
never touched her with it. The victim stated the offender took her cell phone and keys and would not allow her to leave or call for help when she told the offender she was going to call 911. She stated the offender took \$100.00 out of her purse and gave her the phone and keys. She stated she met the offenders mother at the Kenjo

gas station in Lenoir City and she gave the victim \$100.00. Deputy did witness the victim to have visible injuries that included a knot on the top right of her head and a busted lip that was very swollen. The victim refused EMS multiple times but did state she was going to seek medical attention. The victim did give a written and body cam recorded statement of the events. All the above actions did occur in Loudon County TN.



FBI The opened 66 economic crime investigations related to elder fraud since ternet Crime Complaint Center (IC3),

web-based clearinghouse for complaints of suspected crimes facilitated by the Internet. Its data shows confidence fraud and romance scams aimed at the elderly accounted for more than \$184 million in losses over the past year.

Technical-support fraud schemes have cost victims over age 60 more than \$26 million since last March. The schemes




