Asheville Man Is Indicted For \$13.5 Million Ponzi Scheme

The Defendant Allegedly Defrauded More Than 23 Victims, Including Some at, or Near, Retirement Age

A federal grand jury sitting in Charlotte has returned a criminal indictment against Hal H. Brown Jr.,

69, of Asheville, N.C., charging him with securities fraud, wire fraud and transactional money laundering, for orchestrating a \$13.7 million investment scheme, announced Andrew Murray, U.S. Attorney for the

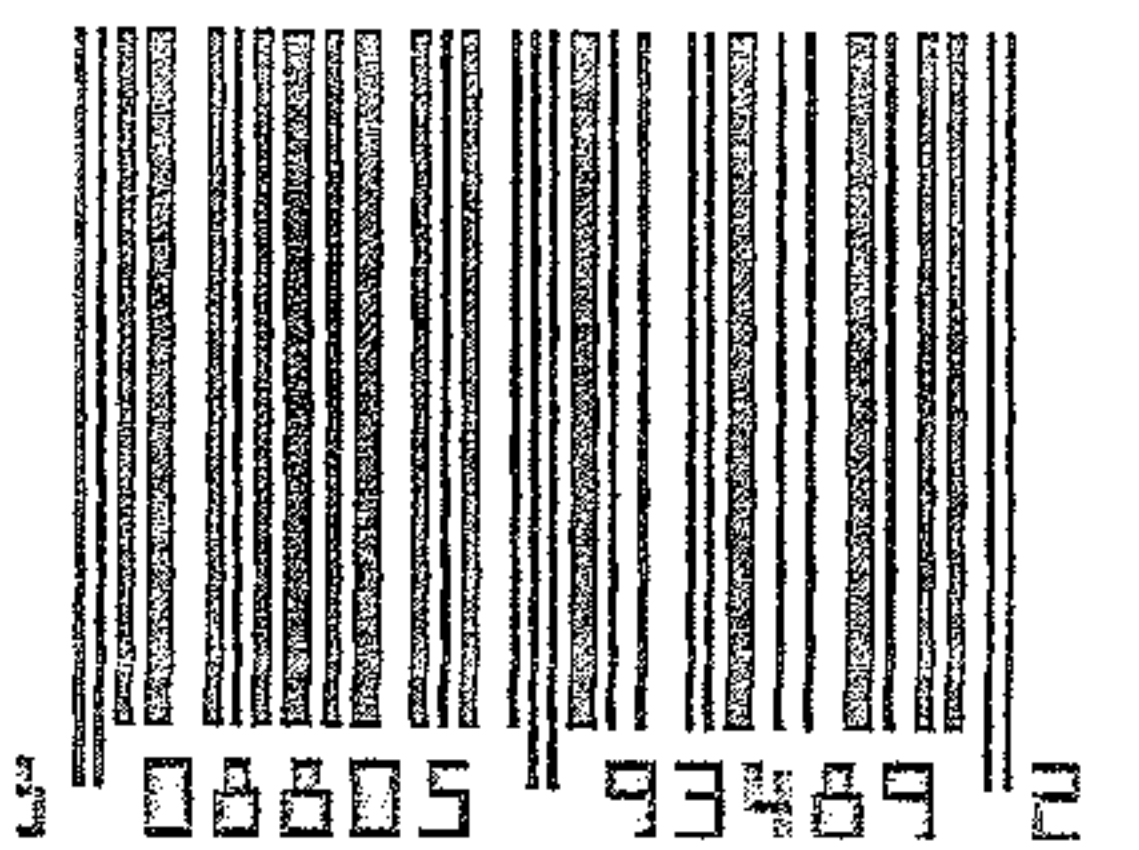

Officials with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office said deputies and DTF agents assisted the 9th Judicial District Attorney's Office in the closure of a nuisance house that was the center of continuous drug issues and the scene of a fatal shooting in August.

The home, on the 600 block of Tinnell Lane in Northern Loudon County, was the location of a shooting on August 20 that killed Christopher Watson, 34. John

Dixon Jr., 41, was charged with first-degree murder and felon in possession of a handgun after the incident.

According to reports, the home had a significant amount of illegal drugs and drug use including methamphetamine, heroin and prescription pills. Officials said drug intoxication and aggravated crimes connected to the substances have repeatedly occurred at the residence.

The home is in a protected zone, within 1,000 feet of Highland Park Elementary School.

Officials said Christina Cook, a known drug dealer in the area, admitted to being at the home with Rebecca Key and Jamie Kitts. According to reports, Cook told officials that Key sold pills to Cheryl Spangler at the home. Key is currently in federal custody

for the manufacture, sale and delivery of methamphetamine.

Cook also told officials Kitts would reportedly distribute marijuana at the home. Officials said Kitts

Rachel Reynolds, 22, Mayez Avenue Sweetwater, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. IV. Officer Scott Newman LPD, observed a female sleeping behind the wheel of a vehicle, Officer approached the vehicle to check the welfare of the female. While making contact with the female Officer observed in plain view laying in the female lap a small baggy containing several green pills believed to be Xanax. Officer identified the female as Rachel Reynolds, who was very lethargic and had to be helped from the vehicle. Rachel Reynolds was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

is a known drug dealer in the area. She is currently in federal custody for the manufacture, sale and delivery of methamphetamine. On September 3, officials said Brandon Coff-

man, another resident of the home, spoke to DTF agents and said his mother paid Spangler \$80 per week to stay at the home. Coffman said in return, he would mix illegal narcotics for injecting Spangler. Coffman said Chris Watson, who was killed in the shooting, would also "fix shots." According to reports, Coffman said Spangler "would rent the rooms out for dope." He also said Spangler has overdosed twice. On August 27, DTF agents did a follow-up interview at the home where they arrested Coffman who had an active warrant for violating probation.

Agents also spoke with Spangler who said she was the head of the household and often rents out rooms in the home. According to officials, Spangler said Jerry Ray Parton, who is reportedly known to sell illegal narcotics, lives in the garage.

During the August 27 visit officials also made contact with Terry Thomas who was charged and convicted of theft and fraud.

Just before the shooting on August 20, officials arrested Tina Shelton and Anthony Satterfield at the home. The two had active warrants and officials found several baggies of metham-

phetamine, scales and drug paraphernalia inside the vehicle.

At 5 p.m. on August 20, officials responded to the shooting that killed Christopher Watson. After an investigation, officials said the shooting happened over a \$40 drug debt. Watson was reportedly known by agents to sell and use illegal narcotics, according to reports.

Officials said a confidential informant arranged a \$100 methamphetamine purchase from David Blake Abney at the home. The informant was wearing a recording device and successfully purchased 2.5 grams of methamphetamine.

According to reports, officials have responded to numerous calls of theft, drug sales and drug use at the home since 2015.

"After numerous calls for service in a short time frame, several arrests and criminal and drug charges pending, the investigation shows that this residence continues to be a hub of drug activity and violence," Loudon County officials said.

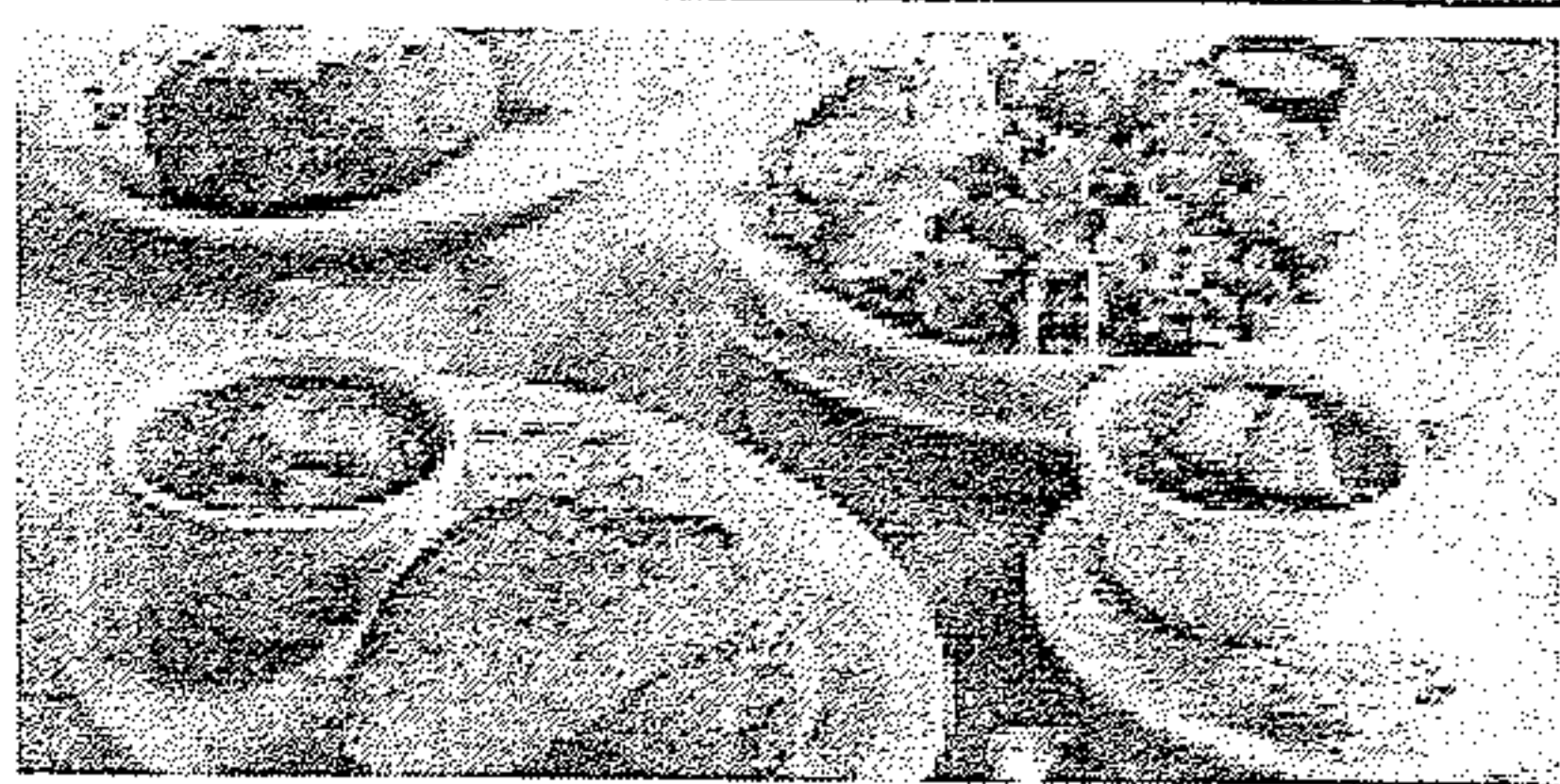
Officials with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office said they work closely with the District Attorney and Drug Task Force to identify known drug operations and close them down.

Steven Wilson and a female identified as Brenda Soby, are physically fighting. Complainant stated that Brenda entered a truck and moved the vehicle to another location in the parking lot. Upon arrival Officer Scott Brewer made contact with Brenda in the driver seat. Officer then ask Brenda he side of the story, she stated that they were in an argument when Steven told her to quit down. Brenda stated when she wouldn't be quiet Steven smacked her across the face. Officer observed Brenda's eye swollen, which supports her statement. While speaking with Brenda Officer observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her person, unsteady on her feet, bloodshot eyes, and had slurred speech. Brenda did poorly on test given by Officer. Both were placed under arrest. Once at the jail due to the strong odor of alcoholic beverage coming from his person Officer gave Steven the horizontal gaze nystagmus test and her perform poorly.

Western District of North Carolina. John A. Strong, Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Charlotte Division, joins U.S. Attorney Murray in making today's announcement.

According to allegations contained in the indictment, from at least 2012 through September 2019, Brown fraudulently obtained more than \$13.5 million from at least 23 victims, some of whom were at, or near, retirement age, by engaging in an investment scheme through his company Oodles Inc. and its various affiliates (collectively "OODLES"). As alleged in the indictment, to induce victims to invest their money, Brown falsely represented that OODLES owned hundreds of millions of dollars in intellectual prop-

erty, namely family entertainment shows and movies. As part of the scheme, Brown repeatedly lied to victims about the imminent sale of those intellectual properties to various well-known media companies. To perpetuate the fraud, the indictment alleges that Brown developed marketing material seeking investments or loans for OODLES that claimed large returns on funds invested or lent to the company.

As alleged in the indictment, to convince victims the scheme was legitimate and to appease investors who sought an explanation about delays in payouts, Brown provided victims with a number of fraudulent and misleading statements and fictitious information, including fake bank statements and falsified com-

pany agreements, among others. Brown used a substantial part of victim money on personal expenses unrelated to purported OODLES transactions, and

ture today announced the detection of the invasive Asian long-horned tick in an additional six Tennessee counties: Knox, Jefferson, Claiborne, Cocke, Putnam, and Sevier. The tick was detected in Union and Roane Counties in May.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that there is no evidence to date that the tick has transmitted pathogens to humans in the U.S. There are concerns that the

tick may transmit the agent of Theileriosis in cattle, and heavy infestations can cause blood loss and lead to death.

It is important to be aware of this tick, as cattle and canines are particularly susceptible to tick bites. Livestock producers are reminded to be vigilant when purchasing animals, apply a tick treatment to cattle prior to bringing them to your farm, and always use best practices for herd health. should provide their animals with a tick preventative and check for ticks.
“Tennessee has numerous animal hosts and a suitable habitat for this tick spe-

cies,” Dr. R.T. Trout Fryxell, Associate Professor of Medical and Veterinary Entomology for UTIA, said. “While it is always important to be diligent and keep an eye out for all ticks, the unique biology

of the Asian long-horned tick helps this species to establish quickly and become a problem.”

Tips to prevent tick bites in animals and livestock include:

- Coordinate with your veterinarian to determine appropriate pest prevention for pets and livestock.
- Check pets and livestock for ticks frequently.
- Remove any ticks by pulling from the attachment site of the tick bite with tweezers.
- Monitor your pets and livestock for any changes in health

If your animals are bitten by a tick, Dr. Trout Fryxell suggests putting the tick in a ziplock bag, writing down the date and where the tick was most likely encountered, and storing it in a freezer.

to perpetuate the fraud by making payments to existing investors from funds contributed by new investors, commonly referred to as “Ponzi” payments.

The securities fraud charge carries a maximum prison sentence of 20 years and a \$5

million fine. The wire fraud charge carries a maximum prison term of 20 years and a \$250,000 fine. The transactional money laundering charge carries a maximum prison term of 10 years and a fine of not more than twice the amount of criminally derived property in the transaction or \$250,000.

The details contained in the indictment are al-

legations. The defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.

The FBI’s Charlotte Field Office is leading the investigation.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Daniel Ryan and Mark Odulio of the U.S. Attorney’s Office in Charlotte are prosecuting the case.
