sitting on the living room sofa when Jada Allison forced her way into her apt. and began striking her in the face/head area. Victim stated Jada was accompanied by another white female, a black male, and a white male. Victim stated she ran to the upstairs and locked

herself in the bathroom for her safety. Victim then stated the door was kicked in and another round of assault took place. Victim could not identify which person was involved in the second round of assault, but stated all four offenders were in the bathroom. Victim stated one of the offenders stole her

black Huawei cell phone and stated they were "strapped" which led victim to believe they were armed with a gun. The offenders then fled the apt. Deputy did observe facial injuries to victim which included broken/loose front teeth, possibly broken nose, and severe swelling of the forehead and eye areas. Victim refused EMS. Deputy observed the upstairs bathroom door laying destroyed in floor of the bathroom. Deputy also observed blood splatter on the bathroom wall in the area victim claimed the assault occurred. Deputy then spoke with witness who stated they heard a female's voice yelling outside and when he opened the front door the four offenders forced themselves into the apt. and began assaulting Ashley. Witness stated once victim fled upstairs he attempted to block the offenders, however they pushed past him. Witness stated after the assault the offenders fled the area in a dark colored car. Witness, and victim identified the unknown persons as a black male with a small afro, white male with blond braids, and a white female with blond hair. Deputy was also advised the incident was recorded on a cell phone by the offenders.

Shortly after the assault Loudon Police went out to a crash on Grove St. in which Jada was a passenger. Also in the vehicle were Anthony Roach, Addison Selvidge, and Ciera Godsey. Witness identified the above persons as the offenders from the assault. In the crashed vehicle LPD found six cell phones including the phone that was stolen from victim during the assault. The phones were seized and placed into evidence. Inv. Smith will be contacted to obtain a search warrant for the cell phones. Anthony and Addison were transported by Deputy Lewis 952 to the Loudon County Jail. Ciera and Jada were transported by LPD Nix B4. Written statements from victim and witnesses were taken. All occurred in Loudon County, TN

Murder

Whitney Armstrong, 28, Calderwood Hwy Maryville, was charged with Murder 2nd Degree. Deputy Scarbrough LCSO, was dispatched to a possible drug Overdose, at the Greenback Corner Market Hwy. 411 South Greenback, Tn. On arrival AMR Ambulance service and Greenback Volunteer Fire Department was on scene administering CPR to the Victim. Deputy spoke with the Complainant, who states that the Victim and her Brother had been at the Party Pub in Alcoa drinking. Complainant advises that shortly after returning home from the Pub, the Victim went into the bathroom where the Complainant found the Victim passed out. This occurred at North Trigon Rd. Greenback, Tn. Complainant states that she and a female loaded the Victim into their vehicle and was taking her to the Hospital. While driving they noticed that the Victim wasn't breathing and pulled over at the Greenback Corner Market and started CPR and dialed 911. The complainant couldn't advise what the Victim had took other

than she had been drinking. Medics were still doing CPR when they left transporting to Blount Memorial Hospital. Also on scene was Sgt. Chris Hutchens, Inv. Marty Stanley, and Lt. Shane Ezell. Victims cell phone was placed in Airplane mode and taken as evidence. During the subsequent investigation, Facebook Messages on victim cellular telephone revealed that victim, a male, and Whitney Nicol Armstrong had met at the Exxon, located at W Broadway, Maryville, to exchange \$100 for 0.3 grams of heroin. During the Facebook Messenger exchange, maley told victim he would send in Armstrong to the bathroom to complete the transaction. Victim went into the restroom at approximately 9:45 PM followed by Armstrong at approximately 9:49 PM. Armstrong left the restroom at 9:50 PM followed by victim approximately 10 seconds later which were confirmed by surveillance video at the Exxon. After leaving the Exxon, victim returned home to N. Trigon Road, Greenback, where family members stated victim appeared coherent until she was found in the bathroom floor.

Armstrong and the male were arrested by the Blount County Sheriff's Office on unrelated charges. After reading Armstrong her Miranda Rights, Armstrong admitted to taking a piece of paper, which she believed contained heroin and/or fentanyl, into the bathroom and exchanging the paper for \$100 from Hess at the direction of the male. Autopsy results revealed that victim died of alcohol, heroin, fentanyl and acetyl fentanyl intoxication as a direct result of the drug transaction completed by the male, Armstrong and victim. The male and Whitney Armstrong are charged with Second Degree Murder. This happened in Loudon County, TN.

Transfer

James Tipton, 46, Pratt Road Knoxville, was charged with Theft of Property x3, and Vandalism x3. Deputy B. Brannum LCSO, transported James Tipton from Hamblen County Jail to the Loudon County Jail on active warrant out of Loudon County.

New York and the Western District of Washington.

"The charges unsealed today are the result of years of investigative work conducted by the FBI and our law enforcement partners," FBI Director Christopher Wray said today at a Department of Justice press conference announcing the indictments. "Both sets of charges expose Huawei's brazen and persistent actions to exploit American companies and financial institutions and to threaten the free and fair global marketplace."

The Eastern District of New York charged Huawei, two of its affiliates, and Chief Financial Officer Meng Wanzou with 13 counts surrounding the company's misrepresentations to the U.S. government and four financial institutions regarding its business in Iran. The indictment charges that the company used financial institutions operating in the United States to process transactions involving millions of dollars in furtherance of Huawei's Iran-based business. These transactions and the company's false statements about them violated U.S. laws, including the International Emergency Economic Powers Act.

The additional 10

charges out of Washington state alleged that employees at Huawei Device Co. and Huawei Device USA, Inc. worked to steal the details of an innovative and proprietary tool built by T-Mobile to test the performance of new mobile phones prior to launch. According to the indictment, Huawei employees who were granted limited access to T-Mobile's Tappy Robot System stole information about the technology in violation of nondisclosure and confidentiality agreements, and then sought to cover up their actions.

"The FBI does not—and will not—tolerate businesses that violate our laws, obstruct our justice, and jeopardize our national security."

FBI Director Christopher Wray said the company's intentional and systematic efforts to steal valuable intellectual property were designed to "circumvent hard-earned, time-consuming research and gain an unfair market advantage."

Wray expressed his gratitude to the FBI personnel who were instrumental in building the case and to partners at the Departments of Commerce and Homeland Security.

He also recognized efforts by Canadian law enforcement officials.

"These cases make clear," Wray stressed, "that, as a country, we must consider carefully the risk that companies like Huawei

pose if we allow them into our telecommunications infrastructure. The FBI does not—and will not—tolerate businesses that violate our laws, obstruct our justice, and jeopardize our national security."
