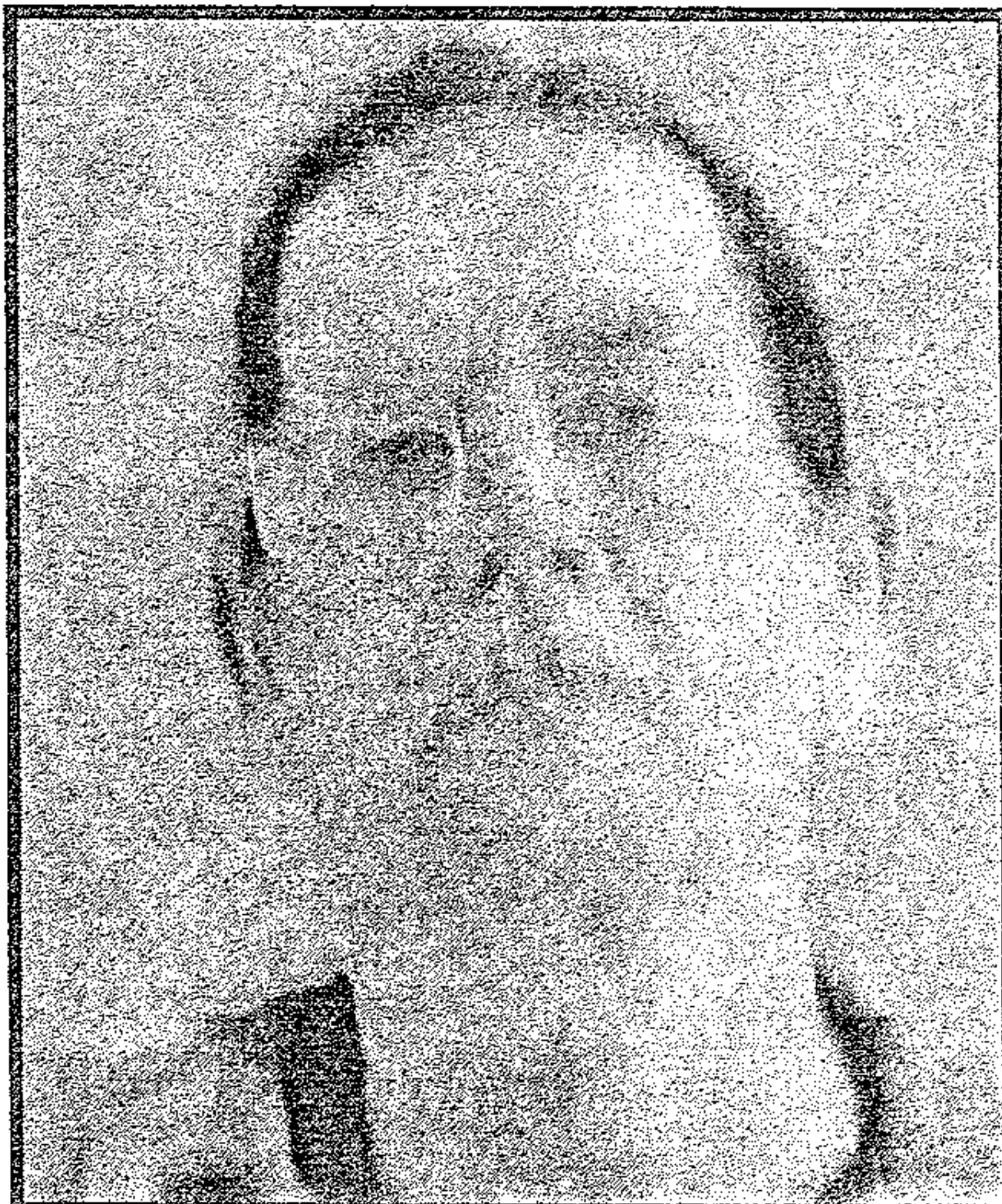

New Requirements for Captive Deer Herds Following CWD Detection

After the confirmed detection of chronic wasting disease (CWD) in ten wild deer, Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA) Commissioner Jai Templeton is implementing emergency rules to prevent further spread of the disease.

Hunters harvested the deer in Fayette and Hardeman counties. Targeted sampling by the Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency (TWRA) indicated the presence of CWD.

CWD has no known risk to the

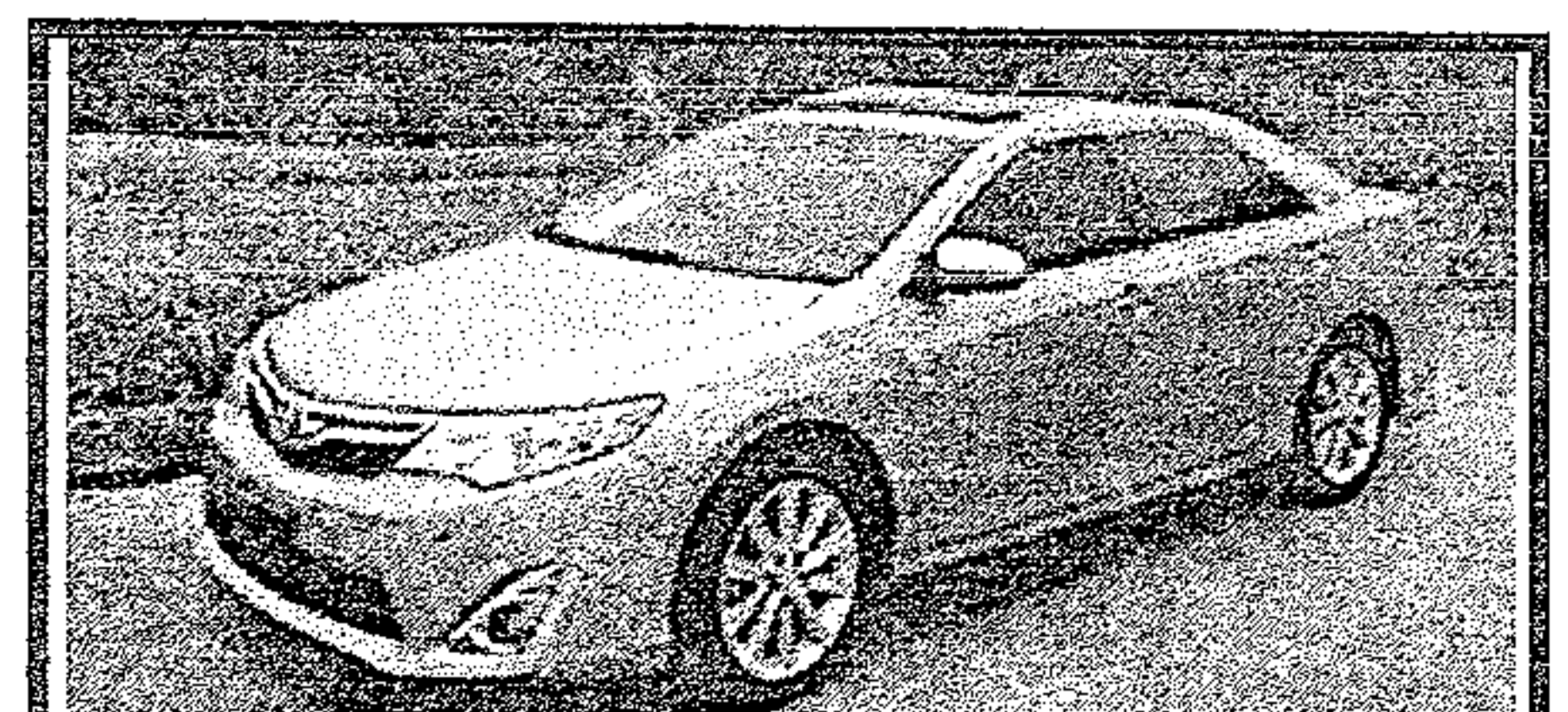

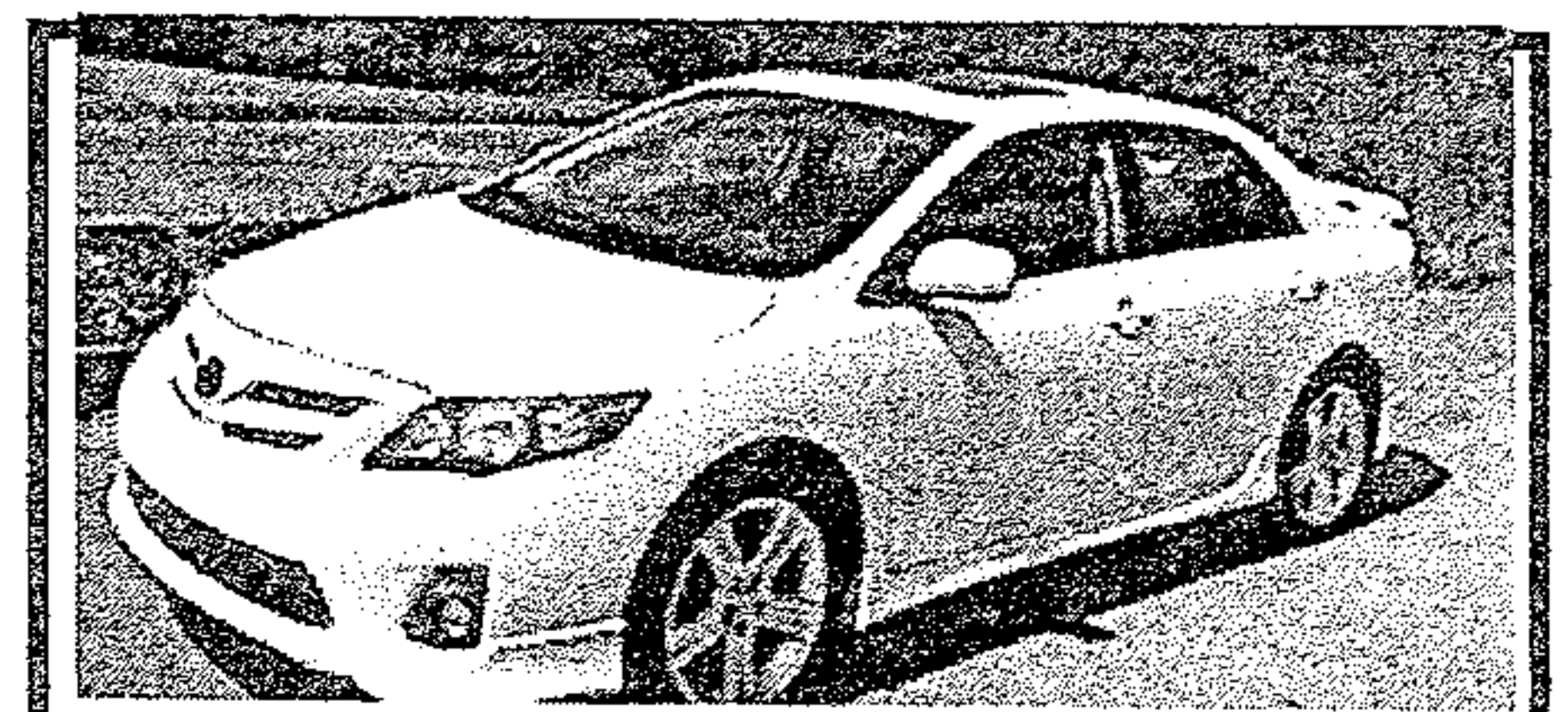

up. Mrs. Payne then came into the kitchen and struck her minor daughter in the forehead with her fist leaving a red mark. After the fight broke up, Donald then got a baseball bat and struck victim in the forehead, making a cut that was bleeding. Both Don-

ald and Debra Payne was placed under arrest.

Disorderly

Nicholas Keck, 23, Fairway Drive Loudon, was charged with Assault x2, Disorderly Conduct, and Indecent Exposure. Officer A. Lee LCPD, was dispatched to High-

way 321 (McDonalds) in reference to a disturbance. When the call came out Officer was close by, completing a traffic stop. When Officer looked at the parking lot of McDonalds he observed a Black male and a White male arguing and then on the ground fighting. When Officer arrived on scene he began to separate the subjects. The Black male had the White male in a headlock. Officer identified himself as a police officer and pulled the two apart. Officer then detained both subjects for safety purposes. Officer did observe injuries to the white males face. The black male was identified as Nicholas Keck. After Officer learned that Keck was the aggressor he remained detained and restraints were removed from victim. After speaking with the Complainant Officer discovered the situation began inside the store when the complainant asked the Offender (Keck) how he was doing. The Complainant stated the Offender then began to yell and scream obscenities

at the Complainant and employees. The Offender caused public annoyance, alarm, and engaged in violent/threatening behavior by assaulting victims. Multiple Victims/Witnesses advised during the disturbance in the store, the Offender exposed his penis and told 4 employees, including two female minors, to "Suck my \$\$\$\$". The Offender then exited the store and began to argue with male victim. Witnesses state the Offender made physical contact with victim first then the two began to fight. Victim advises after the Offender struck victim then he forced her to the ground. She also advised that the Offender struck her, she suffered injuries to her right hand and knee. Both victims refused medical treatment. Due to the statements provided and officer observation of assault, the Offender was placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

Angela Horton, 31, Mingo Way Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault. Deputy Kirkland LCSO, was dispatched to Mingo Way in reference to a domestic disturbance. While en route, dispatch advised that a female subject, later identified as Mrs. Angela Horton (Offender) had a knife and was threatening to hurt herself. The female left the residence in a black Kia Optima, came back to the residence and came inside the residence with a knife. The caller then advised that she had cut up the kitchen table left the residence again. Deputy Parton did locate Mrs. Horton leaving the residence and did initiate traffic stop and detained her. A black handled stainless steel knife was located in her purse inside her vehicle, which matched the description her boyfriend, (Victim) gave of the knife. Deputy then went to the residence to gather more information and victim stated that He had told Mrs. Horton that she had until January 31 to fine her own place to live and she grabbed a knife and put it to her neck and ran to

the bedroom. The victim stated that she had threatened to hurt herself multiple times prior to this incident so he left her alone and grabbed their grand daughter who was in the residence crying and took her to another room. Victim then called Mrs. Horton's daughter to come get the grand daughter and Mrs. Horton overheard the conversation and came downstairs yelling and cussing and stabbed the kitchen table multiple times with the kitchen knife placing victim in fear for his safety. Visible marks were on the kitchen table consistent with being stabbed and cut with a knife. Mrs. Horton was placed under arrest and taken to Fort Loudoun Hospital for Mental evaluation and was released at 1753 where she was taken in to custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.

 ficer ask Powell to pull out her pockets and he cold hear plastic in her pocket he ask her what it was she pulled out a baggy from her jean pocket that contained a white crystal substance methamphetamine .4 grams. In the vehicle Officer located a backpack that contained digital scales, syringes, spoons, cut straw, tie off band, and approx.. 75 baggies, and rolled in a shirt was a glass pipe to smoke meth. Powell was placed under arrest.

health of humans or livestock. However, testing is recommended prior to consuming deer or elk meat harvested within the CWD Management Zone, which includes Fayette, Hardeman, and McNairy Counties.

CWD is a contagious and deadly neurological disorder that affects cervids, which are animals in the deer family including deer, elk, moose, caribou, and reindeer.

“We have been working hard to prepare for this potential threat,” Commissioner Templeton said. “In collaboration with TWRA, the United States Department of Agriculture, hunters, and captive herd owners, we have developed a response plan. That plan is critical in protecting the wild and captive deer and elk in our state.”

With the new emergency rules in place, owners of captive deer and elk will be required to report their herd inventory, location, and any sick ani-

mals to the State Veterinarian. They will also be required to report deaths among their fenced captive cervids within 24 hours and make the carcass available to TDA for further testing.

Additionally, the importation of captive cervids into the state and the movement of captive deer or elk within the state require prior approval and a permit from the State Veterinarian, as well as USDA-approved identification. The requirements from the new emergency rule do not apply to white-tailed deer and wild elk, which are prohibited from being retained in captive facilities.

“Just a few weeks before this detection, we joined TWRA, USDA, and other partners for a tabletop exercise to discuss and finalize a response plan,” State

Veterinarian Dr. Charlie Hatcher said. “Now, we’re following through. We encourage captive herd owners to keep a close eye on the animals in their care and report any signs of illness immediately.”

A voluntary program administered by TDA, the Tennessee CWD Herd Certification Program was put in place in 2013 to provide uniform herd certification standards and to support the domestic and international marketability of cervid herds. Facilities can

be certified as disease-free after five years of program enrollment with no evidence of disease, and the program is required for the interstate movement of CWD-susceptible cervids. For more information about CWD, visit CWDinTennessee.com.
