Some of the most common and damaging Internet-enabled crimes begin with an employee clicking a link in an email that appears to be from a colleague, following the instructions in a message that looks like it came from a supervisor, or opening an account link or invoice that seems to be from a trusted vendor. "These routine actions can be what exposes a computer or an entire network to a ransomware attack, data breach, or another crime," said Gorham. 


