## Lemur

An intruder had used bolt cutters open encloto sures and release a group of capuchin monkeys and ring-tailed lemurs. The staff accounted for all but one of the animals— Isaac, the oldest ring-tailed lemur in North Amer-Ring-tailed ica. typically lemurs live about 20 to 25 years; Isaac was 32 at the time.

"It was definitely alarming," said Ethan Fisher, executive director of the Santa Ana Zoo. "He is a senior animal, and all of the primates have special care. They specialized have diets formulated for their species." But Isaac wasn't missing for long. Someone dropped him off in a plastic storage container in front of a hotel later that day. A note in the conexplained tainer that the lemur had been taken from the Santa Ana Zoo.

After Isaac's safe return, the question remained who took him? few months later, Aquinas Kasbar, 19, was arrested on unrelated charges and bragged to his bail agent that he'd stolen a lemur from the zoo. He even showed the bail agent a video on his phone of himself with the lemur, according to Detective Farshid Hashempour the Santa Ana Police Department, who investigated the case as part of an FBI task force. Investigators learned that Kasbar had broken into the zoo with the intention of taking a monkey for a pet, but he couldn't get any of

While the crime may seem like a harmless prank, theft of an endangered animal is no that's where the FBI came in.
