Michael Baker, 43, Stevens Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/ Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Man/Sell/Del/ Resale Sch. VI, Simple Possession, Lights Required on Motor Vehicle, Driving Unregistered Vehicle, and Financial Responsibility. Deputy C. Rogers LCSO, observed a red vehicle traveling on Hwy 321 with a headlight out. The vehicle displayed registration that came back not on file. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on Hwy 321. Upon contact with the driver Michael Baker, who appeared nervous and sweaty. Baker provided a TN. Driver license but stated his registration was not valid, and did not have insurance. Baker exited the vehicle and Deputy ask for consent to search. While attempting to unlatch the hood Baker stated it was broke and became very nervous. with 1,299 cases reported as of Oct. 8 in 49 states, the District of Columbia and one U.S. territory including 26 deaths. There have now been 53 cases reported in Tennessee. Most of the patients are adolescents and young adults.

Patients associated with this outbreak have had symptoms including cough, shortness of breath and/or chest pain, growing worse over a period of days or weeks before admission to the hospital. Other symptoms may include fatigue, fever, nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea. All patients have reported using e-cigarette or vaping products. At this time, no single product or substance has been linked to all the lung injury cases and the specific chemical or ingredient causing these injuries re-

mains unknown. all cases, patients have cannabinol ucts.

Many technology firms have or plan to implement user-controlled end-to-end encryptions that will thwart the ability of enforcement, law with a court-ordered warrant, to find and



Technology companies reported 45 million of these images in 2018, according to a recent media analysis. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children alone receives 18 million referrals a means for the chilyear.

Each image documents an act of violence against a child—some of them younger than 2 years old. Take a moment to consider what that

"If we don't take action and do something soon to address the lawful access problem," said Wray, "it will be too late, and we'll lose the ability to find those kids who need to be "We demand safety rescued. We just cannot let that happen."


