pregnant and was in fear for her safety, that Whitehead had threaten to cut the baby out of her belly. Victim did have visable injuries. A warrant was issued and Brett Whitehead was later arrested.

DUI

Taylor Savely, 25, Crestfield Lane Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Failure to Yield. Officer R. Miller LCPD, observed a black vehicle disregard the four way stop sign at Rocks Springs Road and McGhee Blvd. As the black vehicle proceeded up McGhee Blvd and onto Hwy 321 North, it was driving erratically by changing lanes without signals while at a high rate of speed. Timothy House, 49, Bon Street Lenoir City, was charged with Unlawful Carrying or Possession of a Weapon, Theft of Service Counterfeit Marks/ Logo, and Simple Possession x2. A search warrant was executed at an address on Bon Street, during the execution Timothy House was found in possession of Sch.VI approx.. 3 grams. House also had 9 blue capsules identified as Sch. II Amphetamine salts. An undercover Agent purchased several different purses from House which bore trademark names Michael Kors, Prada, Louis Vuitton, Gucci, Hermes, and Kate Spade. A caller to the FBI tip line reported seeing a man throwing a backpack off the Ravenel Bridge, which connects Charleston to Mt. Pleasant in coastal South Carolina. FBI special agents and intelligence analysts, working with local law enforcement, gathered evidence that led them to believe the

edge of the area's
waterways, the FBI
Columbia Field

sources and skills of
its mobility opera-
tors.

HRT, a selective and
specially trained unit
within the Bureau, is
called in to support
the field with com-
plex tactical situa-
tions. The Mobility
Team within HRT is
charged with deliv-
ering the people and
equipment needed to
execute any opera-
tion in any location
under any condi-
tions. HRT also has
a team of tactical
bomb technicians
who are trained to
handle explosive
devices under tense
and time-sensitive
conditions.

As three HRT heli-
copters took off from
Quantico, Virginia,
and HRT mobili-
ty operators drove
south with two river-
ine boats in tow, they
received word that a
bag washed ashore
on Laurel Island in

the Charleston Har-
bor. Charleston Po-
lice believed it was
the same bag that
was thrown off the
bridge and that it
likely contained ex-
plosive materials.

So began a three-
day exercise that
tested and honed
the skills of HRT's
tactical special
agent bomb techni-
cian and mobility
operator trainees in
a land, water, and
air-based training
operation involving
a dozen state and
local agencies. The
training also sup-
ported the efforts of
the FBI's Maritime
Liaison Program,
which works with
local and state agen-
cies to enhance the
security of the mar-
itime environment.

"The goal was to
build a realistic sce-
nario to exercise
a range of tech-
niques," said a for-
mer HRT mobility

team member who is
now a special agent
with the FBI's Co-
lumbia Field Office
and serves as one of
the division's mari-
time liaison agents.
By involving a large
number of local first
responders, he said
an exercise of this
type builds strong re-
lationships and cre-
ates greater trust.

"The local agencies
gain a better under-
standing of the FBI's
capabilities and spe-
cial equipment,"
the agent explained.
"The HRT trainees
see how incredibly
important it is to seek
out the local exper-
tise and collaborate
with regional and
state partners."

"No matter what
your abilities are,
you can become
overwhelmed by the
scope of the task,"
said Lt. Michael
Knox, SWAT com-
