tact with the subjects and identified them as Jessica Kittrell, and Brandon McFarland. Agents arrived on scene and spoke with Kittrell who's pants were unbuttoned. Kittrell stated she had a plastic bag down the front of her pants and it was giv-

en to her by the passenger. Agents retrieved a bag of crystal substance weighing 2.0 grams. Officer conducted a consent search of the vehicle and were able to locate under the passenger seat where McFarland was sitting a yellow bag containing 2 glass pipes used to smoke meth, and a plastic bag of

crystal substance weighing approx.. 4.0 grams. The crystal substance did test positive for meth. Both subjects were placed under arrest.

Assault

James Johnson, 51, Steekee Street Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault. Officer Jonathan Yates LPD, responded to a domestic violence call taking place at Steekee Street. Upon arrival Officer spoke with the victim, she stated that James had become angry and begun arguing with her. Victim stated that James then pulled a knife from the kitchen drawer and placed the knife to victim throat. Victim stated James threaten to kill her also while displaying the weapon to her throat. These action were corroborated by a third party who was present during the altercation. Officer spoke with James who did state while angry he did pull a knife on victim but did not intent to harm her. James Johnson was placed under arrest.

Morgan County Correctional Achieves ACA Reaccreditation

The Tennessee Department of Correction (TDOC) is pleased to announce that one of the department's East Tennessee facilities has earned reaccreditation by the American Correctional Association (ACA). During the audit, which was held in the fall, Morgan County Correctional Complex (MCCX) received a high score of 100% on the mandatory standards and 99.8% on the non-mandatory standards.

According to Warden Mike Parris (pictured right) this audit shows just how hard the MCCX correctional professionals work. He states, "Day in and day out the officers and staff of MCCX give their best. I couldn't be more proud of them." TDOC Commissioner Tony Parker adds, "The vision of this department is to be recognized as the best correctional agency in the nation. Achieving

ACA reaccreditation speaks to the professionalism of the team at Morgan County and across the state."

The city of Pigeon Forge is gaining national attention for its work to safeguard the community against wildfires. Pigeon Forge has been selected to receive a Wildfire Mitigation Award, which is the highest honor a community can achieve for outstanding work in wildfire risk reduction.

Experts and leaders in the field established the Wildfire Mitigation Award in 2014 to recognize programs and projects that are making a difference nationwide. Recognizing the comprehensive challenge posed by wildfires, these awards applaud dedication to wildfire mitigation across a broad spectrum of activities and among a variety of individuals and organizations.

"The City of Pigeon Forge has been a wildfire risk reduction leader in Tennessee for more than a decade," Tennessee State Forester David Arnold said. "Both their fire department and community development department have championed change

to protect lives and save homes and businesses. Their past, ongoing, and planned actions clearly demonstrate an extraordinary commitment to wildfire risk mitigation—within and beyond the city limits."

The 2019 Wildfire Mitigation Awards will be presented at the Wildland Urban-Interface Conference in Reno, Nev. on March 27,

2019. The Tennessee Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry is proud that the city of Pigeon Forge will be on stage with other national leaders to receive their award.

-Providing a curbside brush removal program for residents to reduce the risk of wildfire.

-Being one of only nine pilot communities nationally to test the Ready, Set, Go! Program, which prepared home and business owners for evacuations.

-Becoming a Firewise USA® Site in 2017 and holding public meetings to encourage all stakeholders to participate to reduce wildfire risk.

"We are greatly appreciative for this honor recognizing the hard work of the

city employees," Pigeon Forge City Manager Earlene Teaster said. "We need to enjoy this significant moment, however, our work is far from finished. 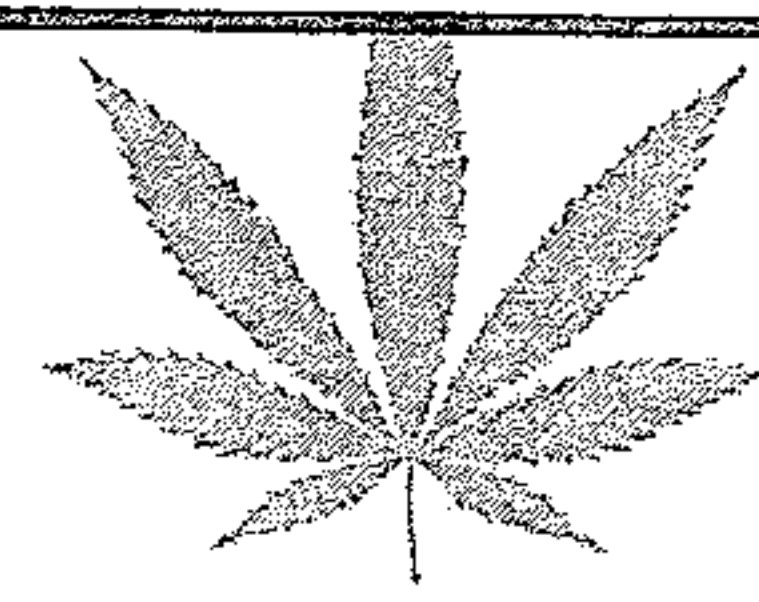
I simply couldn't see the other side of the horizon.

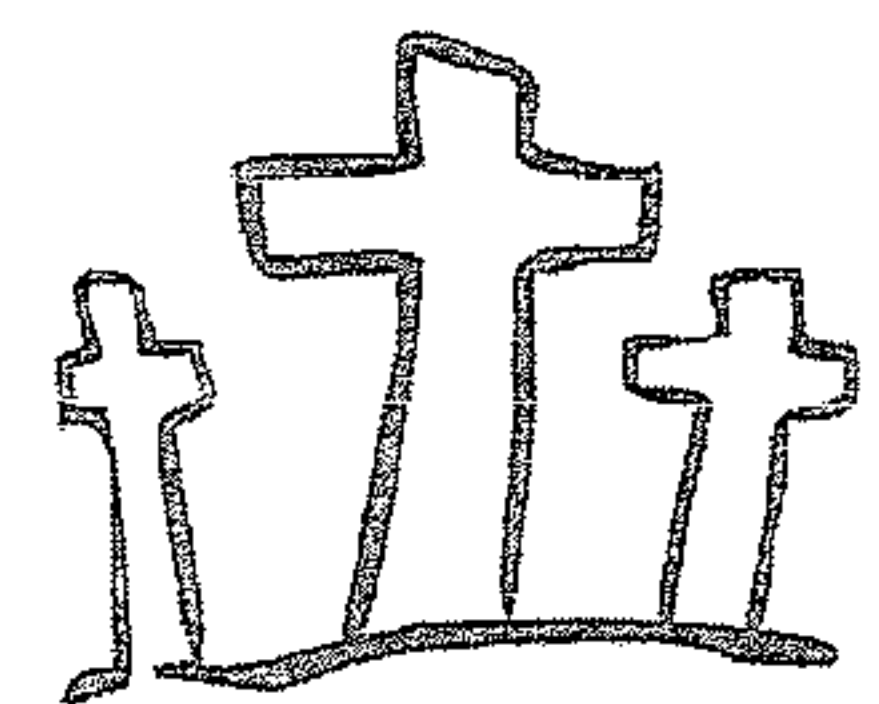
