Brett Gerth, 23, Homeless, was charged with DUI, Theft, Evading Arrest x2, Reckless Endangerment, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer Jordan Samuels LCPD (Affiant), was dispatched to Weigel's at Hwy 70 in reference to

a stolen vehicle. Upon arrival your Affiant observed the vehicle (2004 black Dodge truck) near the gas pumps in the parking lot driven by a male who was later identified as Brett Gerth. Your Affiant then got behind the vehicle and observed the vehicle fail to stop

at the stop sign then turn right onto Hwy 321 South. Your Affiant then attempted to initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle by activating his lights and sirens on his patrol vehicle at which time the vehicle began to

your Affiant was able to get the TN registration (2J8-3A5) of the fleeing vehicle at which time dispatch confirmed it to be stolen from Knox County. During pursuit your Affiant observed the defendant to recklessly engage in conduct that placed or

may place another person in imminent danger of death or serious bodily injury. During pursuit your Affiant was terminated at Hwy 321 S. at Medical Park Drive, your Affiant then terminated, and observed the vehicle wreck in the parking lot of Aspen Dental. Your Affiant then went to the wreck

scene and was unable to locate the defendant. Your Affiant then pursued the defendant on foot and located him near ORNL bank. Your Affiant then placed the defendant into custody. During investigation it was determined that the defendant was currently revoked for DUI since 9-9-14. Your Affiant then conducted a vehicle inventory at which time he located a syringe in the right floor board of the vehicle the defendant was driving. The defendant was then transported to the jail by Officer Dragon. Once at the jail your Affiant attempted to administer field sobriety at which time the defendant refused tasks and freely informed your Affiant that he took Suboxone and 3-4 points of methamphetamine approximately 20 minutes before your Affiant made contact.

James Cook, 45, Elm Grove Street Loudon, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Officer S. Runyan LCPD, was dispatched to the area of Hwy 321 and the crossroads to a reckless driver call in which complainant stated he had observed this vehicle traveling South Bound on Hwy 321 all over the roadway, then pull into the Loves Truck stop exit his vehicle and enter a Gold colored vehicle in the passenger seat. This male described a white male dressed in black shirt and black jeans got back into his vehicle and left now traveling North Bound on Hwy 321 back towards the city. Complainant was advised to turn his flashers so that Officer could locate him and the suspect vehicle. Officer made contact with vehicle who turned onto white wing headed towards 70 and conducted traffic stop. Driver Identified as James Brewster Cook, was ran through NCIC and came back Revoked for DUI latest entry 09-06-2018 for Driving on Revoked, financial responsibility in Loudon General Sessions court. During pat down of Mr. Cook Officer did locate a small clear plastic baggie containing what he believed to be Crystal Methamphetamine in his right front pants pocket which when weighed on scene was 1.0 grams. At this time Officer read Mr. Cook his Miranda Rights and he then invoked his rights. Mr. Cook was placed under arrest, Transported to the Loudon County Jail and vehicle towed from scene. Mr. Cook was charged with Felony possession of Meth, Driving on Revoked 2nd, and Financial Responsibility.

Farmers

Tennessee farmers looking to expand their markets and increase food safety by becoming Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) certified now have the opportunity to receive financial assistance from the Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA).

GAP certification allows producers to sell directly to more businesses and institutions with stringent food safety requirements, such as grocery stores or hospitals. These new opportunities allow producers to increase their income, and the certification helps to ensure food is safe and wholesome for specialty crops throughout Tennessee.

"We continue to look for ways to provide new opportunities to farmers," Agriculture Commissioner Jai Templeton said. "Mitigating the cost of GAP audits may help enable more

producers to become certified. Tennessee farmers provide safe, reliable food. An increase in GAP certified producers in the state will reinforce our reliability to businesses and consumers."

The application period closes Aug. 31, 2019. Qualified producers will have the opportunity to offset the cost of a GAP Certification inspection by being reimbursed 75% of the inspection cost up to \$750.

Funds are available on a first come, first served basis. Grant funds are available to producers only; warehouses and distributors may not apply.

SNAP

The Tennessee Department of Human Services has received guidance from the USDA Food and Nutrition Service that February SNAP benefits will be made available to current SNAP recipients.

What this means:

February benefits are expected to be delivered to the EBT cards of current SNAP recipients on or before January 20, 2019. This will be the only distribution of SNAP benefits until further notice.

Simplified Reporting and SNAP Renewal

If you are a SNAP recipient that has received notification to *renew* your SNAP benefits or to provide a simplified reporting

form, it is important that you provide the necessary information to DHS by *Monday, January 14, 2019* to ensure you receive SNAP benefits, if eligible, for February 2019.

If you have already submitted your needed documents for renewal or simplified reporting, no other action is necessary.

If you have not, you may upload your needed documents online at <https://apps.tn.gov/dhsaccess/>. Begin by logging on or creating an online DHS account and then follow the prompts to do a "Family Assistance File Upload." Documentation must be uploaded by *11:59 PM local time, Monday, January 14, 2019.*

If you are using a cell phone to access

the website, click on the section menu of the right-hand side under Section then look for Family Assistance File upload.

You may also submit your needed documents to your local DHS office. Offices in Davidson, Hamilton, Knox, Madison, Montgomery, Rutherford, Shelby, and Washington counties will be open until 6:30PM on Monday to receive simplified reporting forms and renewal documents.

If you are a SNAP recipient that is not due to submit a renewal application or simplified reporting form, no action is required at this time. If you have already submitted your renewal application or simplified reporting form, no further action is required at this time.
