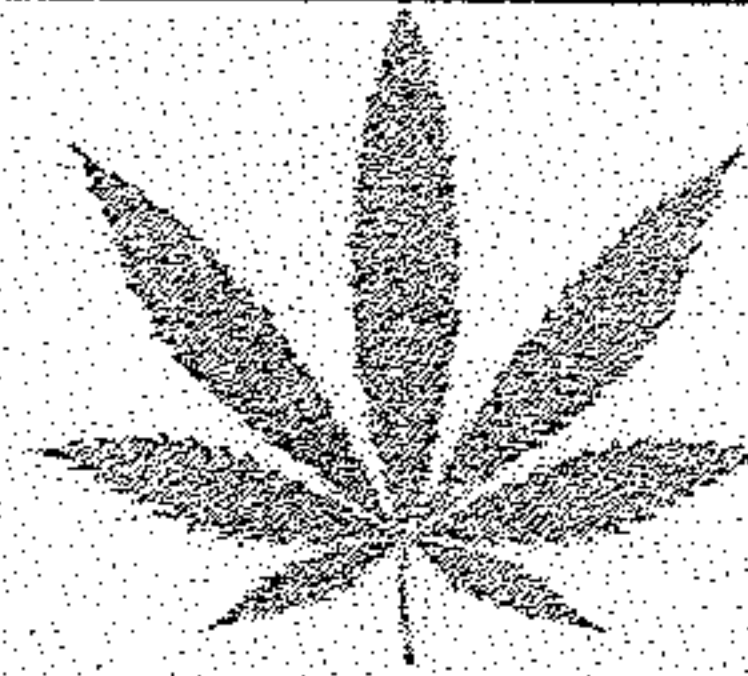
law demand such justice? Doesn't even death come as the final judgment on our
