"It's based

on years of archaeological science, concepts, and methods to recover not only the evidence and the remains, but also the information and the context of what is in those burials."

That means everything gets thoroughdocumented from the presence of shell casings or other artifacts, which may have evidentiary value, down to the color and texture of the underlying soil. "We have our narrative notes about what we did out there, and all of that works together to tell the story," Thew said. "And someday we need to tell the story to a jury."


For the class, one of the FBI Laboratory's most popular, students are separated into small groups led by Forensic An-

thropology Center instructors. Each group is escorted to a separate isolated area on the wooded grounds provided and probes to poke into the soil and feel anomalies or soft spots. When a potential burial site is discovered, students learn how to map it on a grid of twine and stakes and begin scraping away thin layers of dirt, which is sifted for clues. Students

take turns measuring, documenting, and sketching as the contours of a skeleton begin to emerge. In turns, the groups are also pulled aside for seminar-style includlessons, ing one that shows how heat and fire affect dental work and another on how maggots can unlock some of the mysteries of the recently deceased.




