The passenger was identified as Candice Russell (Devaney). Mr. Brown had pin point pupils and glassy eyes. Officer asked Mr. Brown if he had anything illegal on him or in the vehicle and he stated he had some syringes. Officer asked Ms. Russell if

he could search her vehicle and she agreed. Officer asked Ms. Russell if she had anything illegal on her and she retrieved 2 bags of syringes from her bra. In plain view in the driver floor board was an uncapped syringe. Upon searching the vehicle found in the above sun-glass compartment was

a baggy with 1.06 grams of Crystal Methamphetamine. Found in the back seat in a false coke can were (26 1/2) orange pills with imprint 30b974 (Amphetamine), (7) white pills with imprint 54733 (Morphine), (19) blue pills with imprint C1 (Clonazepam). Found in the center console area was approximately 42 baggies. Found in the passenger seat floor board was a loaded Charter Arms 38 special. Found on the ankle of Mr. Brown was an Allen ankle holster. Mr. Brown is a convicted felon. Miranda rights were read to both Mr. Brown and Ms. Russell and both agreed to talk. Mr. Brown took ownership of the Meth and Ms. Russell took ownership of the pills. Ms. Russell was also found to have a warrant out of Loudon County. Randall Brown and Candice Russell were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Mr. Brown was then interviewed by Agent DeBoer and Officer. Mr. Brown stated that he bought the pistol for 300.00 to flip and described the pistol. This did happen in Lenoir City, TN.

Theft

Daniel Poe, 31, Ferry Street Loudon, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Theft of Property, and Violation of Probation x2. Officer Fritts LCPD, was dispatched to Walmart in reference to a male shoplifting. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Daniel Poe at the Loss Prevention Office. Poe took an Xbox controller and Xbox charger out of its packaging and put them in his pocket. Poe then exited the store with out paying, and was confronted by Loss Prevention. While Officer was walking to the parking lot with Poe he observed Poe reach in his left pocket with his left hand and then ball his fist up. Officer ask Poe to open his hand and there were 2 baggies of a crystal like substance believed to be Crystal Meth 1.18 grams. Upon running Poe through dispatch he was found to have one warrant out of Lenoir City and one out of General Session. Poe was transported to the Loudon Jail.

The Tennessee State Library and Archives is pleased to announce that starting today, Tennesseans will have free online access to the full run of The Tennessean (1812 to today) through the Tennessee Electronic Library (TEL).

Previously, Tennesseans were only able to access full-text articles from The Tennessean back to 2002. With the addition of the historical Tennessean, Tennessee residents will be able to search and view news articles, photos, advertisements, classified ads, obituaries and cartoons from 1812 to 2002. The Tennessean began in publication 1907 but this service includes earlier titles such as the Nashville Whig and the Daily American. These papers reported not only Nashville-area news, but carried stories from around the state and the nation.

viding access to electronic resources to libraries, schools and Tennesseans since 1999 in order to enhance the quality of their everyday lives, the depth of their educational experience, and the economic prosperity of their communities. TEL is administered by the Tennessee State Library and Archives, a division of the Tennessee Secretary of State's office.

"By providing access to The Tennessean through TEL, we will greatly enhance access to first-hand accounts of Tennessee history as it unfolded," Tennessee Secretary of State Tre Hargett said. "Libraries and newspapers keep the pulse and record of the state; both are essential to quality information and research in our communities."

"Online access to Nashville newspapers from 1812 to the present will be a great asset for students and everyone who enjoys history," notes State Librarian and Archivist Chuck Sherrill. "Until now, newspapers have been virtually unsearchable unless one knew the date of an event. And access was limited to those that were able to come to the State Library through onsite

microfilm readers and library computers. Now everyone can search these files from any computer in the state".

January 09, 2019, Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP) Chattanooga Interdiction Plus (IP) Trooper Jason Boles stopped a vehicle on I-24 in Marion County for several traffic violations. The driver was slow to yield to the troopers blue lights and siren as he exited the interstate at mile marker 152. The vehicle pulled into a parking lot off Hwy 72 where it stopped briefly. The driver fled the stop at a high rate of speed. Trooper Boles and IP Trooper Rich Thomas pursued the fleeing vehicle. The pursuit ended a short

time later after the suspect vehicle exited the roadway and crashed.

After the suspect was taken into custody, the driver gave a false name, date of birth and refused to cooperate with the troopers. Sergeant Matt Minter of THP's Criminal Investigation Division (CID) was called to the scene. Sergeant Minter conducted interviews with the vehicles other three occupants. Through the investigation CID was able to identify the fleeing suspect as Bradley Gaines, 30, of Phoenix, Arizona. Gaines is a wanted

fugitive from Phoenix, Arizona where he is wanted for two Counts of Molestation of a Child.

Gaines was arrested without incident on the felony Arizona warrants and charged from with Felony Evading, Reckless Driving, three counts of Felony Aggravated Assault, Felony Reckless Endangerment, No Driver's License, Criminal Impersonation, Fugitive from Justice, and several other traffic offenses.
