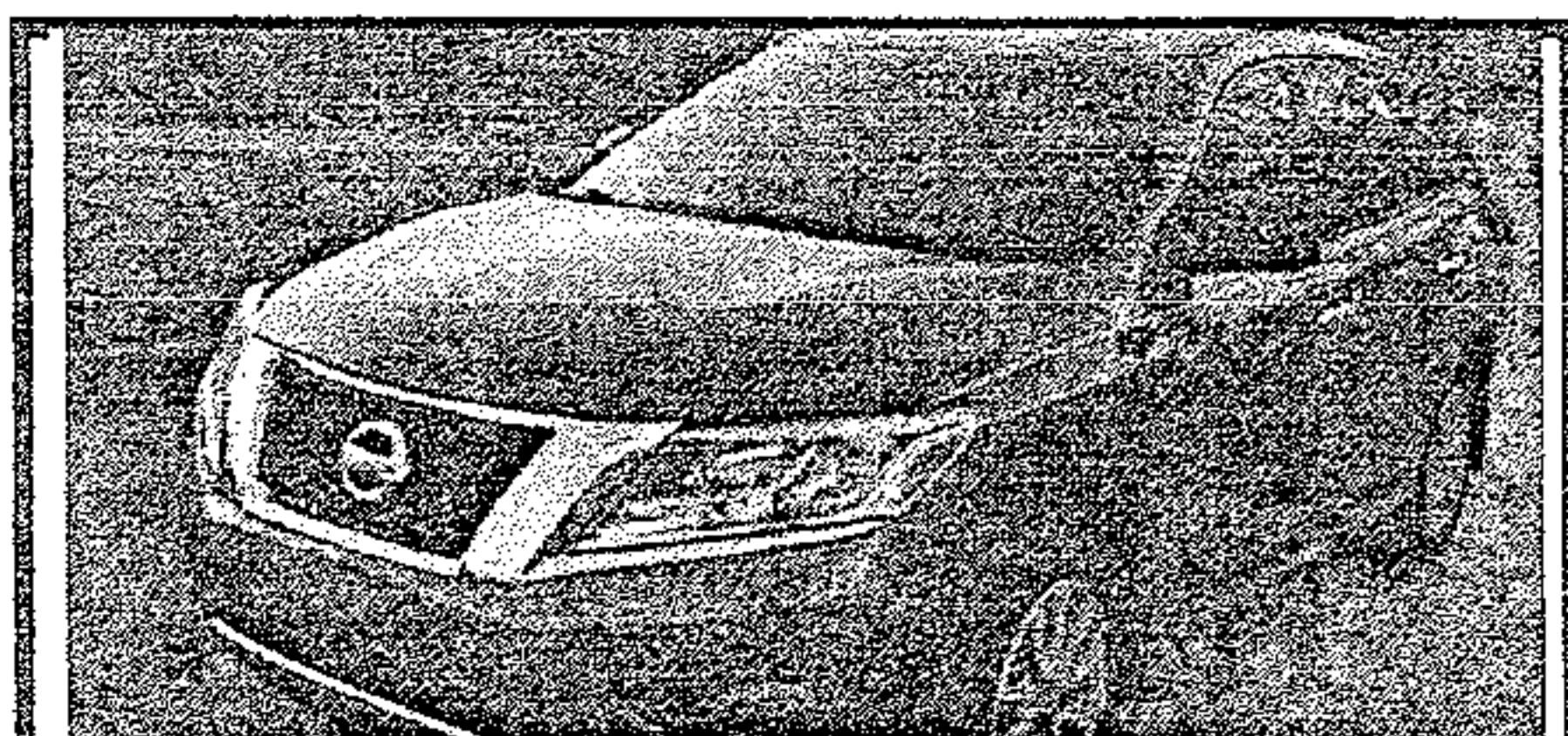
Cook if she had anything illegal in the vehicle she stated she had a pipe and some marijuana. Officer ask Cook to get the items and she retrieved a meth pipe

 from between the back seat. Cook then retrieved a bag of marijuana 1.5 grams from her purse. Officer ask if she had anything else she stated she had some meth (.20) grams in her pants. Cook also had 2 bags of meth one weighing 4.7 and the other 1.8 in her bra.

Upon searching the vehicle Cpl. Hutchens found a meth pipe under the driver seat where Fredrick Pipkin was sitting, he stated it was his. Upon Officer Samuels searching Sharon Cook purse he located 11 clonazepam, in her wallet. All parties were placed under arrest.

DUI

Jimmy Foster, 68, Old Stage Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, False Report/Statement, Leaving the Scene of Accident, and Violation of Implied Consent. Deputies were dispatched to the area of Old Stage Road and Wilkerson Lane for a vehicle wrecked with nobody around it. While in route Deputies were dispatched to Old Stage Road to a vehicle being stolen. with noting the commendable accuracy of the well know TV series "Band of Brothers". Colonel Edmands drew much of his detailed briefing from his own research in Europe where he followed the trail of this famous US Army unit as they fought the Germans across Europe. Starting with their initial training in the mountains of North Georgia and following them through their tough assignments in Europe from parachuting into France on D Day to capturing Hitler's Eagle's Nest at Berchtesgaden.

This unit took over 150% casualties and considered the Purple Heart a badge of office. Attending this meeting to add to details of his own exploits during World War II, was Purple Heart precipitant, 98 year old PFC Clinton E. Riddle of Sweetwater, TN. PFC Riddle participated in six major campaigns, two with the 325th Glider Infantry Regiments and four with the 82nd Airborne Division. Riddle was a co-pilot within the Glider Infantry; during the war casualties in the glider aircraft units were around 60 percent. Collect

\$7,782,647.37 was collected in criminal actions and \$1,958,422.64 was collected in civil actions.

Additionally, the Eastern District of Tennessee worked with other U.S. Attorney's offices and components of the Department of Justice to collect an additional \$42,948,325.81 in cases pursued jointly with these offices. Of this amount, \$32,298.67 was collected in criminal actions and \$42,916,027.14 was collected in civil actions.

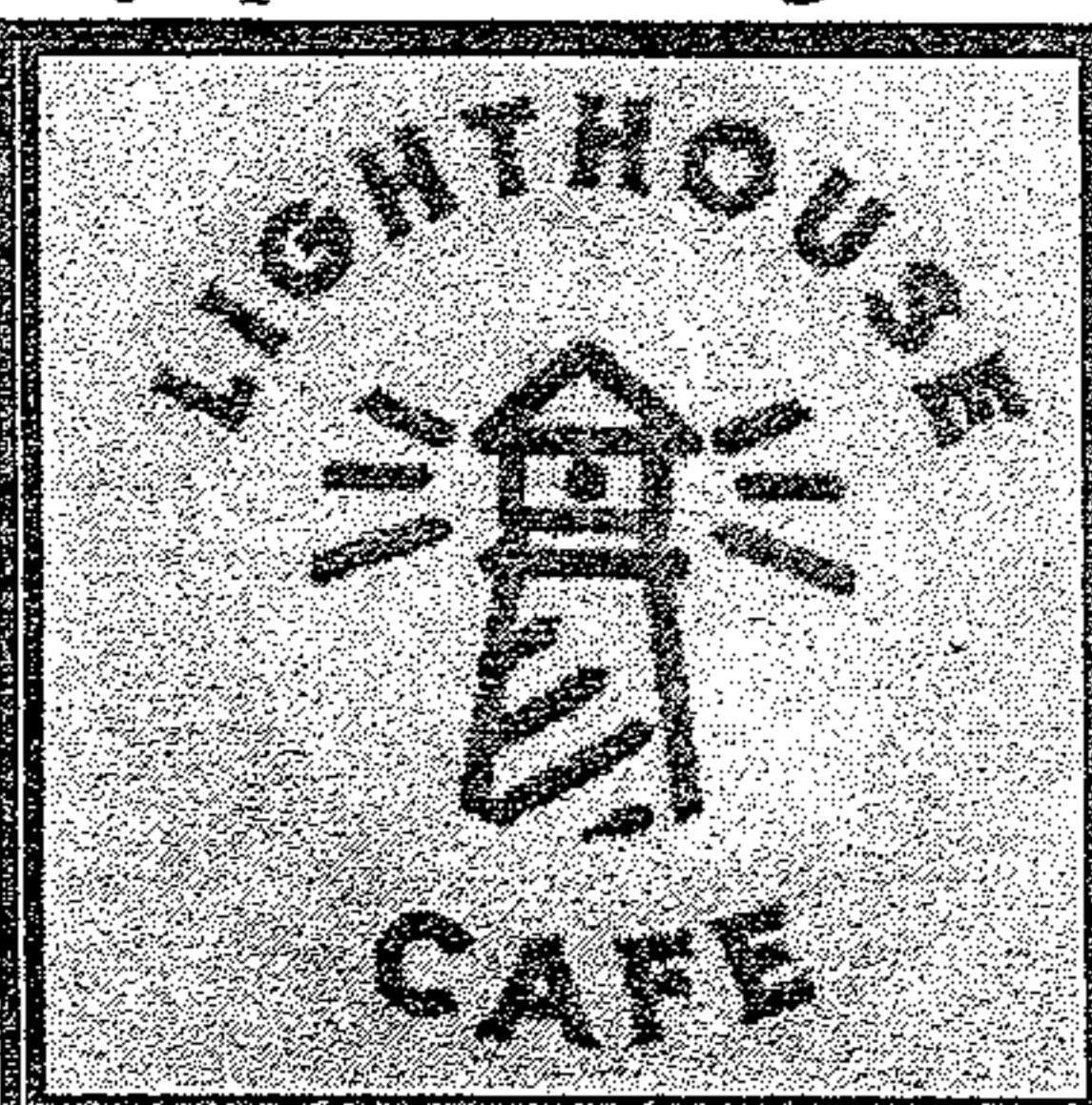
As a whole, the Justice Department collected nearly \$15 billion in civil and criminal actions in the fiscal year ending Sept. 30, 2018. The \$14,839,821,650 in

collections in FY 2018 represents nearly seven times the appropriated \$2.13 billion (\$2,136,750,000) budget for the 94 U.S. Attorneys' offices.

U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey praised the hard work of the Assistant U.S. Attorneys and the Monetary Recovery Unit in his office stating, "In addition to protecting the public by prosecuting and

locking up criminals, the overall mission of the U.S. Attorney's Office includes helping to compensate victims to the fullest extent possible. Restitution, fines and assessments collected by our office benefit all victims of crime. Collected restitution is paid directly to the victims of the crimes for whom it was ordered, while collected fines and assessments are paid to

the Crime Victims' Fund to fund state victim compensation and assistance programs."

"The men and women of the U.S. Attorneys' offices across the country work diligently, day in and day out, to see that the citizens of our nation receive justice. The money that we are able to recover for victims and this country as a whole is a direct result of their hard work," Director James A. Crowell, IV, Executive Office for U.S. Attorneys.

The U.S. Attorneys' Offices, along with the department's litigating divisions, are responsible for en-

forcing and collecting civil and criminal debts owed to the U.S. and criminal debts owed to federal crime victims. The law requires defendants to pay restitution to victims of certain federal crimes who have suffered a physical injury or financial loss. While restitution is paid to the victim, criminal fines and felony assessments are paid to the department's Crime Victims Fund, which distributes the funds collected to federal and state victim compensation and assistance programs.

The largest civil collections were

from affirmative civil enforcement cases in which the United States recovered government money lost to fraud or other misconduct or collected fines imposed on individuals and/or corporations for violations of federal health, safety, civil rights, or environmental laws. In addition, civil debts were collected on behalf of several federal agencies, including the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Internal Revenue Service, the Small Business Administration, and the Department of Education.

Additionally, the U.S. Attorney's office for the Eastern District of Tennessee, working

with partner agencies and divisions, collected \$5,539,839.00 in asset forfeiture actions in FY 2018. Forfeited assets deposited into the Department of Justice Assets Forfeiture Fund are used to restore funds to crime

victims and for a variety of law enforcement purposes.

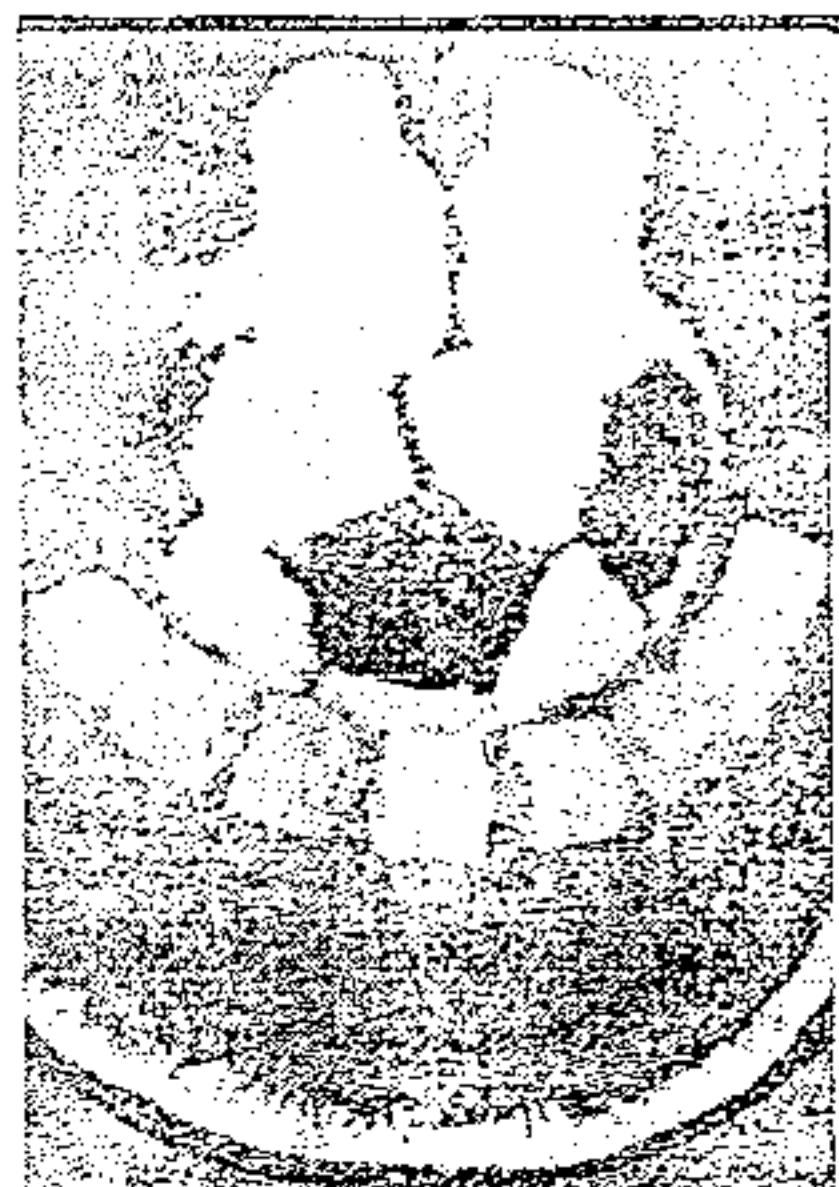


