Tennessee Receives Funding to Collect Data to Help Prevent Violent Deaths

The Tennessee Department of Health Office of the State Chief Medical Examiner has received \$1.4 million in funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to gather critical data on homicide, suicide and other violent deaths. Tennessee

is one of ten states to receive new funding to use the National Violent Death Reporting System, which will provide NVDRS with state-level data on violent deaths from all 50 states, Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico.

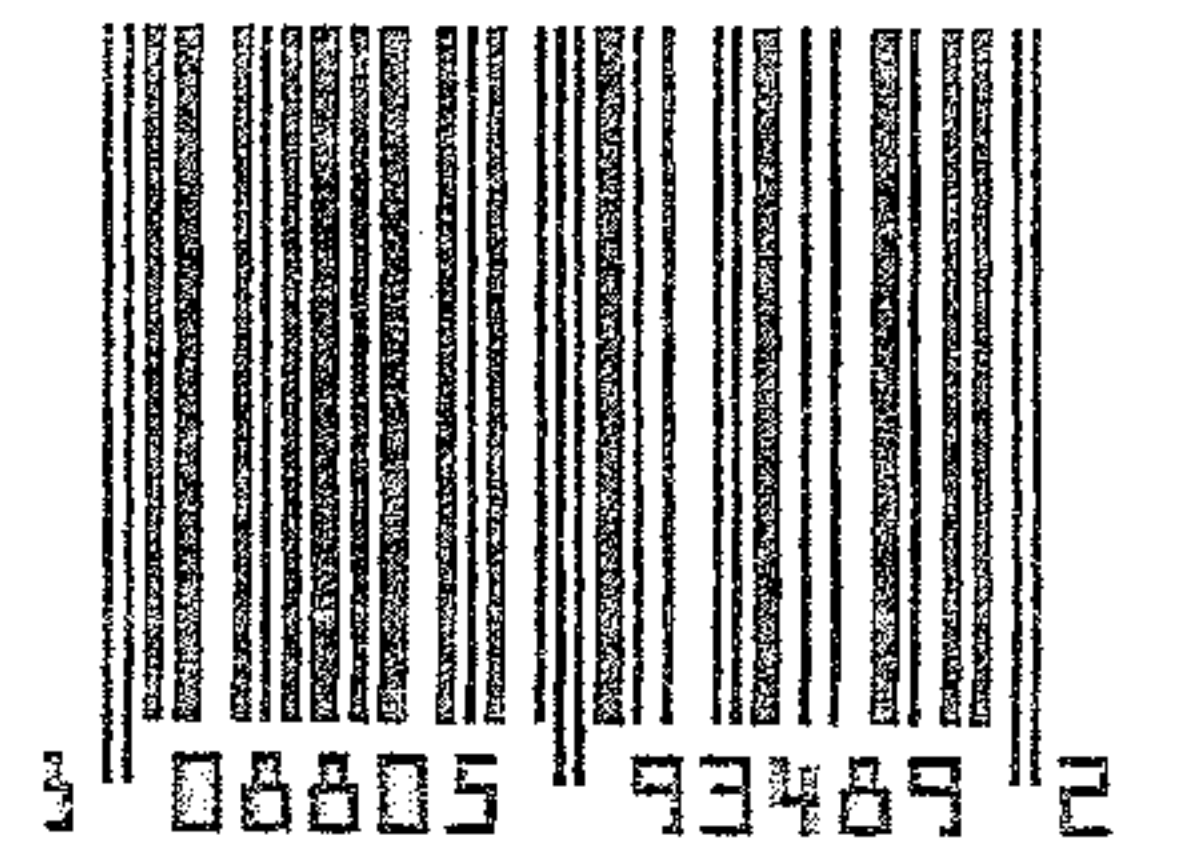

While on routine patrol, Deputy was advised to contact the ER Nurse at Parkwest Hospital in reference to a possible domestic assault. Depu-

ty made contact with, an RN at Parkwest ER who stated that a patient was brought in by POV with the chief complaint of a fractured right wrist.

The complainant stated that the patient / victim, had stated that while her son and grandson were arguing at her residence,

she tried to separate them, and her grandson, later identified as the offender, Bradley Christian, shoved her down which subsequently caused her to break her wrist. On scene at Parkwest ER Deputy

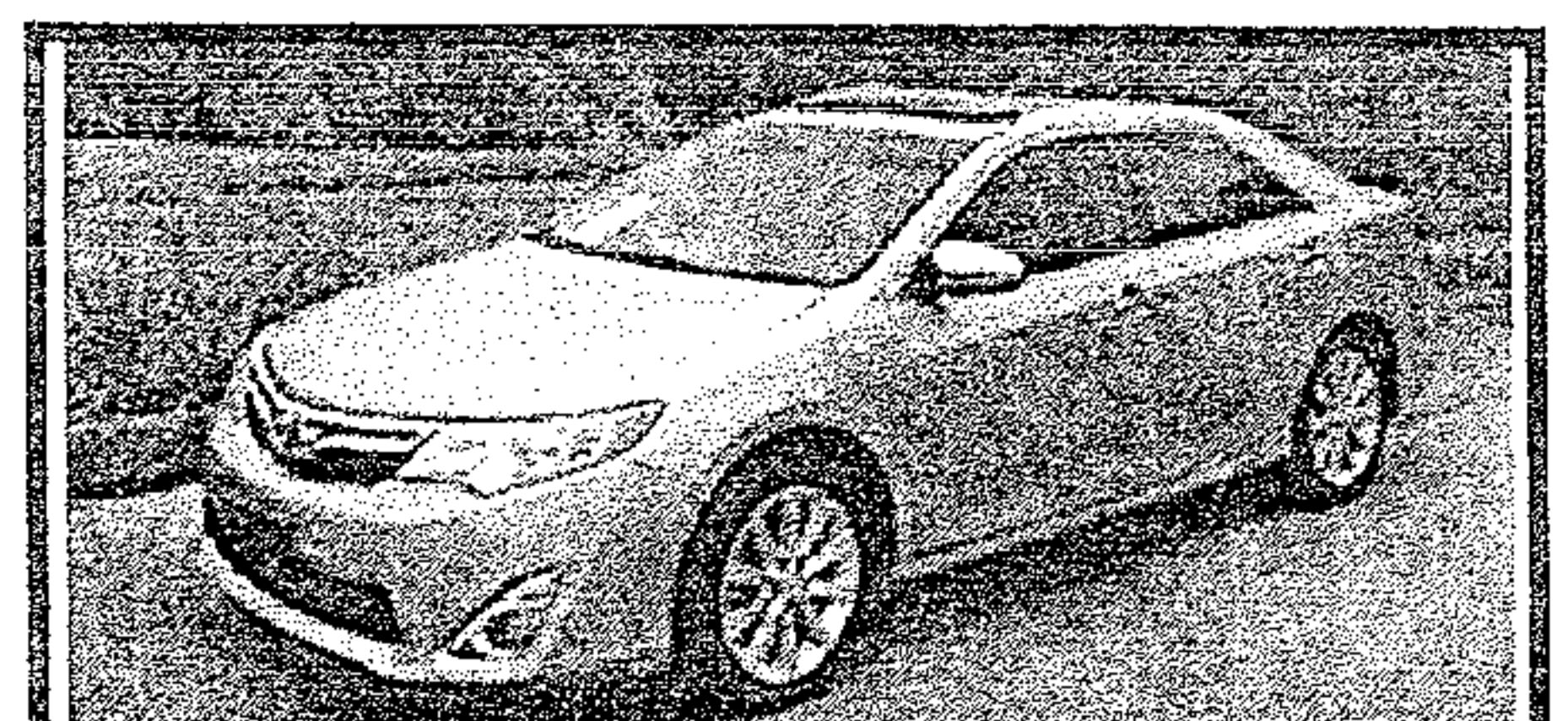

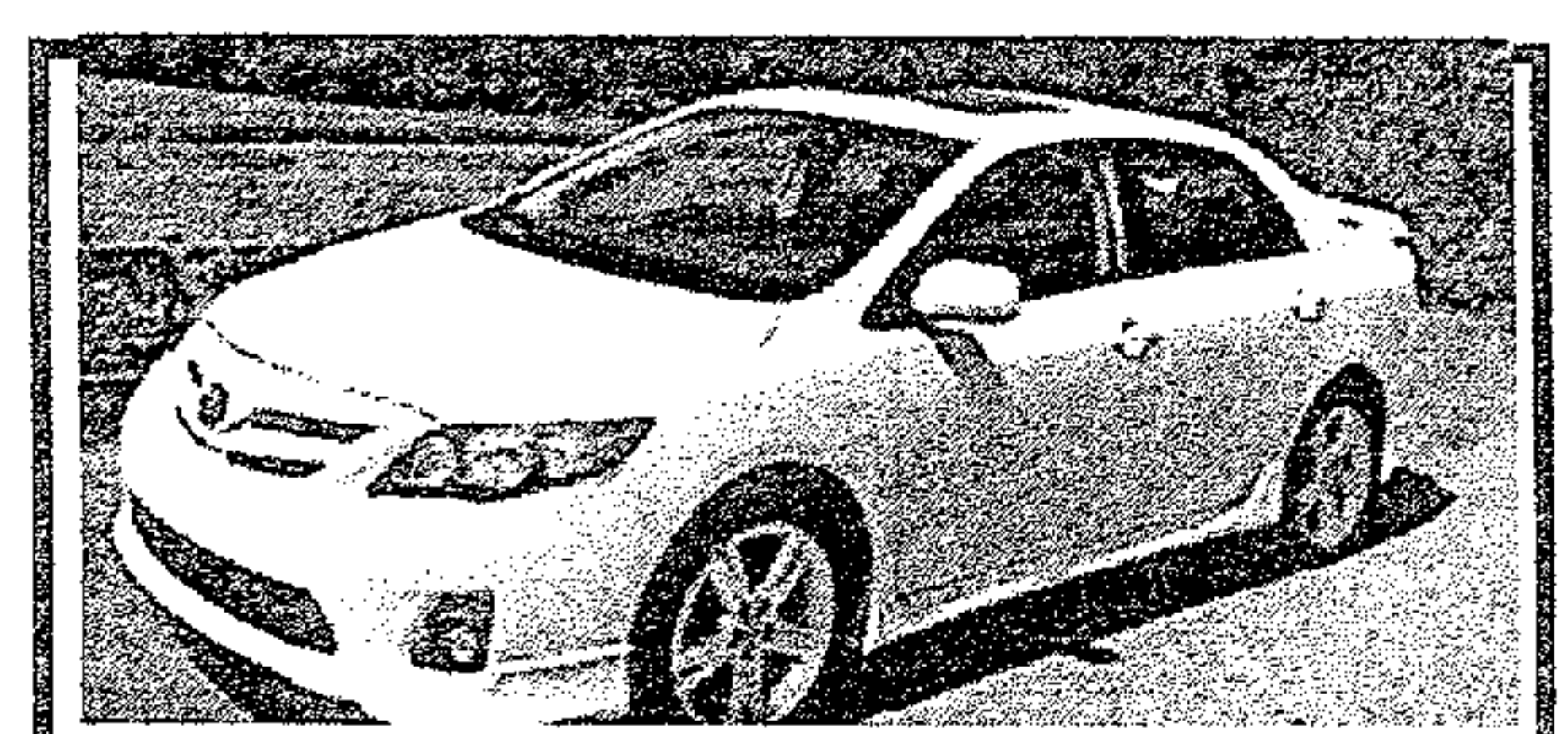

Edward Poffenberger, 48, Hwy 72 North Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault x2. Deputy Chance Gray LCSO, along with Sgt. Hutchens was dispatched to Hwy 72 in reference to a possible domestic. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with the victims who stated Edward Poffenberger had been drinking and was wanting to have sex. Victim told him no because he was drunk. Victim stated Poffenberger then grabbed her by the arm in an attempt to pull her to the bedroom. Victim stated that she had to swing at him in order to get him to let go. A juvenile victim was yelling for him to let victim go and Poffenberger pushed him on the couch and smacked him. Victim did have a cut on her left finger. Poffenberger was placed under arrest.

Officer Fritts LCPD, observed a White Honda Accord run the posted stop sign at the intersection of Rock Springs Road and McGee Blvd. The vehicle also had a metal border around the registration tag covering the state and county. Upon stopping the vehicle the driver was identified as Amanda Brown. Officer could smell a strong odor of Marijuana coming from the vehicle. Jennifer Stratton, 38, Foster Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault. Officer J. Dishner LCPD, was dispatched to a fight call at Hwy 321 N. (Ingles). Upon arrival, Officer made contact with a victim. Victim advised he was meeting his wife, Jennifer L. Stratton, to pick up his belongings. As victim approached his wife, he was involved in a verbal altercation with a unknown black male. Following that altercation, victim advised that Jennifer Stratton pointed a small, black pistol at him and he ran away on foot. Officer made contact with Jennifer Stratton and asked for consent to search the vehicle she was driving, for a pistol. She gave consent, and a small, black pistol, fell out of a jacket which was in the driver side rear floorboard of the Nissan Maxima. Mrs. Stratton advised she never pointed the pistol (which was an air-soft) at victim, it was only in her pocket. Officer placed the defendant, Jennifer Stratton, under arrest for Aggravated Domestic Assault. This did occur in Lenoir City, Tn.

Man Gets DUI With Guns In The Car

Shane Cook, 29, Maple Shore Lane Kingston, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent and Possession of Handgun While Under the Influence. Deputy Marshall Lynn LCSO, observed a black Audi A6, travelling at a low rate of speed, on Highway 411 near Dotson Road. Deputy further observed the vehicle cross the white line several times and weave back and forth within its lane of travel, before randomly accelerating and decelerating. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on Highway 411 at the Blount County line and made contact with the driver, later identified as Suspect (Shane Cook), who upon initial observation appeared to have glossy bloodshot eyes and slurred speech. Shane Cook stated he had been drinking approximately 30 minutes prior at friend's house. After retrieving Shane Cook's license, he appeared to be concealing his left hand under his right arm. Deputy reached in the vehicle and pulled his left hand away from his arm and asked him to step out of the vehicle. Shane Cook stated he had a Glock handgun in the trunk. Shane Cook agreed to Stan-

dardized Field Sobriety Testing, which he performed poorly on. Shane Cook was placed under arrest and searched, when Deputy then detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his person. Deputy asked Shane Cook if there were any other weapons in the vehicle, when he then stated there was a handgun that belonged to someone else in the glove box. Deputy located a Glock .40 caliber handgun in the trunk and a .38 Smith & Wesson revolver in the glove box. The vehicle was towed by Malone Wrecker Service and the weapons were seized and turned into evidence. Shane Cook was advised of Tennessee Implied Consent, which he refused to provide a sample. Shane Cook was transported to the Loudon County Justice Center. This

“This is about prevention and we welcome this opportunity to improve our ability to track these important facts like the method of injury, the relationship between the victim and the suspect and information on other circumstances like depression,” said TDH Commissioner John Dreyzehner, MD, MPH. “Through the National Violent Death Reporting System we can use this data to develop tailored efforts to reduce violent deaths.”

NVDRS helps state and local of-

ficials understand where, when, why and how violent deaths occur by linking data from medical examiner, law enforcement, toxicology and vital statistics records. It is the only data system for homicide and suicide that links law enforcement data with data from non-law enforcement sources.

Violence is a significant public health problem in Tennessee. In 2017, more than 1,800 Tennesseans died as the result of homicide or suicide. Participating in NVDRS as a national system pro-

vides a complete picture of violent deaths across the nation with data to guide prevention efforts, actions and programs that can save lives.

As part of the funding the TDH Office of the State Chief Medical Examiner will form an advisory committee to include data exchange partners to track and prevent acts of violence. The committee will include members who are associated with and knowledgeable about the data sources, interested in using and analyzing the information and can influence agency decisions and co-operation. Partners

will include Tennessee’s state chief medical examiner, deputy chief medical examiner and representatives from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, suicide prevention organizations, law enforcement, local medical examiners and other community-based stakeholders concerned with preventing violence.

“To stop violent deaths, we must first understand all the facts,” said Tennessee Chief Medical Examiner Julia Goodin, MD. “NVDRS will

provide a more complete picture of homicides, suicides and unintentional firearm injury deaths in Tennessee. Knowing the circumstances of violent deaths will help us identify the right prevention efforts and use resources in the best way possible.”
