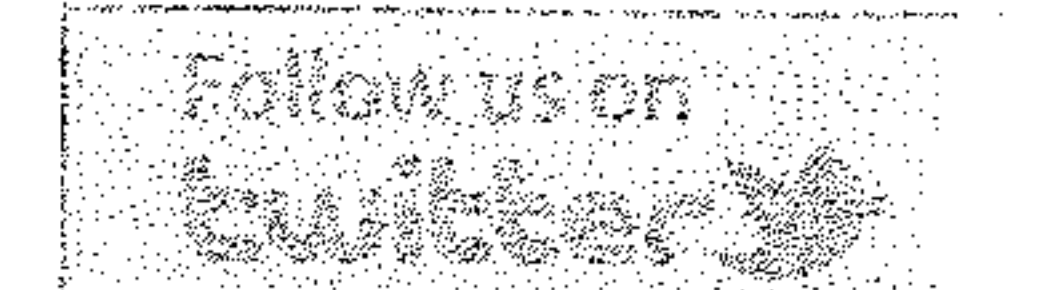

Child Predator Sentenced To 300 Months For Enticement And Child Pornography Offenses

Justin Kyle Phelps, 27, of Philadelphia, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable Pamela L. Reeves, U.S. District Judge, to serve 300 months in federal prison for enticing and attempting to entice minors for sex and using a minor to engage in sexually

explicit conduct for the purpose of producing child pornography. Following his release from prison, Phelps will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for 10 years and be required to register with the sex offender registry in

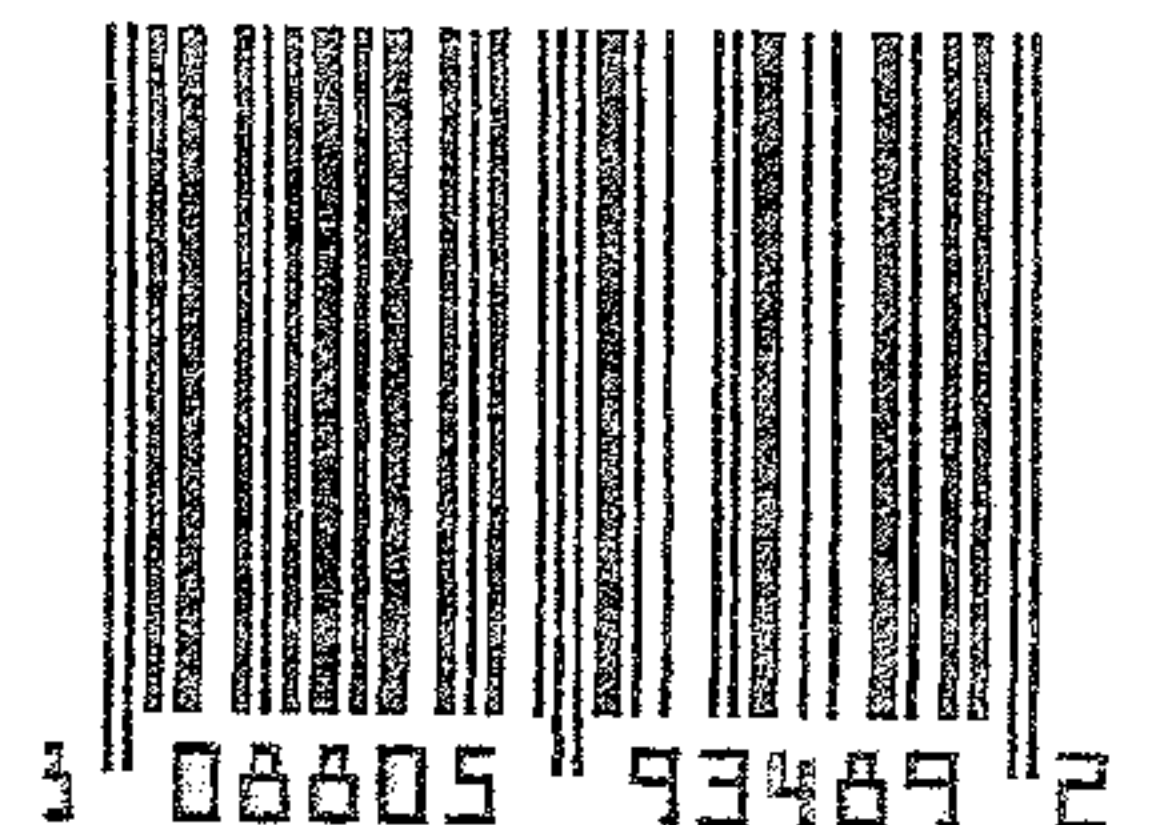

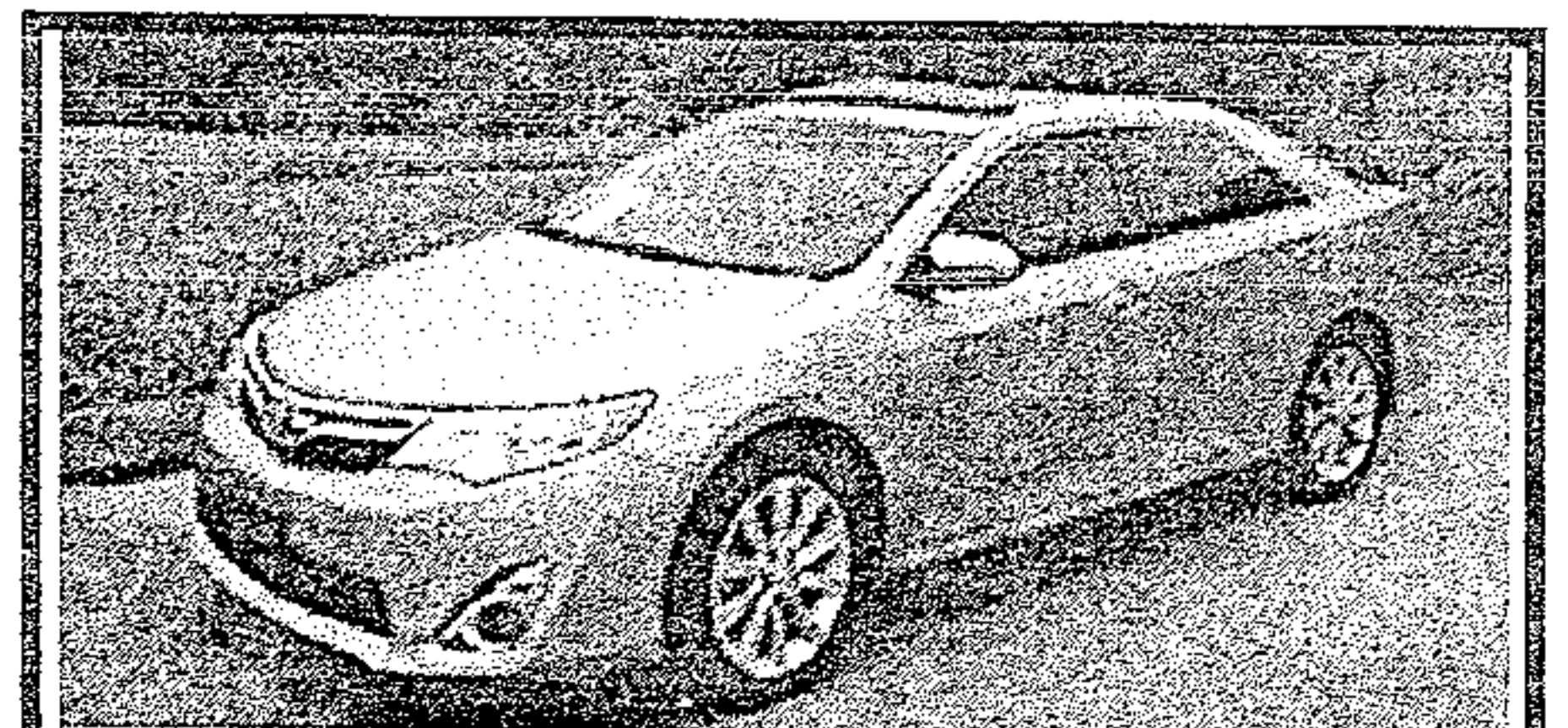

anything illegal in the vehicle or on his person. Bertram stated he had a rig used to consume meth. Bertram gave consent for search, before Deputy began Bertram stated he had a bag of dope in his underwear. Bertram produced a baggy containing about

1.2 grams of a crystal substance believed to be meth. The passenger was identified as Ashley Wilson, who had an active warrant out of Loudon County. Deputy ask Wilson if she had anything illegal on her she stated a baggy in her underwear. Upon arrival at the jail

Cpl. Snow did locate in Wilson underwear a pink baggy containing about half a gram of meth.

DUI

Stephanie Mangan, 52, Deerfield Lane Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent. Deputy Kevin Parks LCSO, responded to Northshore at Deerfield Lane in reference to a single vehicle accident. any state in which he resides, works, or attends school.

In March 2017, Phelps was arrested when he traveled to Knoxville for the purpose of meeting a minor female for sex. The investigation revealed that he had victimized several minors between the ages of 12 and 15 years, including having sex with some of them and obtaining pornographic photographs of other minors taken at his direction. In July 2018, Phelps pleaded guilty to knowingly enticing and attempting to entice minors through social media for illegal sexual activity.

"Online predators are constantly looking for children to sexually abuse. This prosecution represents part of our efforts to work with law enforcement agencies to protect children from persons who seek to manipulate kids, from the shadows of the internet, for illegal sex and child pornography," said J. Douglas Overbey, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

This investigation was conducted by the Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children Unit and the

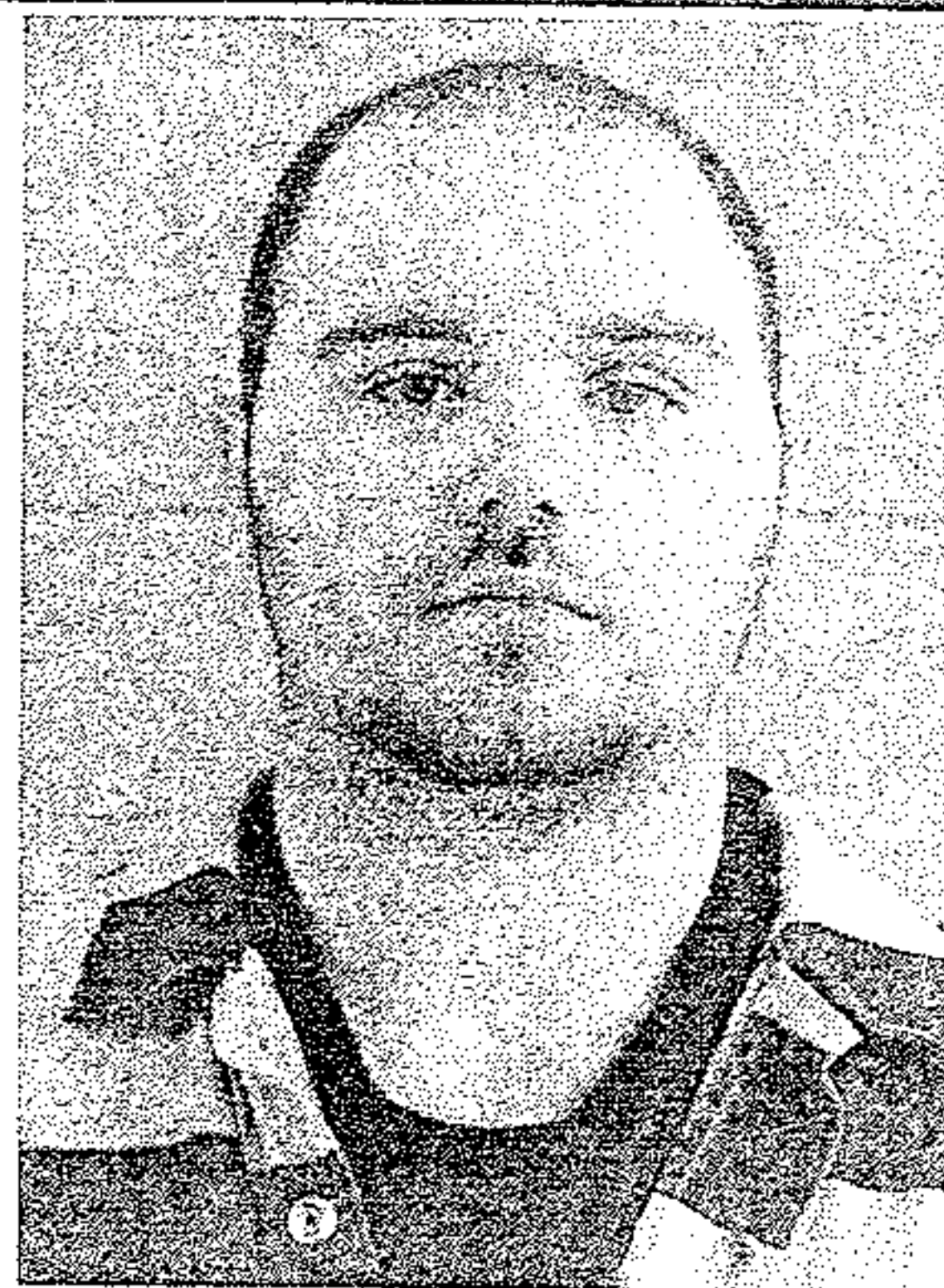
U.S. Department of Homeland Security - Homeland Security Investigations. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States in court proceedings.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.

Drinks At A Birthday Lead To DUI

Justin Moore, 21, Emory Drive Harri-man, was charged with DUI. Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a red vehicle traveling south on Hwy 321 in the area of Vineyard Road with its high beams activated. The driver failed to dim the lights as it passed Deputy. While Deputy was pacing the vehicle

Drugs

Buford, also known as "Tae," 18, Knoxville, TN, and Lejuan Dawkins, also known as "Lay," 29, of Detroit, MI. This case has not yet been set for trial.

The indictment, on file with the U.S. District Court, alleges

that the defendants conspired with one another and others to distribute and possess with intent to distribute one kilogram or more of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of heroin, a Schedule I controlled substance, in the Eastern District of Tennessee. In addition, among the four defendants, there are five counts of distribution of a controlled substance, three counts of possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, four counts of possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime, and two counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

If convicted of the conspiracy charge alone, each defendant faces a minimum mandatory term of at least 10

years and up to life in prison, at least five years of supervised release, a fine of up to \$10,000,000, any applicable forfeiture, and a \$100 special assessment.

Today, the United States faces an unprecedented drug epidemic. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) estimates that more than 70,000 Americans died of drug overdoses in 2017. Many of these deaths are attributed to the increased abuse of potent and dangerous synthetic opioids like fentanyl. These charges are the result of investigations supported by the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OC-DETF) under the Attorney General-led Synthetic Opioid Surge (SOS)/Special Operations Division (SOD) Project Clean Sweep. This initiative seeks to reduce the supply of synthetic opioids

in "hot spot" areas previously identified by the Attorney General of the United States, thereby reducing drug overdoses and drug overdose deaths, and identify wholesale distribution networks and sources of supply operating nationally and internationally.

The investigation and seizure of evidence was conducted by the Drug Related Death Task Force of the Knoxville Police Department, who partnered with the Knox County District Attorney's Office,

the Knox County Sheriff's Office, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, the Drug Enforcement Administration, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Knox County Regional Forensics Center, and the U.S. Marshal's Service. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Tracy L. Stone and Brent N. Jones, designated as the Eastern District of Tennessee's Synthetic Opioid Surge AUSA, will represent the United States.
