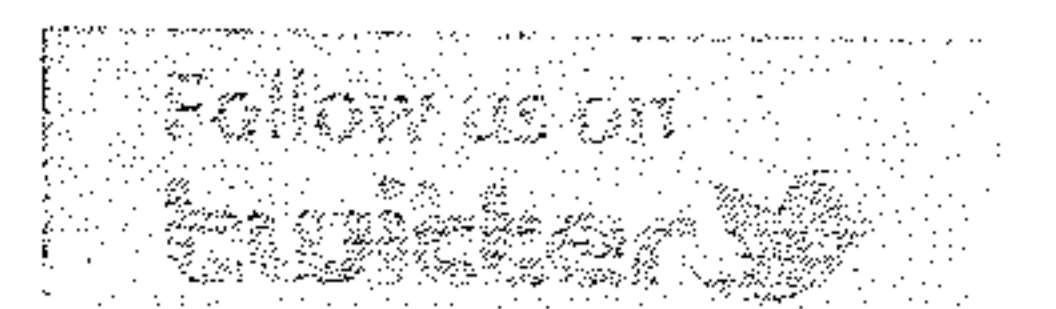
Scam Alert: Jury Duty Scams Resurface in East Tennessee

Some East Tennesseans continue to receive fraudulent phone calls and emails claiming they failed to appear for federal jury duty or respond to a federal court summons. The scammer tells the victim that he or she can avoid arrest by paying a fine im-

mediately and may request payment information or other personal information. The scammer also may request that the victim purchase a prepaid card, such as a Green Dot card or gift card, and deliver it to the scammer.

The scammer may

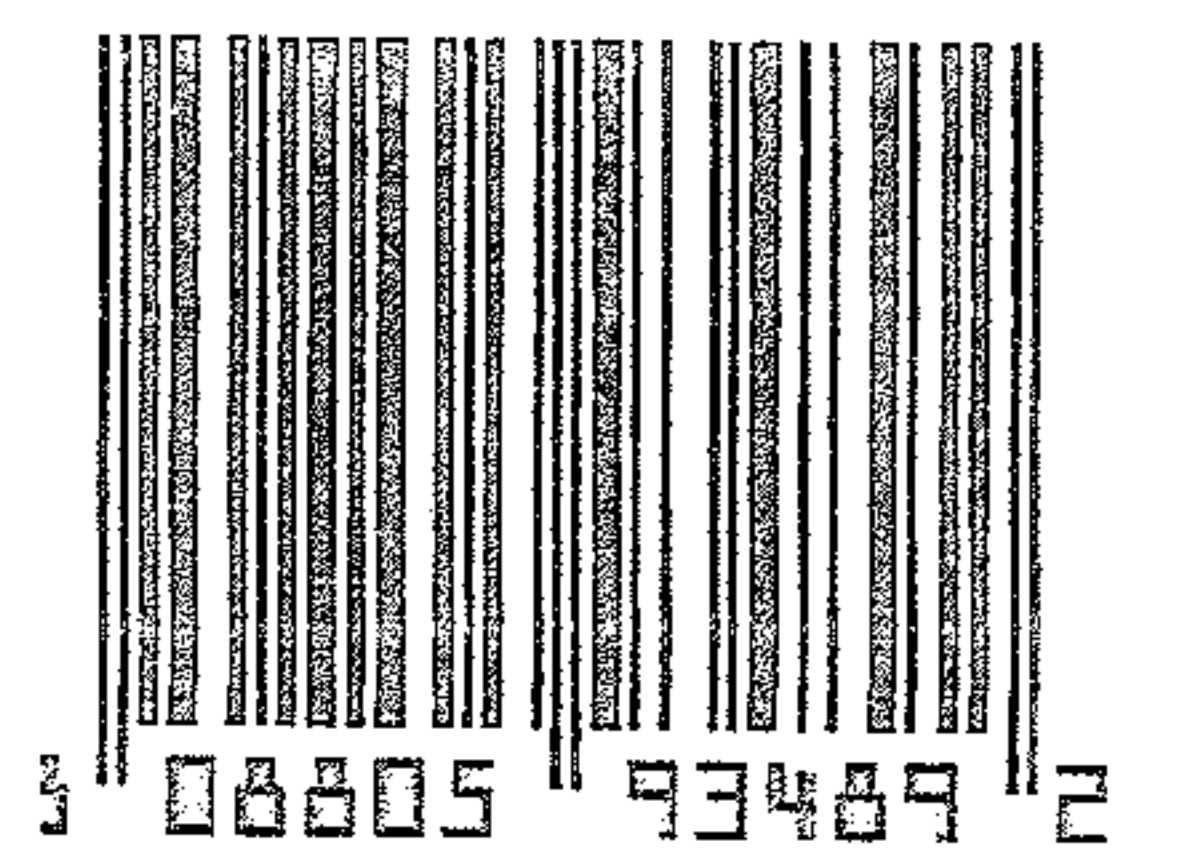

CDC, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), state and local health departments, and other clinical and public health partners are investigating a multistate outbreak of e-cigarette, or vaping, product use associated lung injury (EVALI). CDC has identified vitamin E acetate as a chemical of concern among people with e-cigarette, or vaping, prod-

an additive, most notably as a thickening agent in THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products. CDC recommends that people should not use THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products, particularly from informal sources like friends, or family, or in-person or online dealers. While this investigation is ongoing, vitamin E acetate should not be added to e-cigarette, or vaping, products.

In addition, people should not add any substance to e-cigarette or vaping products that are not intended by the manufacturer, including products purchased through retail establishments. CDC will continue to update guidance, as appropriate, as new data become available from this outbreak investigation.

CDC today announced the updated number of confirmed and probable lung injury cases and deaths associated with the use of e-cigarette, or vaping, products.

Patients with Lung Injury

As of November 13, 2019, there are 2,172 confirmed and probable lung injury cases associated with use of e-cigarette, or vaping, products were reported by 49 states (all except Alaska), the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Deaths

42 deaths have been confirmed in 24 states and the District of Columbia: Alabama, California (4), Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia (3), Illinois (4), Indiana (4), Kansas (2), Massachusetts (2), Michigan, Minnesota (3), Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Oregon (2), Pennsylvania, Tennessee (2), Texas, Utah, and Virginia.

New Laboratory Findings:

Analyses of bronchoalveolar lavage (BAL) fluid samples (fluid samples collected from the lungs) of patients with e-cigarette, or vaping, product use associated lung injury (EVALI) identified vitamin E acetate, an additive

in some THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products.

Recent CDC laboratory test results of BAL fluid samples from 29 patients submitted to CDC from 10 states found vitamin E acetate in all of the samples. THC was identified in 82% of the samples and nicotine was identified in 62% of the samples.

CDC tested for a range of

other chemicals that might be found in e-cigarette, or vaping, products, including plant oils, petroleum distillates like mineral oil, MCT oil, and terpenes (which are compounds found in or added to THC products). None of these chemicals of concern were detected in the BAL fluid samples tested.

This is the first time that

Scam

provide information like titles and badge numbers of legitimate law enforcement officers or court officials, names of federal judges, and courtroom addresses in an attempt to make the scam appear credible. Scammers may even "spoof" the phone number so that it appears to be from the Court or a government agency when it is not.

These phone calls and emails are not from the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

If someone receives such a call or email, they should not provide any personal information, credit card numbers, pre-paid cards, or money. Federal courts do not call prospective jurors and ask for money or personal identifying information over the telephone. If someone who actually has been summoned for jury duty fails to appear, that person will receive correspondence by U.S. Mail, not by phone

or email.

Here are some tips to avoid becoming the victim of this type of phone scam:

-Always be suspicious of unsolicited phone calls.

Never give money or personal information to someone with whom you don't have ties and did not initiate contact.

-Trust your instincts: if an unknown caller pressures you, or says things that don't sound right, hang up!

-If concerns remain about the caller's claims, verify the information with the appropriate law enforcement agency or court officials.

-Anyone receiving a jury duty / failure to appear scam phone call should report it, with a description of the caller and any available caller ID information, to their local or FBI office or online with the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3)

we have detected a chemical of concern in biologic samples from patients with these lung injuries. These findings provide direct evidence

of vitamin E acetate at the primary site of injury within the lungs.

These findings complement the ongoing work of FDA external icon and some state public health laboratories to characterize e-liquid exposures and inform the ongoing multi-state outbreak.

About the Outbreak: As of November 20, 2019, 2,290* cases of e-cigarette, or vaping, product use associated lung injury (EVALI) have been reported to CDC from 49 states (all except Alaska), the District of Columbia, and 2 U.S. territories (Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands).

Forty-seven deaths have been confirmed in 25 states and the District of Columbia (as of November 20, 2019).

CDC will still collect data the week of November 24 –

30, 2019; however, updates to the latest outbreak information including case counts and death will not be available until December 5, 2019 due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

Latest outbreak information is updated every Thursday.

CDC continues to work closely with FDA, states, public health partners, and clinicians on this investigation.

About Patient Exposure:

All EVALI patients have reported a history of using e-cigarette, or vaping, products.

Vitamin E acetate has been identified as a chemical of concern among people with e-cigarette, or vaping, product use associated lung injury (EVALI).

THC is present in most of the samples tested by FDA to date, and most

patients report a history of using THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products.

The latest national and state findings suggest THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products, particularly from informal sources like friends, or family, or in-person or online dealers, are linked to most of the cases and play a major role in the outbreak.

Public Notice

The City of Philadelphia Mayor and Board of Aldermen will hold a public hearing at 6:45 p.m. on Monday, December 14, 2019 at 400 Church Street to receive public comments regarding amending the 2007-01 Philadelphia Floodplan Ordinance be replacing it with the Amended Philadelphia Floodplan Ordinance. Tax

Georgia Tire and Service Center. Charles White's bond was set at \$5,000; Tami White's bond was set at \$15,000.

On Wednesday, the Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted Charles White on one Class C felony count of theft of property over \$10,000, four Class E felony counts of falsification of sales tax returns, and one Class E felony count of sales tax evasion related to his former business, Dodds Avenue Tire and Wheel. The Grand Jury also indicted his wife, Tami, on one Class A felony count of theft of property over \$250,000, 35 Class E felony counts of falsification of sales tax returns, and one Class E felony count of sales tax evasion related to both Dodds Avenue Tire and Wheel and the Tennessee Georgia Tire and Service Center.

"The Department of Revenue promotes voluntary taxpayer compliance by educating taxpayers, aggressively pursuing criminal sanctions and demanding accountability when taxpayers engage in fraudulent activity," Revenue Commissioner David Gerregano said. "This indictment underscores the Department's ongoing efforts to enforce Tennessee's tax laws."

If convicted, Charles White could be sentenced to a maximum of six years in the state penitentiary and fined up to \$10,000 for theft of property. Tami White could be sentenced to a maximum of 25 years in the state penitentiary and fined up to \$50,000 for theft of property. Each faces a maximum of two years and up to \$3,000 for each tax charge. The Department is pursuing this criminal case in cooperation with District Attorney General Neal Pinkston's office. Citizens

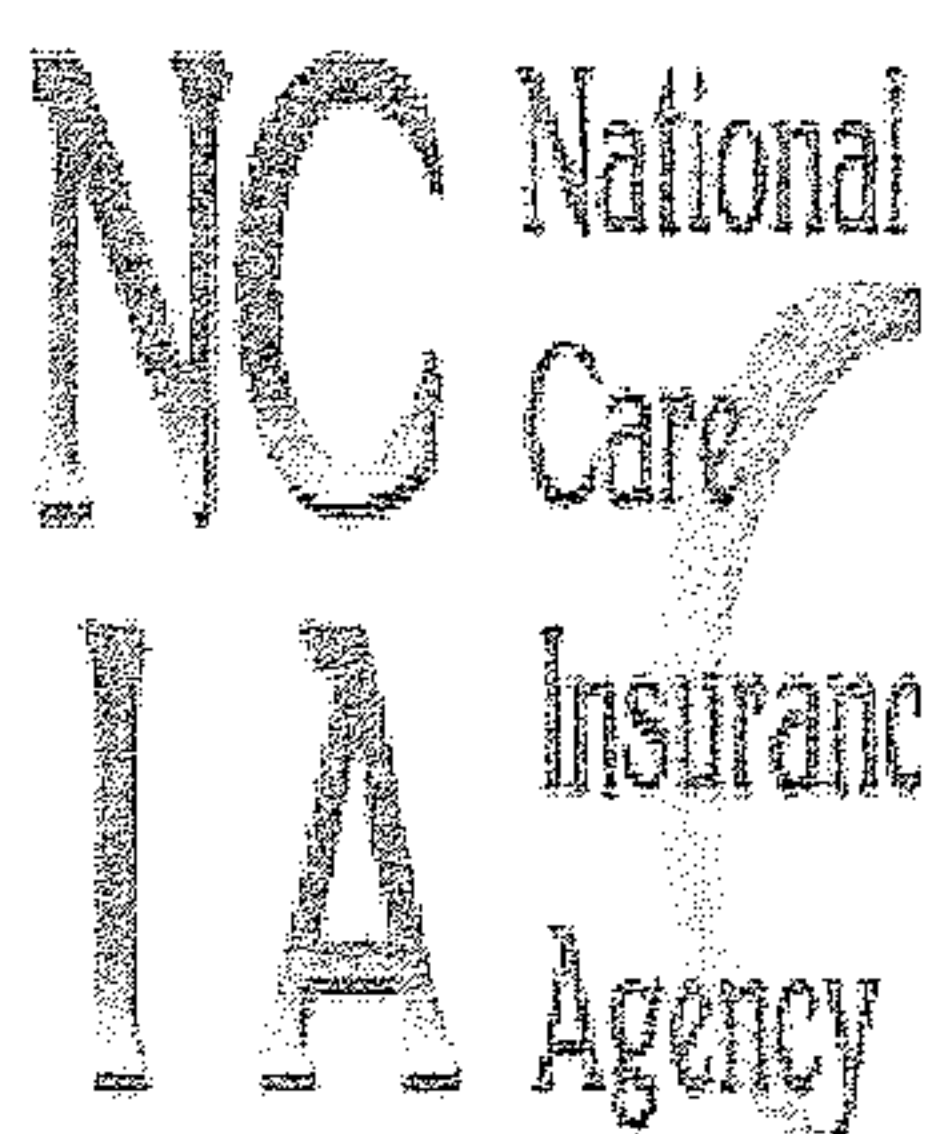
