The audit includes 12 findings and eight observations focusing on several campus operations including security and safety, mental health services, student and faculty engagement, facilities, strategic plans and performance measures, tuition affordability, and athletics programs.

A broad summary of below:

-The Board should encourage collaboration, coordination of resources, and communication between UT campuses to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of the UT system. (Finding 1 and Observation 3) -The Board should increase its oversight of various academic and nonacademic areas to ensure UT is meeting its strategic and operational goals. The Board has a duty to oversee strategic planning, academics, admissions, tuition,

retention, student conduct and satisfaction, facility maintenance. and athletic operations. (Findings 2, 9, 11, and 12 and Observations 4, 6, and 8)

-The UT Board must increase its oversight of student safety and campus security and ensure the accurate and complete reporting of safety and crime information. (Findings 3 through 10 and Observation 5)

-The UT Board should ensure the UT System monitors the mental the results is shown health services offered by each UT campus. (Finding 11)
