Assault

Walter Russell, 45, Welch Avenue Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officer was patched, by the Loudon County 911 Center, to a physical domestic located at Welch Avenue. The 911 Center advised that the complainant had locked herself in a car

outside the residence. Upon arrival Officer made contact with victim who was indeed hiding in a vehicle, and Officer immediately noticed a large knot on her forehead. Victim advised that her husband of 23 years, Walter Earl Russell, had physically assaulted her and that he was still in the house. After making contact

and speaking with the involved parties and a witness, it was determined that Earl and victim got into a heated verbal argument, initially over the fact that victim now has a boyfriend. The argument became very physical between the two and a witness states that he/she saw Earl strike victim across the face. Victim advises that Earl threw her up against a wall and down on the floor. Victim advises at one point during the altercation that Earl had choked her by using his hands. She also states that he broke her phone and refused to leave the residence. This officer did notice miscellaneous broken items strewn throughout the living room, including a cell phone. This officer also noticed, in addition to the forehead knot, minor cuts on victim arms and legs, as well as redness to her neck area. Earl had several scratches on his upper torso, around his neck and had a knot/cut

to the left side of his

head. Victi admits to hitting Earl with something during the altercation while trying to defend herself. This officer feels Earl was the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest for Assault by Domestic Violence and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. It should also be noted that law enforcement is familiar with this residence and with Earl Russell, as this is not our first domestic situation involving him. Said actions did occur on 09-18-2018 in the City of Loudon.

Courtney's boyfriend, was able to get Courtney separated from everyone and fled the scene with her. Based on witness's statements it was determined Courtney was the primary aggressor. At the time of this report Courtney is not in custody. All occurred in Loudon County, TN. The cousin was transported to Blount Memorial Hospital as a precaution due to her being four months pregnant.
