#### DUI

Once at the jail the powdery substance was tested which came back positive for Fentanyl.



> The Threatened and Endangered Species list is presented to the TFWC every odd year and presented for approval to the TFWC for approval at its February meeting. This year's endangered Tennessee list includes 14 species of crayfish, nine species of fish, two amphibians, one bird (Bachman's sparrow). There are 30 additional species on the state threatened list and 92 species on the state's need of management list.
