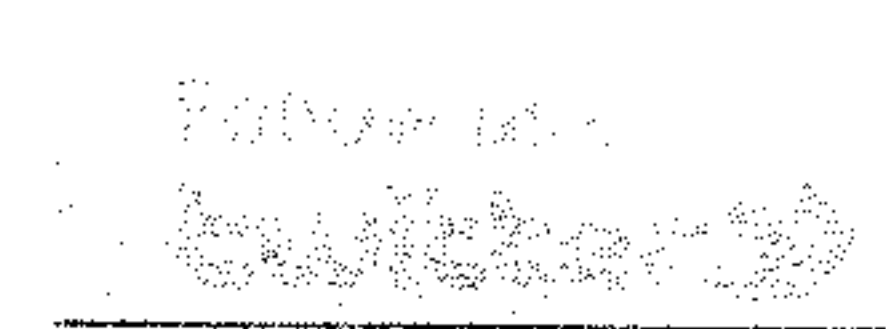

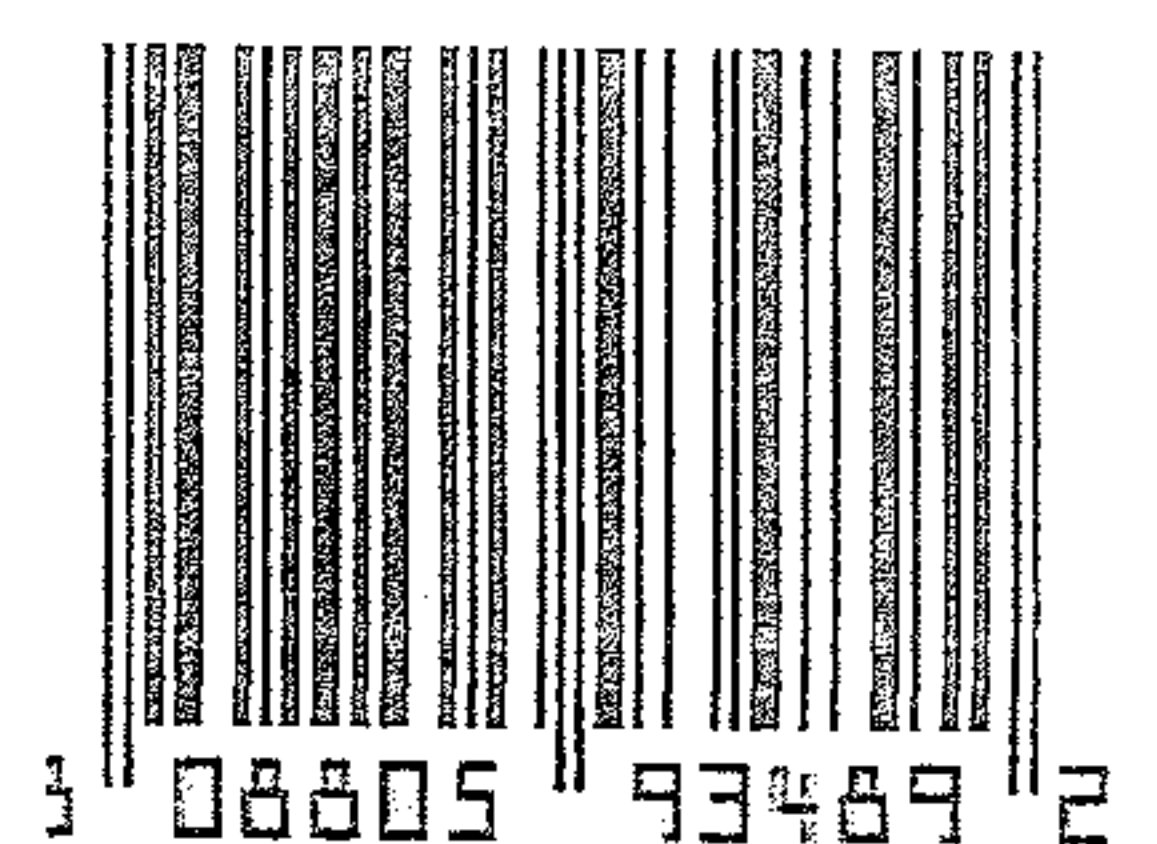

Tommy Parris. The conversation were sexual in nature and included Parris wishing he had gotten a video or naughty pic. Parris recalled a time when they had sex-

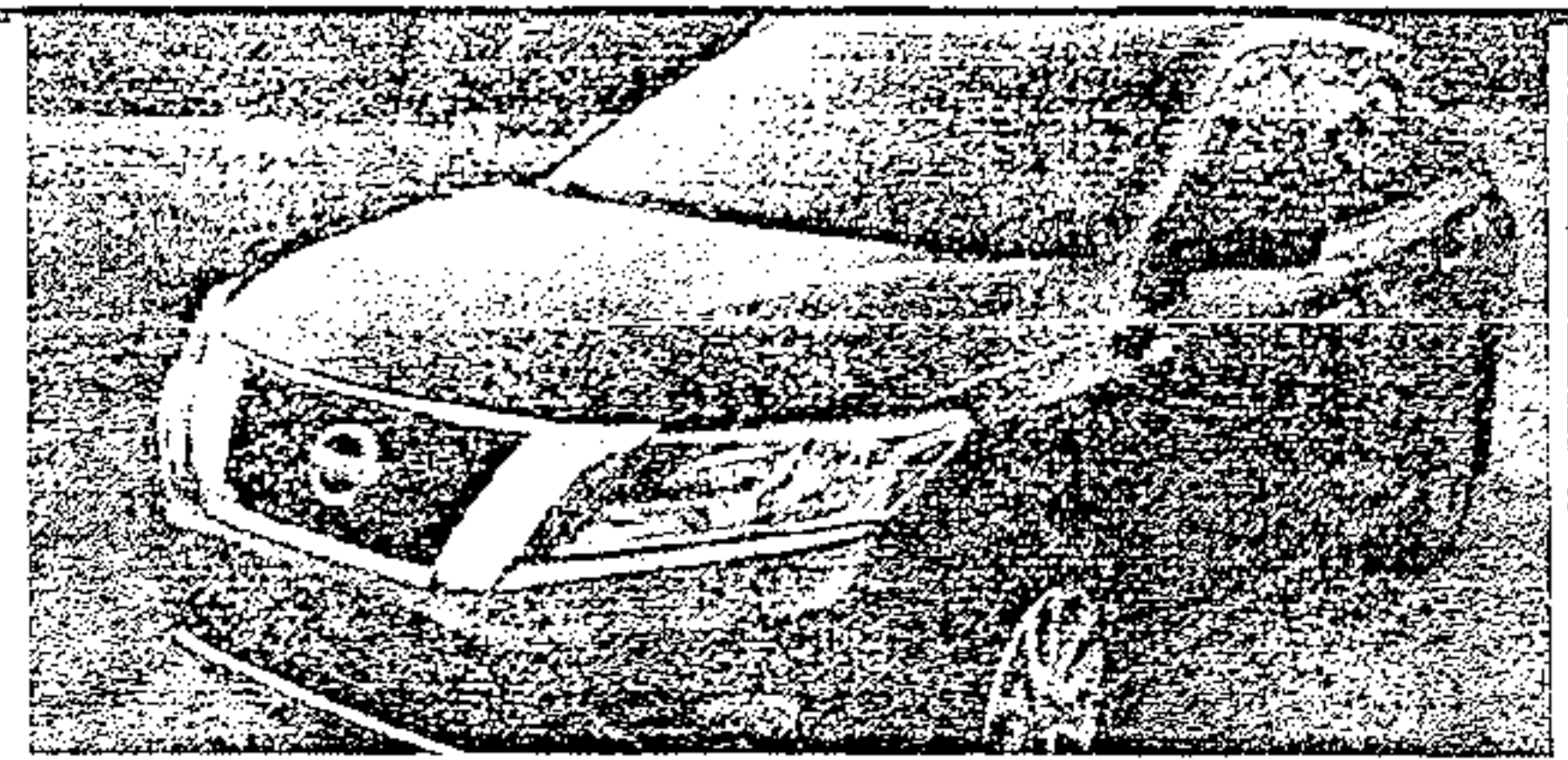
ual intercourse. Parris ask victim to send him a pic. Victim sent a pic of herself. After an investigation Tommy Parris was charged and placed under arrest.

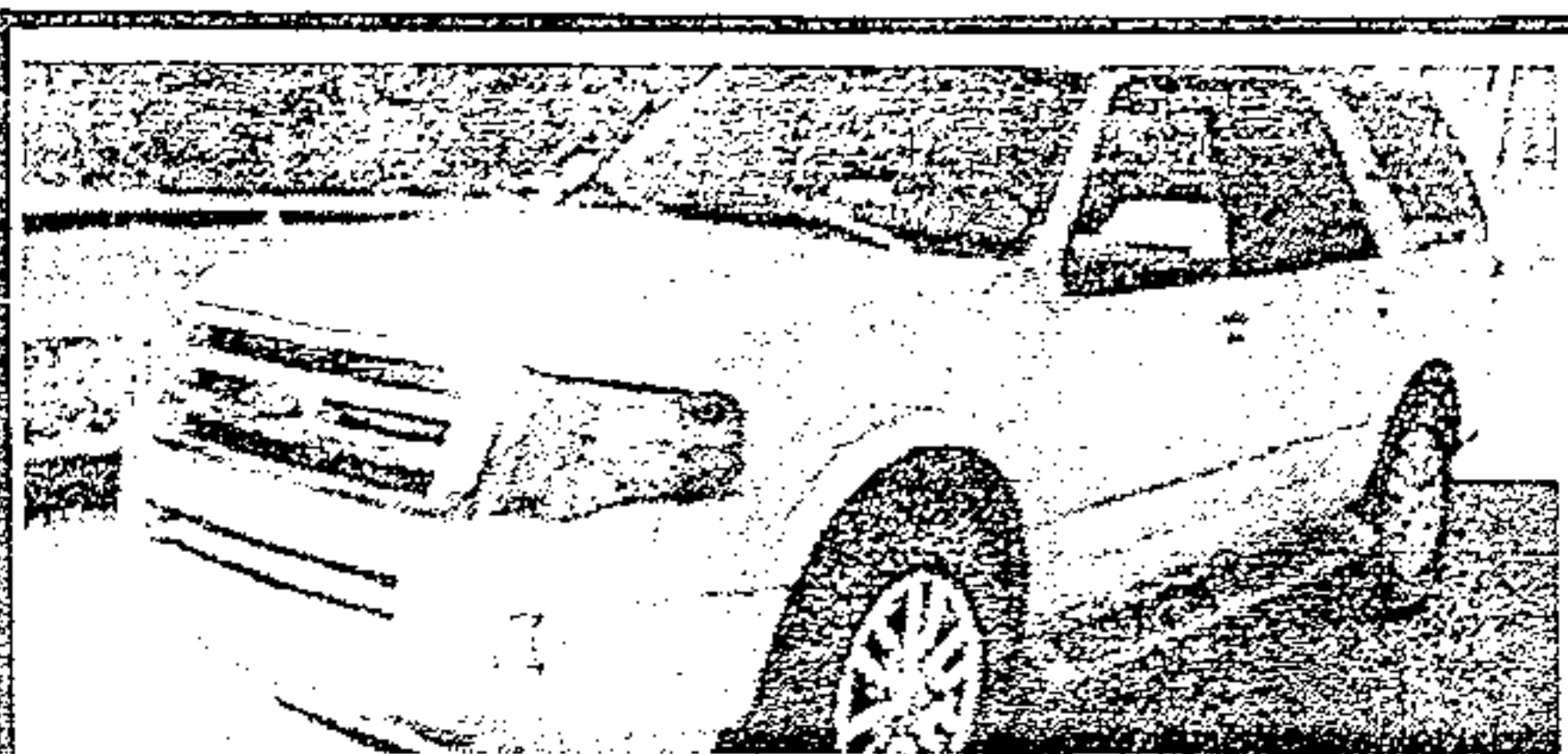

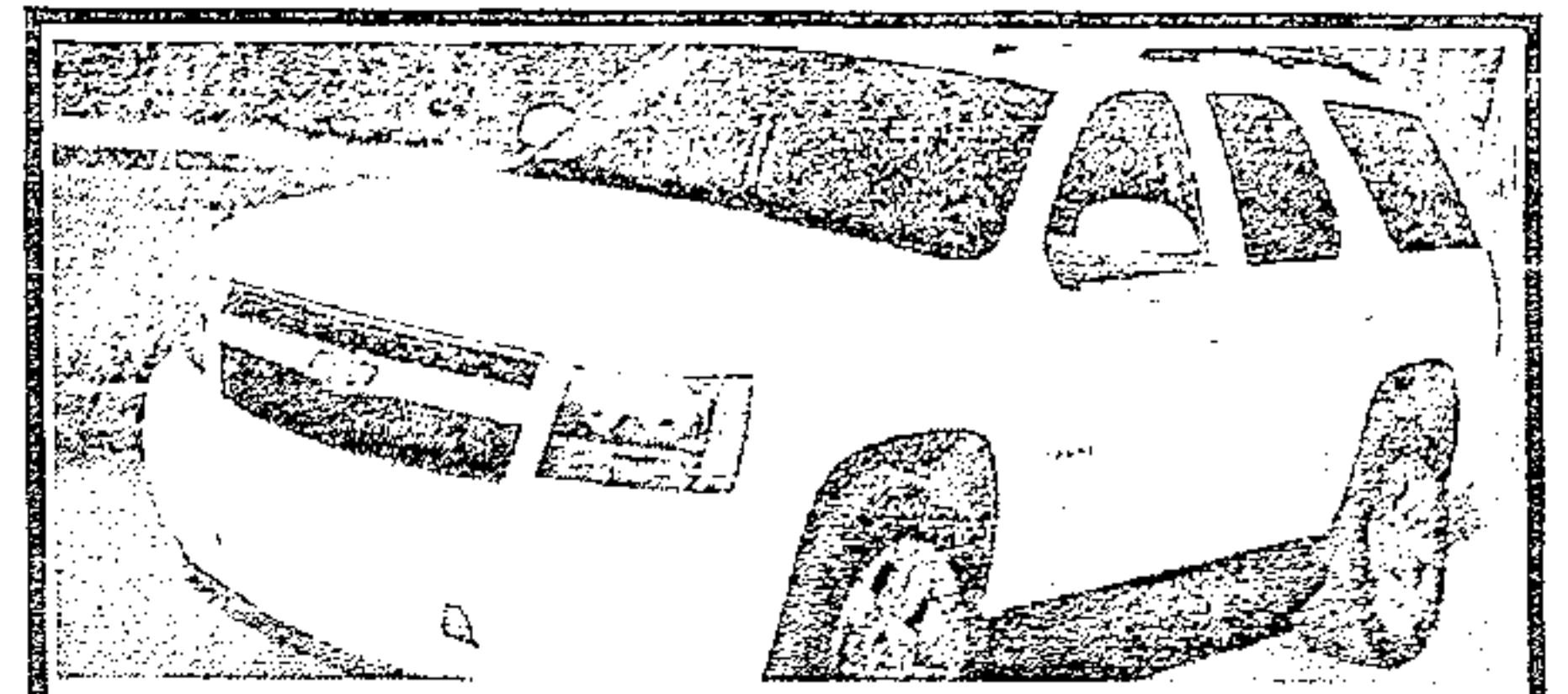

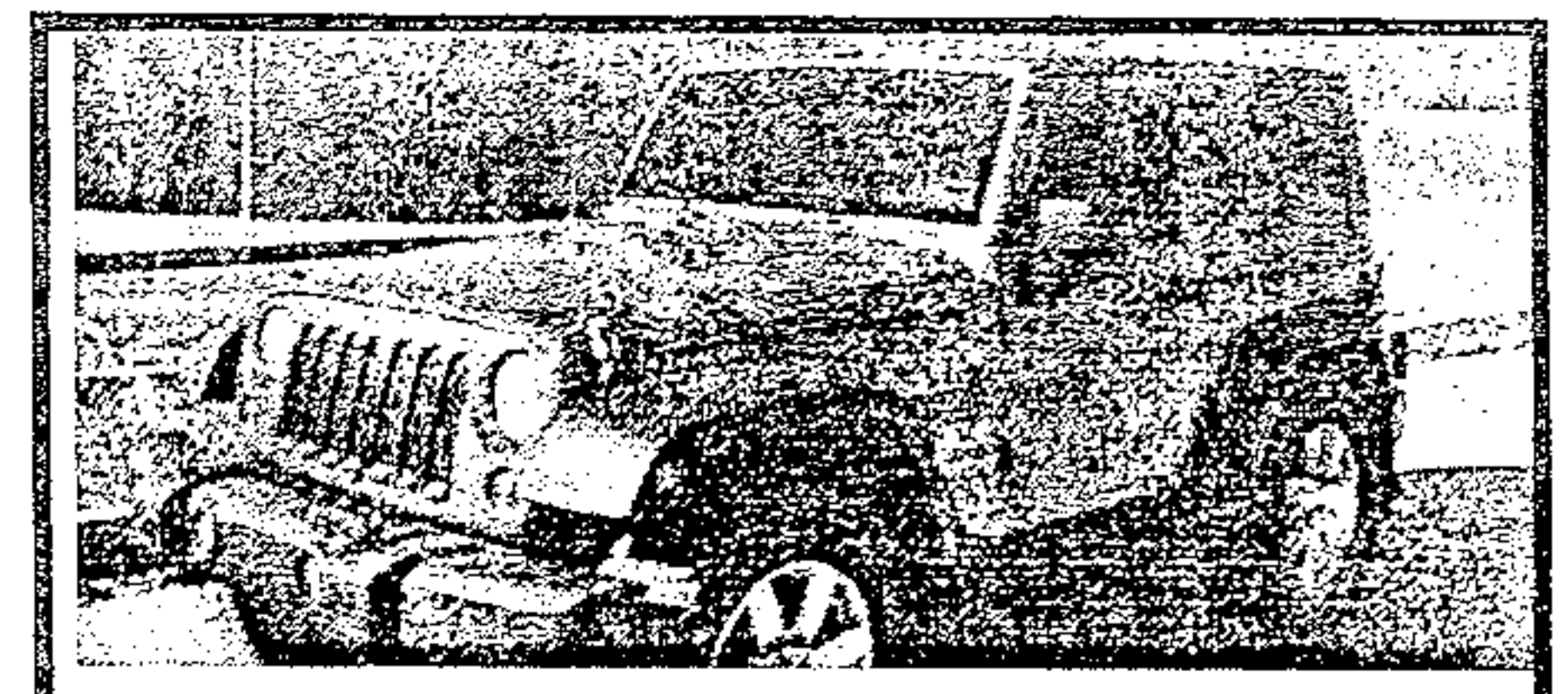

Theft

Jennifer Bell, 40, Railroad Street Livingston, was charged with Burglary. Officer received a call from Walmart that a female in an Envoy. The female fled from loss prevention personnel and drove away in a GMC Envoy. Officer observed this vehicle on

Hwy 321 near interstate 40 and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle identifying the driver as Jennifer Bell. Bell was identified as the female that fled from Walmart. Bell was mirandized by investigator Fritts LCPD, and Bell admitted to the theft at Walmart. Agent DeBoer spoke with Bell further about other

items in view in her vehicle to include numerous clothing items and a Sentry Safe. Bell admitted to Agent DeBoer that those items were stolen by her from Walmart in Rockwood. The Rockwood incident was also captured on video. Bell signed a trespass order in Putnam Co. banning her from all Walmart, and currently has a warrant out of Juliet, Tn. Bell was transported to Loudon County Jail.

Investigators determined that Maness used school district funds to improperly purchase technology equipment and then sold or personally used the equipment. These transactions resulted in a cash shortage of at least \$114,028.52.

Investigators found multiple improprieties relating to purchases made by Maness. For example, he purchased 267 Samsung solid state drives (SSDs) for \$79,015.43. He then sold 265 SSDs at discounted prices for personal gain. The other two SSDs were installed in a computer tower that he designed and fabricated for his personal gaming use.

The AHIDTA Executive Board provides executive leadership and direction on a multitude of issues pertaining to drug law enforcement throughout the Appalachia HIDTA area of responsibility which includes 90 designated counties in Kentucky, West Virginia, Tennessee and Virginia.

The High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) program is administered by the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). A component of the Executive Office of the President, ONDCP was created by the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988. ONDCP advises the President on drug-control issues, coordinates drug-control activities and related funding across the Federal government, and produces the annual National Drug Control Strategy, which outlines Administration efforts to reduce illicit drug use, manufacturing and trafficking, drug-related crime and violence, and

drug-related health consequences.

Appalachia HIDTA is an important component of the President's National Drug Control Strategy, which provides additional federal resources to help eliminate or reduce drug trafficking and its harmful consequences. Law enforcement organizations within HIDTA assess drug trafficking problems and design specific initiatives to reduce or eliminate the production, manufacture, transportation, distribution, and chronic use of illegal drugs, as well as money laundering.

Director Brown said "US Attorney Overbey is highly respected amongst his colleagues. Additionally, his demeanor, integrity, and collaborative aptitude are greatly revered within the board. His leadership and expertise will benefit the Appalachia HIDTA Executive Board."

US Attorney Overbey will join the HIDTA Executive Board Chairman, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation Director David Rausch, in leading a very prestigious group of law enforcement leaders from throughout Appalachia HIDTA's

school district funds that supported Maness' personal gaming. Additionally, school equipment was located and recovered from Maness' home. Much of the equipment purchased by Maness had no useful purpose for school district.

Michael Maness resigned his employment with the Crockett County School Department on May 21, 2018. He was indicted by the Crockett County Grand Jury on January 25, 2019 on one count of theft over \$60,000, and four counts of official misconduct.

"It's important that school officials across Tennessee provide adequate oversight for anyone entrusted with making purchases," said Comptroller Wilson. "Questions should always be raised about the need and legitimacy of purchases. Crockett County officials should also take steps to improve their inventory records and have someone independent of maintaining the inventory verify its accuracy."
