

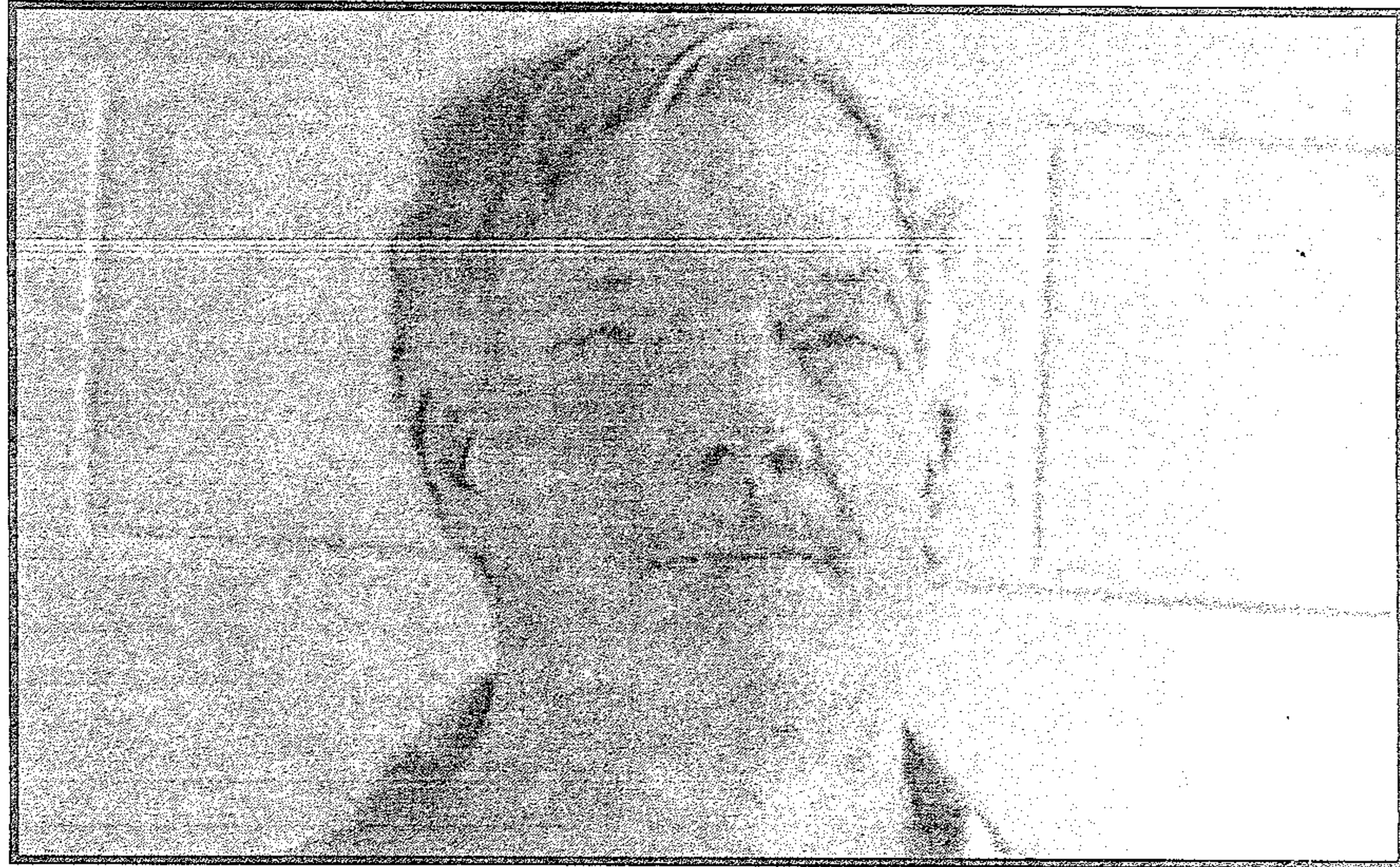

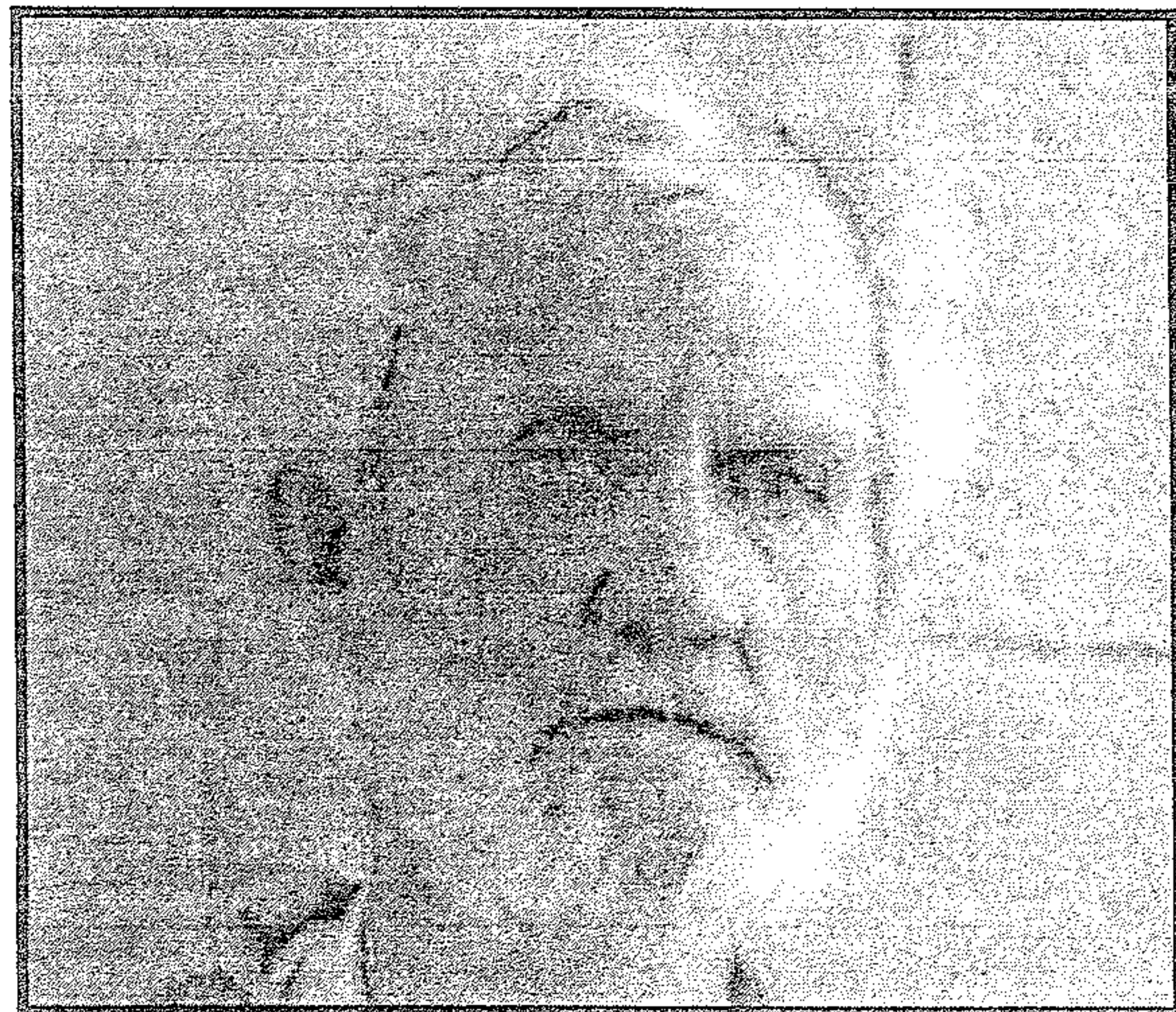

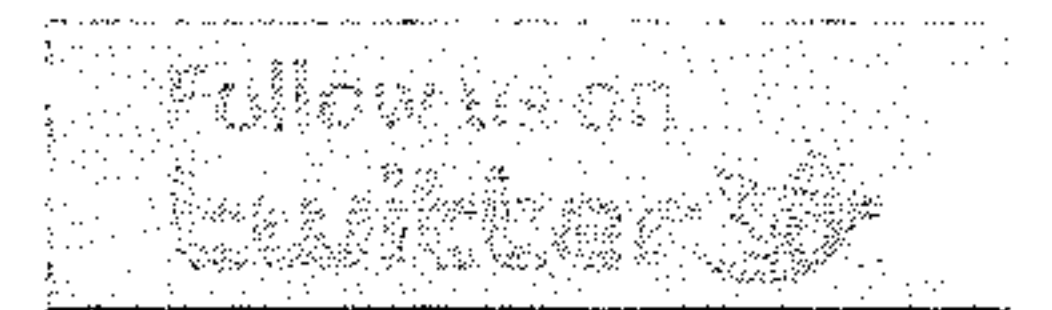

A first-ever CDC analysis provides comprehensive estimates of the potential to improve Americans' health by preventing Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). ACEs can include experiencing abuse, witnessing violence or substance misuse in the home, and having a parent in jail. Exposure to ACEs can result in extreme or repetitive toxic stress responses that can

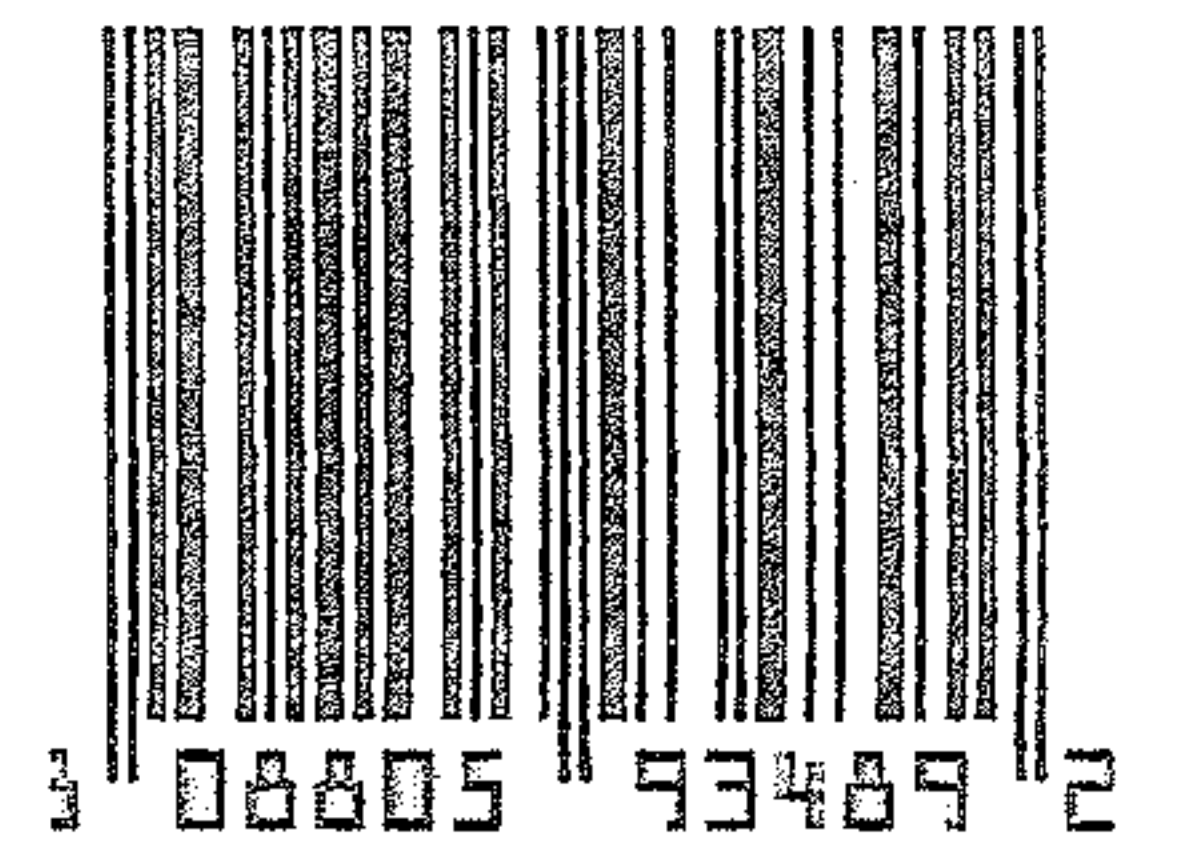

**Abuse**

Michael Mattison, 49, Bon Street Lenoir City, was charged with Child Abuse or Neglect. Officer from the LCPD was dispatched to E. Broadway in reference to a possible child abuse. Upon arrival Officer Dishner made contact with the complainant. The complainant advised she was at work and received a text message that advised Michael Mattison was

intoxicated and had been abusing the victim juvenile. In the text message was a picture of marks on the victim back. Officer responded to Bon Street where he made contact with Michael Mattison, witness and the victim. During the investigation Officer observed numerous marks and bruises on victim back, left side that followed his rib cage that were approx.. 6 inches or greater in length, and

marks on his lower back, right shoulder blade area and near his collar bone. Victim advised that Mattison laid on top of him, bit him and tried to choke him, because he was drink-

ing. Officer determined that the injuries were other than accidental. Mattison should have known that his action could have resulted in injuries based on

the size difference. The victim was taken to Tennessee Children's Hospital for medical attention. A DCS referral has been completed. Michael Mattison was placed under arrest.

### Coach

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that Vicki Anderson, the former Germantown Middle School majorette coach, pocketed at least \$1,418 in student fees that she wasn't authorized to keep.

A sign on the side of a buildingDescription automatically generatedAnderson collected at least \$2,000 from students in May 2018 when she hosted a one-day summer camp at a local hotel in Memphis, Tennessee. The Shelby County School District was not aware the camp was being held, and Anderson was not authorized by the district to hold the camp or collect money from students.

Investigators determined that Anderson spent \$582 for six hotel rooms and food. She kept the remaining \$1,418 for herself. The school district not only requires prior authorization for activities held over the summer, it requires any money collected to be deposited with the financial secretary of the school. Anderson was trained on proper financial procedures for school support organizations in August 2017.

The school system ter-

minated Anderson's employment on May 17, 2019. In November 2019, Vicki Anderson was indicted by the Shelby County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$1,000 and two counts of official misconduct.

### Warrants

Nicholas Christian, 57, E Hwy 11 Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Simple Possession, and Poss. Of Drug Para. Officer C. Watson LCPD, responded to Hwy 321 for a welfare check. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Nicholas Christian in a red vehicle in the parking lot of Pure Magic Carwash. Christian was asleep in the vehicle, once Officer made contact he detected a odor of marijuana omitting from the vehicle. Officer had Christian to exit the vehicle and Officer performed a safety pat down on Christian. A check of Christian through dispatch revealed 3 active warrants out of Knox County. A search of the vehicle Officer located a clear meth pipe, and several pieces of a crystal substance believed to be meth, was located in the floorboard, and a clear baggy containing a green leafy substance was located in Christians jacket pocket. Nicholas Christian was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

### Rescheduled Regular Meeting Martel Utility District Board of Commissioners

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Commissioners for the Martel Utility District of Loudon County, Tennessee (the "District") for this December has been rescheduled. Pursuant to TCA §7-82-308(e), the District's Board of Commissioners (the "Board") will meet in open, regular session on Thursday, December 12, 2019, at 1:00 p.m. (local prevailing time) at the District's office located at 6875 Lakeview Road in Lenoir City, Tennessee for the purpose of conducting its regular monthly agenda and considering all matters presented by the District's general manager or legal counsel, which shall include without limitation reviewing, discussing, considering for approval, or taking other action as may be necessary or required on the following agenda items:

- (i) a utility agreement between the District and the City of Lenoir City, Tennessee (the "City") providing for the consolidation of the District with the City as a separate City utility department (the "Consolidation Agreement");
- (ii) a resolution of the Board proposing the consolidation of the District with the City as a separate City utility department by transferring all of the District's property and obligations to the City as authorized by T. C. A. § 7-82-202(f), approving the Consolidation Agreement, and authorizing all necessary or required actions related thereto;
- (iii) a winddown plan for the District detailing various target dates for taking action and providing other final directions to District management and employees for the planned winddown of the District's business affairs and operations, including without limitation the payoff of the District's outstanding RUS bond, payment of final salaries, benefits and severance payments to District employees, submittal of all required tax reports and any required payments of sales tax and withholding obligations to the State of Tennessee and the Treasury of the United States as applicable, purchase of tail insurance coverage, and all other items necessary to properly winddown the District's operations and affairs and transfer the same to the City without interruption of service and a minimum of inconvenience to the District's customers; and
- (iv) such other documents, agreements or matters that may be brought to the attention of the Board by its general manager or legal counsel and recommended to the Board for consideration, approval or other action by the Board and that are necessary or required to properly prepare for and complete the proper winddown of the District's business affairs and operations and the transfer of the District's property and obligations to the City in accordance with the Consolidation Agreement and all applicable provisions of law.

cause both immediate and long-term physical and emotional harms.

At least five of the top 10 leading causes of death are associated with ACEs. Preventing ACEs could potentially reduce chronic diseases, risky health behaviors, and socioeconomic challenges later in life. These findings appear in CDC's latest Vital Signs report, which examines the associations between ACEs and 14 negative outcomes. CDC analyzed data from 25 states that included ACE questions in the Behavior Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) from 2015 through 2017. State survey data were used to estimate long-term health and social outcomes in adults that contribute to leading causes of illness and death and reduced access to life opportunities.

ACEs are common and their impacts add up over time. CDC scientists analyzed data from more than 144,000 adults and found:

-ACEs are linked to chronic health problems, mental health, substance misuse, and reduced educational and occupational achievement.

-Preventing ACEs has the potential to reduce leading causes of death such as heart disease, cancer, respiratory disease, diabetes, and suicide.

-ACEs prevention can have a positive impact on education and employment levels.

### Key findings

-Adults reporting the highest level of ACEs exposure had increased odds of having chronic health conditions, depression, current smoking, heavy drinking, and socioeconomic challenges like current unemployment, compared to those reporting no ACEs.

-Women, American Indian/Alaskan Natives, and African Americans/Blacks were more likely to experience four or more ACEs.

-Preventing ACEs could have reduced the number of adults who had heart disease by as much as 13% – up to 1.9 million avoided cases, using 2017 national estimates.

-Preventing ACEs could have reduced the number of adults who were overweight/obese by as much as 2% – up to 2.5 million avoided cases of overweight/obesity, using 2017 national estimates.

-Preventing ACEs could have reduced the number of adults with depression by as much as 44% –

up to 21 million avoided cases of depression, using 2017 national estimates.

CDC is working to understand and prevent ACEs

CDC works to prevent ACEs and lessen their negative effects. These efforts include:

-Educating states and communities about effective social and economic supports that address financial hardship and other conditions that put families at risk for ACEs.

-Encouraging employers to adopt and support family-friendly policies such as paid family leave and flexible work schedules. <https://go.usa.gov/xVa6m> external icon

-Increasing access to programs that

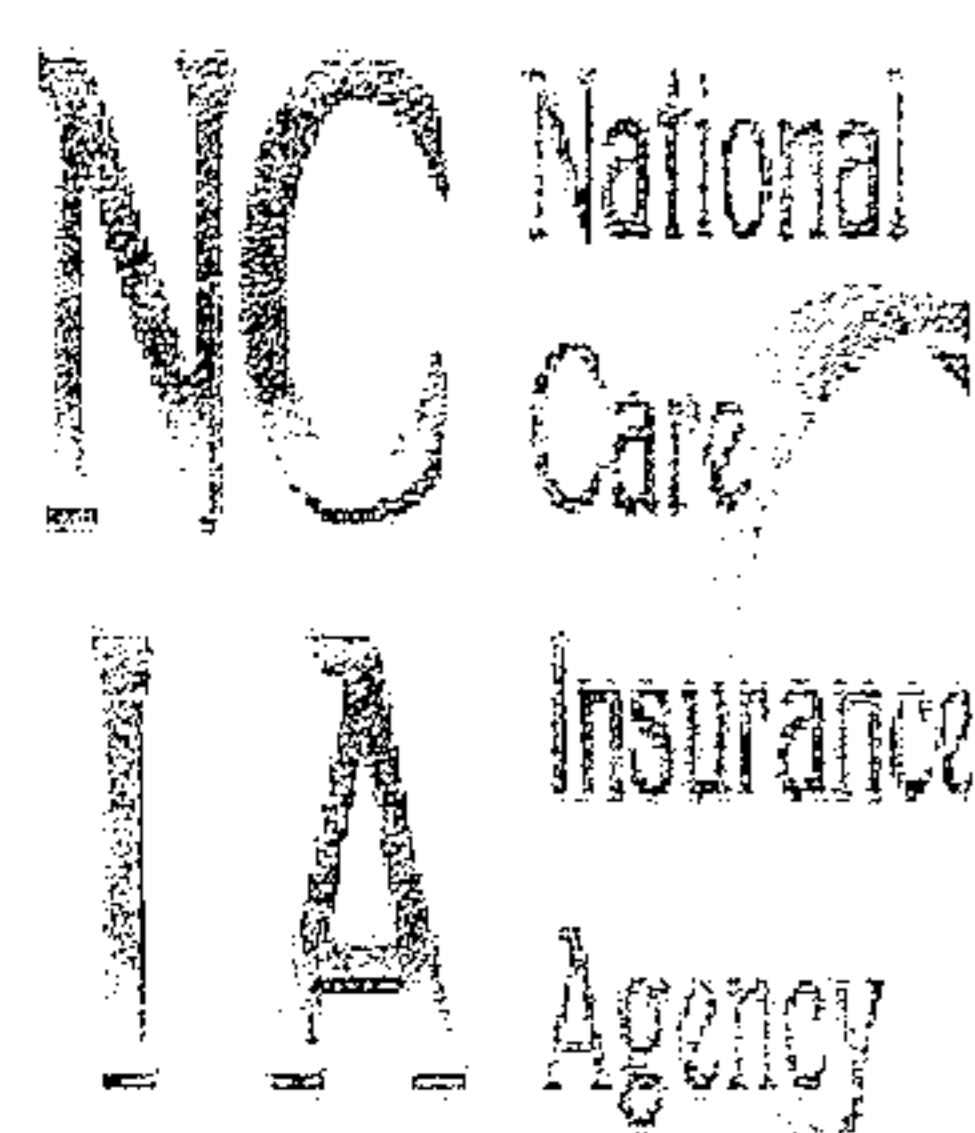
