way transportation. **METHODOLOGIES** Cybercriminals target employees through phishing emails designed to capture an employee's login credentials. Once the cybercriminal has

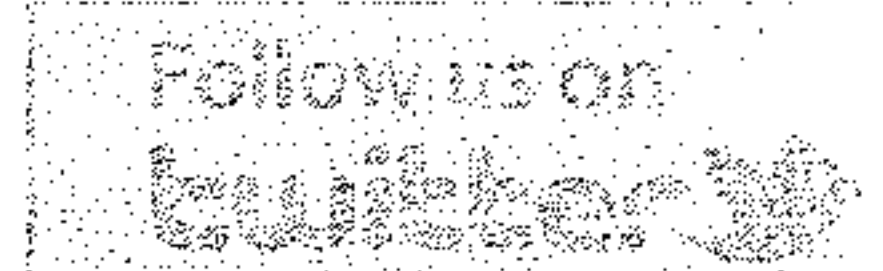



## Assault

Walter Russell, 45, Welch Avenue Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officer was dispatched, by the Loudon County 911 Center, to a physical domestic located at Welch Avenue. The 911 Center advised that the complainant had locked herself in a car

outside the residence. Upon arrival Officer made contact with victim who was indeed hiding in a vehicle, and Officer immediately noticed a large knot on her forehead. Victim advised that her husband of 23 years, Walter Earl Russell, had physically assaulted her and that he was still in the house. After making contact

and speaking with the involved parties and a witness, it was determined that Earl and victim got into a heated verbal argument, initially over the fact that victim now has a boyfriend. The argument became very physical between the two and a witness states that he/she saw Earl strike victim across the face. Victim advises that Earl threw her up against a wall and down on the floor. Victim advises at one point during the altercation that Earl had choked her by using his hands. She also states that he broke her phone and refused to leave the residence. This officer did notice miscellaneous broken items strewn throughout the living room, including a cell phone. This officer also noticed, in addition to the forehead knot, minor cuts on victim arms and legs, as well as redness to her neck area. Earl had several scratches on his upper torso, around his neck and had a knot/cut to the left side of his

head. Victi admits to hitting Earl with something during the altercation while trying to defend herself. This officer feels Earl was the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest for Assault by Domestic Violence and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. It should also be noted that law enforcement is familiar with this residence and with Earl Russell, as this is not our first domestic situation involving him. Said actions did occur on 09-18-2018 in the City of Loudon.

Courtney's boyfriend, was able to get Courtney separated from everyone and fled the scene with her. Based on witness's statements it was determined Courtney was the primary aggressor. At the time of this report Courtney is not in custody. All occurred in Loudon County, TN. The cousin was transported to Blount Memorial Hospital as a precaution due to her being four months pregnant.

obtained an employee's credentials, the credentials are used to access the employee's payroll account in order to change their bank account information. Rules are added by the cybercriminal to the employee's account preventing the employee from receiving alerts regarding direct deposit changes. Direct deposits are then changed and redirected to an account controlled by the cybercriminal, which is often a pre-paid card.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

To mitigate the

threat of payroll diversion:

-Alert and educate your workforce about this scheme, including preventative strategies and appropriate reactive measures should a breach occur.

-Instruct employees to hover their cursor over hyperlinks included in emails they receive to view the actual URL. Ensure the URL is actually related to or associated with the company it purports to be from.

-Instruct employees to refrain from supplying log-in credentials or personally identifying

information in response to any email.

-Direct employees to forward suspicious requests for personal information to the information technology or human resources department.

-Ensure that log-in credentials used for payroll purposes differ from those used for other purposes, such as employee surveys.

-Apply heightened scrutiny to bank information initiated by employees seeking to update or change direct deposit credentials.

-Monitor employee logins that occur outside normal business hours.

-Restrict access to the Internet on systems handling sensitive information or implement two-factor authentication for access to sensitive systems and information.

-Only allow required processes to run on systems han-

dling sensitive information.

Prayer: Dear Lord, guide us in ways of wisdom and help us to not be afraid to ask for help and wisdom when we need it. In Jesus' name. Amen.

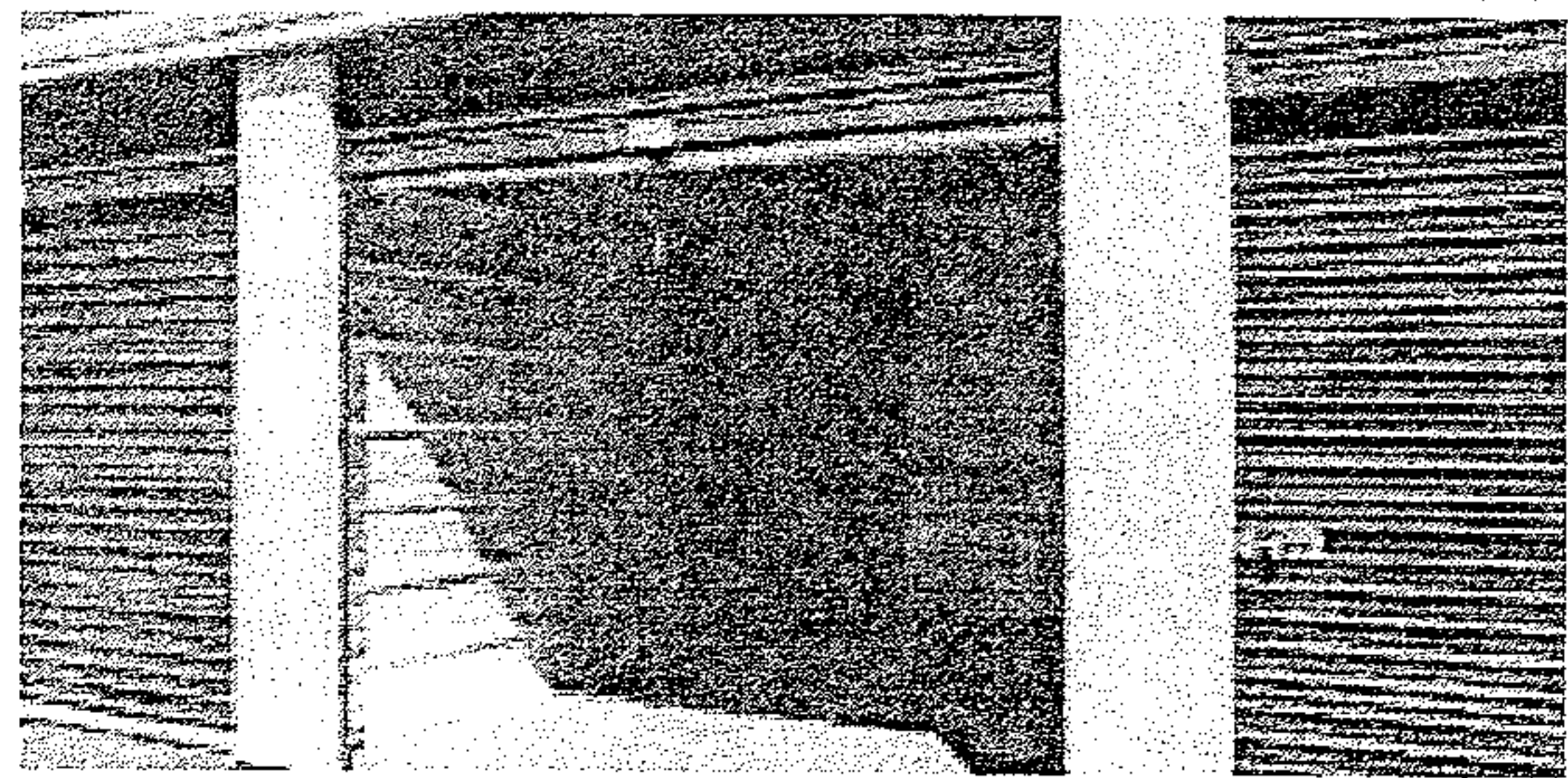

Richard Brotherton, 43, Corinth Church Road Loudon, was charged with Misuse of 911 Emergency System.

Deputy Kirkland LCSO, was dispatched to Corinth Church Rd. in reference to an unwanted guest. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Mr. Richard Brotherton (Offender) who stated that someone was on his back porch trying to get in his house. After checking the residence it was determined that no one was at the house. Mr. Brotherton was not making sense about who was at his house or what they were doing nor could he give a description of the person, and appeared to be under the influence of drugs. Deputy left his residence at approximately 1223 hours and Mr. Brotherton called 911 again at approximately 1236 hours.


Mr. Brotherton told dispatch the second time that there was a male and female trying to steal his radio out of his vehicle. He also told dispatch he could see them in the front and the back porch. Upon arrival Deputy saw Mr. Brotherton inside his vehicle and he told me the subjects had ran to the back. After checking the area and the residence again it was determined there was no one at his residence. Deputy explained to Mr. Brotherton about when to call 911 and when not to call 911, and he stated that he was

not on any drugs except for his anti-depressants, and that he had been up all night and day and he needed some sleep. Deputy also explained to Mr. Brotherton that if he dialed 911 again and it was not an emergency that he would go to jail for mis-use of 911. Mr. Brotherton stated that he understood and he would not call again unless it was an absolute emergency. At approximately 1402 hours Mr. Brotherton called 911 again and stated that there was someone in his mother's bedroom having sex. Upon

arrival Mr. Brotherton met Deputy outside and stated they were in the bedroom, or on the roof, or in the basement. After checking the residence again it was de-

termined that there was no one in the residence and Mr. Brotherton was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail for mis use of 911.
